Florida Head Coach **Billy Donovan** was named SEC Coach of the Year.

Team Highlights

- Florida finished the year with a 29-8 mark, making its 11th NCAA Tournament in 13 years while reaching the 20-win mark for the 13th consecutive year, the longest streak in the SEC and the fifth-longest streak in the nation
- The 2010-11 squad became the fifth team in school history to reach the 29-win plateau, reaching the NCAA Regional Final for the fifth time in program history
- UF reached the postseason for the 14th consecutive year (11 NCAA Tournaments and three NIT appearances in that time)
- Won its third outright Southeastern Conference Championship (1989, 2007) in school history. It was just the fifth overall SEC title in the 92-year history of the program, with four of the five coming in the Billy Donovan era
- Ranked fourth all-time in school history in fewest turnovers committed per game (12.21)
- After winning at Vanderbilt on March 5th, Billy Donovan owned a .710 winning percentage, the second-best mark all-time through 500 games at an SEC school
- Florida's .750 winning percentage away from home was third-best in the nation.
- The Gators collected eight true road wins for the first time since 1993-94
- Florida went 9-3 (.750) in games decided by six points or less
- The Gators were the only team all season to have a player foul out, while finishing second in the country in fewest fouls committed

Individual Highlights

Chandler Parsons

- Became the first Gator in the 79-year history of the SEC to be named SEC Player of the Year
- Led the team in rebounding (7.8 rpg) and assists (136)
- Finished the 2010-11 season as the only Division 1 college basketball player with more than 1,400 career points, 800 rebounds, 300 assists and 125 steals
- Named First-Team All-SEC by the AP and Coaches
- Named to the All-SEC Tournament team
- The sixth player under Billy Donovan to register 500 career field goals
- Led UF in rebounding in a team-high 19 games and recorded 10 double-digit rebound games, both twice as many as the next-closest teammate
- Notched a team-best eight double-doubles, twice as many as the next-closest teammate
- Led the team with 33.9 minutes per game
- Pulled down a career-high 15 rebounds vs. Arkansas on January 22nd
- Dished out a career-best 10 assists vs. UC Santa Barbara in the first round of the 2011 NCAA Tournament



Senior forward **Chandler Parsons** became the first Gator ever to be named SEC Player of the Year.

Erving Walker

- Named Second-Team All-SEC by the AP and Coaches for the second consecutive season after leading the team with 14.6 points per game and 41 steals
- 19-for-41 (.463) from three-point reach in postseason play (SEC and NCAA Tournament)
- Led UF in scoring in 15 games, assists in 17 games and charges drawn in game games
- Shot 80 percent from the free-throw line in the final three minutes of the game (48-60)
- Finished the season with most consecutive games played (105), most consecutive starts (44), most consecutive games with a point (92) and most consecutive games with a steal (three)



Erving Walker earned Second Team All-SEC honors for the second-straight season after leading the team in scoring at 14.6 PPG.

Kenny Boynton

- Named Second-Team All-SEC by league coaches after being named SEC All-Freshman in 2009-10
- Averaged 14.2 points, 1.5 rebounds and 2.6 assists per game
- Shot 26-of-30 (.867) from the charity stripe during the postseason (SEC and NCAA Tournament)
- Finished the season scoring in double-figures in 16 consecutive games
- Named to the SEC All-Tournament squad after averaging 18.7 ppg, 3.7 apg and 1.7 rpg during the tournament

Alex Tyus

- Averaged 9.1 points and 6.2 rebounds per game
- Became the 11th player since 2000 to register at least 19 points and 17 rebounds in an NCAA Tournament game (BYU on March 24)
- Averaged a school-record 11.0 rebounds per game during the NCAA Tournament
- Became the fifth player under Billy Donovan to record 500 made field goals

Vernon Macklin

- Averaged 11.6 points and 5.4 rebounds
- Scored a career-high 25 points against Butler in the NCAA Regional Final
- Notched a career-best 11 rebounds vs. FAU
