Exhibition Game 1: Florida 114, Premier Players 79 November 6, 2003 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Florida opened its 2003-04 season with an impressive 114-79 exhibition win over Premier Players Thursday night at the Stephen C O'Connell Center.

Seven different Gators tallied a double-figure scoring effort, with 12 of the 13 who played getting on the scoreboard. Senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** (Orlando, Fla.) led all scorers with 18 points in addition to snaring eight rebounds in 22 minutes of action.

Tashia Morehead (Panama City Pa.) had an impressive debut wearing the Orange and Blue, netting 17 points in 20 minutes. **Tamia Williams** (West Palm Beach, Fla.) added 14 points with four assists, while **Tishona Gregory** (Romulus, Mich.) netted 12 points with five assists. Also reaching double figures was **Sarah Lowe** (Wynnewood, Pa.), **Brittany Davis** (Gainesville, Fla.) and **Dalila Eshe** (Tallahassee, Fla.), scoring 11, 10 and 10, respectively. Eshe added a game-high 12 rebounds to her stat line, while Davis collected eight boards with four assists.

Alicia Abernathy and Rita Adams each scored 15 in the loss for the Premier Players (2-3), who were playing their fifth game in as many days.

A furious pace marked the first half as the Gators raced to 48-43 halftime lead.

"We were pushing the ball up the floor to get easy buckets," Lowe said. "We have been working on that in practice and it showed tonight."

The rapid pace continued in the second half as Florida extended its 48-43 halftime lead to 81-61 at the 10-minute mark. Freshman **Kim Dye** (Fayetteville, Tenn.) added five second-half points in her first appearance as a Gator, showing UF's depth off the bench.

"When we went to our bench we didn't lose anything," Florida Head Coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "We were able to keep the momentum going. We never lost a step with any substitutions that were made. We have a lot of different weapons this year."

Florida concluded its exhibition season Tuesday night with a convincing 74-55 victory over Zala Volan, a traveling team from Hungary sponsored by Team Concept Basketball.

The Gators were led by senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** (Orlando), who poured in 13 points while pulling down six rebounds in just 16 minutes of action. **Tashia Morehead** (Panama City) also scored 13 while ripping down four boards and dishing out six assists.

"Tashia has really been gelling with the team in practice," Florida Head Coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "Her great work ethic is starting to show. You saw that out there tonight."

Thirteen was a lucky number on this night for Florida as **Bernice Mosby** (Brooksville) added her name to Florida players in double figures with 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting.

The Gators opened the game with a 7-0 run, dumping the ball into Hayden who scored the first five Florida points in the paint. A stifling Florida defense held Zala Volan scoreless for nearly seven minutes until a lay-up on a loose ball finally found the bottom of the net at 13:02.

The two teams exchanged buckets for the next five minutes until Florida exploded for a 9-0 run that would break the game open. The 26-13 lead was quickly quelled by Zala Nolan, which ignited for a 8-0 run near the end of the half.

Just as it appeared that Zala Nolan would go into halftime with only a five-point deficit, sophomore **Sarah Lowe** (Wynnewood, Pa.) nailed a three-pointer from the corner at the buzzer to give the Gators a 29-21 halftime lead.

The second half started much like the first with Florida racing out to an 8-0 run to start the half and extend its lead to 16. Zala Volan would never be close again. Florida spent most of the second half enjoying a 22-4 run.

The scoring spree was highlighted by five straight points from freshman **Kim Dye** (Fayetteville, Tenn.) and some nice passing by Gator forwards **Brittany Davis** (Gainesville) and **Dalila Eshe** (Tallahassee) that found cutting guards on their way to the basket.

Game 1: Florida 66, Boston 56 • BU Invite-1st Round Nov. 22, 2003 • Boston, MA • Case Gymnasium

Vanessa Hayden scored 15 points and grabbed 10 rebounds to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 66-56 victory over Boston University in the first round of the BU Invitational.

The Gators struggled shooting from the field, but their defensive effort was stellar in the win, which was UF's 10th consecutive season-opening victory. The Gators shot just 34.7 percent (25-72) from the floor, but held the Terriers to a 32.0 percent (16-50) effort and forced 26 BU turnovers. The Gators also won the rebounding battle 53-36, including grabbing 21 on the offensive end.

UF's **Bernice Mosby** came off the bench to score 14 points with a game-high 12 rebounds, while **Danielle Santos** led the defensive charge while contributing 13 points, six rebounds and three steals.

Becky Bonner, sister of former UF men's hoops standout Matt Bonner, led all scorers with 20 points in her BU debut. Katie Terhune added 10 points in the loss for the Terriers.

Hayden's double-double, which was the 34th of her career, was even more impressive due to the fact that she played just 15 minutes because of foul trouble throughout the game. UF's 6-4 center also tallied one block shot, which was the 251st of her career and moved her into a tie for fifth place all-time in Southeastern Conference history.

BU's Bonner scored all 11 points during the Terrier's 11-6 run to open the second half and give the host school a 32-31 lead. But that advantage was short lived, as Danielle Santos quickly responded with a 3-pointer from the right side. That bucket sparked a 16-0 run for the Gators that lasted seven minutes, with UF beginning to distance itself, 47-32. During the game-breaking spree, four different Gators scored, including seven points by newcomer **Tashia Morehead**.

Bonner ended the Terrier drought by hitting two consecutive baskets for BU, but Santos and Hayden answered to quell a chance of Terrier run.

The Gators were plagued by foul trouble in the first half, causing a multitude of combinations on the floor. UF's top two scorers from last season - Hayden and Mosby - each picked up their second foul in the first eight minutes of the game, with Hayden going to bench after less than four minutes into the contest.

BU capitalized from the free throw line, scoring five straight from the stripe to take a 19-17 lead with just under five minutes remaining in the half. But the Gators went on a 8-0 run to retake the lead before BU hit the final bucket of the half as UF took a 25-21 advantage into the locker room.

Game 2: Florida 90, LaSalle 65 • BU Invite-Championship Nov. 23, 2003 • Boston, MA • Case Gymnasium

Vanessa Hayden scored 29 points with 14 rebounds leading Florida (2-0) to a hard-fought 90-65 victory over LaSalle (1-1) in the championship game of the BU Invitational. Hayden, who was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament, was virtually unstoppable when she touched the ball, hitting 14-of-21 from the field, scoring with her right and left hands and displaying a variety of shots in the paint.

Bernice Mosby also represented UF the All-Tournament team, scoring 13 points with nine rebounds versus LaSalle, while junior **Tashia Morehead** recorded 15 points for the Gators.

UF used a much better shooting effort from the floor, connecting on 48.7 percent (37-76) of their shots. The Gators held a 39-34 advantage on the boards and forced 22 turnovers while committing just 11 and collecting 20 assists.

LaSalle ripped out of the halftime lockerroom scoring the first seven points to shrink UF's nine-point lead to two, 43-41. The teams continued to trade baskets over the next eight minutes, with neither able to stage a run. After Hayden hit a tough basket, she was whistled for a technical foul and Jill Marano, who led the country in free throw percentage last year, converted both attempts from the free throw line to bring the Explorers within one, 53-52, with 13:32 remaining.

UF seemed to increase its intensity from that moment, exploding on a game-breaking 16-3 run to take a 69-55 lead with 7:32 left in the game. LU then hit a 3-pointer, but **Tamia Williams** answered with one for the Gators, who then used a 8-0 run to further themselves even more with a 80-60 advantage and never looked back en route to the victory.

Hayden scored eight of UF's first 10 points to open the game, but LaSalle answered every Gator bucket with a shot of its own to keep the game close early. Morehead nailed a 3-pointer and Mosby followed with another after an Explorer field goal to stretch UF's lead to eight points, 18-10, with 14:02 remaining in the half. The teams continued to trade baskets, until **Tishona Gregory** and **Dalila Eshe** converted on back-to-back trips to give the Gators a 26-16 lead. LU closed the gap to six points, but UF responded with scores from Morehead, **Brittany Davis** and Mosby to take a 38-26 lead with 3:20 to go.

But that's when the Gators went cold from the floor and LaSalle took advantage, using a 8-0 run over the next two-plus minutes to get within four, 38-34, with 1:38 left in the period. Williams ended UF's scoring drought with a 6-footer off an inbound play and then nailed a 3-pointer as the halftime horn sounded to propel the Gator's lead back to nine points, 43-34, entering the lockerroom.

Game 3: Richmond 98, Florida 88

Nov. 25, 2003 • Richmond, Va. • Robins Center

Despite 23 points from senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** and 21 points from sophomore **Bernice Mosby**, the University of Florida women's basketball team couldn't overcome a hot-shooting Richmond squad, as the Gators lost 98-88 at the Robins Center.

UF nearly overcame a 14-point deficit, but couldn't fend off the sizzling Spider shooting. Both teams made 36 field goals during the game, with UF (2-1) tying a school-record with 11 from the 3-point line compared to five from Spiders (2-0), who also converted 21-of-28 from the free throw line versus the 5-of-9 effort by the Gators. However the primary difference came with the shooting accuracy, as Richmond shot 64.3 percent (36-56), including a 71 percent effort during the first half. UF actually attempted 26 more shots, but only connected on 43.9 percent (36-82). UF's field goal percentage, which set a Spider all-time record, was the second-highest ever recorded by a UF opponent.

Mosby also collected a team-high 10 rebounds to post her second double-double of the season. **Danielle Santos** netted 14 points in the loss, while **Tishona Gregory** tallied 10 points. **Sarah Lowe** dished eight of UF's 27 assists, while committing just two of the Gator's eight turnovers.

Hayden, who played just 10 minutes in the first half because of foul trouble, stormed out the lockerroom scoring the first five points of the second half trying to help the Gators recover from a 53-39 halftime deficit. In fact the entire UF squad played with renewed vigor and contributed toward a 25-8 run that had the Gators sporting a 64-61 lead, their largest since beginning the game with a 3-pointer.

UF missed chances on their next two possessions to extend their lead, unable to converted fast break layups. At the point, the Spiders regrouped and posted a quick 8-0 run to take a 69-64 lead with 9:23 left in the game. But **Tishona Gregory** and **Sarah Lowe** hit back-to-back 3-pointers as UF regained the lead, 70-69, with 8:29 remaining. However, Richmond produced a devastating 18-4 run to take an 87-74 lead with 2:37 lead in the contest. UF chipped away at the lead and brought it to six points, 92-86 with 45 seconds on the clock, but couldn't rally for the second time in the game as Richmond scored its final nine points from the free throw line to secure the win.

Game 4: Florida 70, South Florida 55

Dec. 2, 2003 • Tampa, FL • Sun Dome

The University of Florida women's basketball team won its 44th consecutive game against instate rivals, but the victory was anything but easy. The Gators needed a huge second half from senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** to emerge with a hard-fought 70-55 win versus South Florida in front of 1,205 at the Sun Dome.

Hayden scored 16 of her game-high 25 points in the second half, while grabbing 15 rebounds with five blocks carrying the Gators (3-1) to their 13th consecutive victory over USF (3-3).

With the Gators leading 53-50 and 7:15 remaining, UF closed the game on a 17-5 run to secure the victory. The Gators shot 57.1 percent (28-49) from the floor, including 68 percent (17-25) in the second half to offset 25 turnovers. USF managed to hit only 24.2 percent (16-66) during the game, including a woeful 19.4 percent (6-31) in the second half.

While UF won the rebounding battle with a 46-44 edge, the Bulls snared 24 on the offensive end which translated into 17 more shot attempts than the Gators.

Tashia Morehead was the only other Gator who scored in double-figures, as she netted 15 points, but UF received vital contributions from several other players. **Sarah Lowe** came off the bench and scored all of her eight points late in the second half, while **Danielle Santos** tallied all of her seven points during the final frame, as well.

With USF holding a 36-35 advantage with 15:40 remaining in the game, the Gators exploded on a 14-2 run to take a 49-38 lead with 10:58 left on the clock with scoring from Hayden, **Sarah Lowe** and **Danielle Santos**. But the Bulls stormed back as UF got sloppy with the ball, ripping off a 8-0 spree of their own to close within three, 49-46. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes until the Gators held the 53-50 advantage before staging their game-deciding run.

It was a sluggish first half by both teams, as UF committed 12 turnovers and allowed 12 offensive rebounds, which USF turned into 11 more field goal attempts than the Gators. Fortunately for UF, the Bulls couldn't convert those additional shots, hitting just 28.6 percent (10-35) from the floor, while the Gators knocked down 45.8 percent (11-24).

Game 5: Florida 74, Florida State 60 Dec. 6, 2003 • Tallahassee, FL • Leon County Civic Center

Vanessa Hayden scored 18 points with 12 rebounds and seven blocks leading the Gators to a 74-60 victory over Florida State.

Hayden was one of four Gators (4-1) scoring in double-figures, with **Bernice Mosby** recording 14, **Tashia Morehead** adding 13 and **Sarah Lowe** netting 10 points with eight rebounds in the win, which was UF's 45th consecutive victory against instate teams and 16th straight over the Seminoles (4-2).

Tasheika Allen, FSU's leading scorer, recorded 18 points in the first half, but managed just two in the second half when the Gators put the game away. She was the lone Seminole scoring in double-figures.

FSU entered the game shooting 51.0 percent from the floor, but the Gators held them to 36.1 percent (26-72) on Saturday. While the Seminoles outrebounded UF 52-49, the Gators held a 26-12 advantage in the decisive second half.

With UF leading 35-34 with just over 18 minutes remaining in the game, the Gators ripped off a devastating 23-6 run over the next seven-plus minutes to take a commanding 60-40 lead with 10:27 left. Six different Gators scored during the spree, as UF used a balanced offensive attack to pull away.

The Seminoles scored the first points of the second half to cut UF's 35-32 halftime lead to one point, but the Gators finally found a spark and recorded a quick 9-0 run with scoring from five different players to take a 44-34 advantage with just under 16 minutes remaining. The teams traded baskets before **Tishona Gregory** nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key and **Danielle Santos** followed with a pair of free throws to launch a 14-2 run, as the Gators took a 60-40 lead with 10:32 remaining and began to pull away. The teams essentially traded baskets the rest of the game with FSU using a couple mini-runs late to close the final deficit.

Allen hit a 3-pointer to give the Seminoles an 8-5 lead, but Bernice Mosby responded for the Gators with a five-point spree of her own that sparked a 10-0 run to give UF a 15-8 lead. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes until Gregory hit an outside jumper and Lowe converted a three-point play to extend the Gator lead to 10 points. After Allen hit a bucket, Hayden and **Tara Taylor** answered to give UF a 26-14 advantage. Again the teams exchanged field goals and the Gators held a 32-18 lead after Morehead canned a deep jumper with 5:09 remaining the period. But that was UF's final field goal of the half, as the Gators began to play sloppy, turning the ball over and allowing several offensive rebounds which the Seminoles used to fuel a 18-2 run to cut the deficit to 34-32.

Game 6: Florida 76, Oakland 72 Dec. 9, 2003 • Rochester, MI • Athletics Center 'O'rena

University of Florida sophomores **Bernice Mosby**, **Sarah Lowe** and **Danielle Santos** carried the Gators down the stretch in a hard-fought 76-72 victory over Oakland at the Athletics Center 'O'rena.

Mosby scored a game-high 21 points with nine rebounds in the victory, but her two free throws with 33.3 seconds gave UF (5-1) a 72-69 lead. Lowe recorded six of her eight points in the final 59 seconds of the game, including a 4-for-4 effort from the free throw line that sealed the win. Santos added seven of her 17 points in the final four minutes, hitting a multitude of outside jumpers during the stretch.

The Golden Grizzlies (3-3) held a 59-56 lead with 6:40 remaining after a 9-0 run that erased a UF's 15-point first half lead. **Tashia Morehead**, who finished with 10 points, ended the Gator drought and tied the score with a 3-pointer from the left side, but Anne Hafeli retaliated with back-to-back 3-pointers that gave the Grizzlies a 65-59 lead with 3:37 remaining.

Santos hit a trey and followed that with 15-footer to bring the Gators within one, 65-64, but Petra Manakova answered with a short jumper to end the run. However, Morehead snatched a one-handed offensive rebound and put it back up and Santos followed with another jumper as the Gators retook the lead, 68-67. Jayme Wilson added two free throws for OU, before Lowe hit her first field goal of the game to give UF a 70-69 lead with 59 seconds remaining. The Grizzlies had a chance to take the lead on their next possession, but missed, however they did grab the offensive rebound. While setting up for their next shot, the Gators came up with a steal. OU fouled Mosby on an in-bounds play and she made both ends of a 1-and-1 with 33.3 seconds to give UF a 72-69 lead. Manakova answered for OU, but Lowe nailed a pair of free throws with 16 seconds left to keep the difference at three points, 74-71. However, OU wasn't ready to concede the game, as Nicole Piggott hit one free throw with six seconds remaining. She purposely missed the second and the Grizzlies actually grabbed the miss, but the Grizzlies called a timeout they didn't have sending Lowe back to the free throw line, where she converted both technical free throws to end the game's scoring.

Florida's leading scorer and rebounder, **Vanessa Hayden**, was limited to eight points and 11 rebounds in just 21 minutes due to foul trouble, while Morehead also played just 25 minutes because of fouls. Hayden left the game with an ankle injury with 17 seconds remaining.

Game 7: Miami 80, Florida 75

Dec. 12, 2003 • Coral Gables, FL • The Convocation Center

Despite a game-high 23 points by All-American Vanessa Hayden, the University of Florida women's basketball team lost 80-75 to Miami Friday evening at The Convocation Center. The loss snapped UF's 45-game win streak versus instate opponents. Prior to Friday's setback, the Gators had not lost to an instate opponent since February 16, 1993, when FAU defeated UF 84-63.

The Gators (5-2) had their chances late, but missed three shots all under the basket with less than 15 seconds remaining and Miami (7-0) went 4-for-4 from the free throw line in the closing seconds to seal the victory.

Gators joining Hayden in scoring double-figures included Bernice Mosby, who recorded 18, and Tashia Morehead, who scored 17. Chanivia Broussard led Miami with 22 points, while Tamara James added 19 and Yalonda McCormick tallied 17.

The game concluded UF's season-opening seven-game road trip. Danielle Santos made one of two free throws with 2:38 left in the game to give UF a 70-68 lead, but Miami hit a pair from the charity strip to tie the game before Tamara James nailed a 3-pointer from the right side with 1:05 remaining to give the Hurricanes a 73-70 advantage. Bernice Mosby hit a jumper from just inside the arc, but Yolanda McCormick nailed a trey from the top of the key, giving UM a 76-72 lead with 30 seconds remaining. Mosby again answered for UF, canning a 3-pointer with 23.4 seconds left, drawing the Gators within one.

Sarah Lowe stole the ball off the in-bounds pass and immediately called a timeout. The Gators had three shots all under the baskets but missed all of them and was forced to foul McCormick who eventually came up with the offensive rebound. She made both ends of a 1-and-1 with 8.7 seconds remaining to give UM a 78-75 lead. But UF turned the ball over bringing it up the floor and was forced to foul Tamara James immediately, who made both free throws to give UM an insurmountable five-point lead, 80-75, with five seconds remaining.

Tashia Morehead's three-pointer just 10 seconds into the second half brought the Gators within one, 38-37, but Miami came back with a 6-2 run and held a 44-38 lead. That's when the Gators stormed back with a 8-0 run to take a 46-44 lead, their first since the 17:19 mark of the first half. During the run Vanessa Hayden powered in a jumper, Morehead put back her own miss, Sarah Lowe streaked down the lane for a driving layup and Danielle Santos added another driving lay-in. The Gators also forced a shot-clock violation during the run, as they turned up their defensive intensity. The Hurricanes then answered with a 5-0 run to re-take the lead, 49-46, with 14:14 remaining in the game. Over then next three minutes, there were four lead changes and two tied scores as the teams traded offensive buckets and defensive stops.

With UF leading 54-52 with 12:46 remaining, Miami used an 11-2 run over the next two-plus minutes to take a 63-56 advantage. Tashia Morehead scored the next five points of the game with a pair of long jumpers and after Tamara James added bucket for UM, Vanessa Hayden and Bernice Mosby followed with short field goals to tied the game at 65-all with 5:44 remaining.

Game 8: Florida 75, No. 15/17 UC Santa Barbara 49

Dec. 14, 2003 • Gainesville, FL • O'Connell Center

Vanessa Hayden lit up the scoreboard with 31 points leading the Gators to a 75-49 victory over No. 15-ranked UC Santa Barbara Sunday afternoon at the O'Connell Center. Hayden dominated the game on both ends of the floor, pulling down a season-high 17 rebounds with seven blocks to guide the Gators (6-2) to their first win versus a nationally ranked opponent January 27, 2002, snapping a streak of 13 losses.

Hayden's 31 points and 17 rebounds were both season highs, as she posted her 38th career double-double and her fifth this season. Her scoring outburst marked the 25th time in program history a Gator scored 30-plus points in a game, which also was Hayden's third career 30-point performance.

Tashia Morehead also scored in double digits for UF, netting 14 points with five rebounds. Bernice Mosby and Danielle Santos rounded out the Gator rebounding effort with 10 and eight rebounds, respectively, helping the UF win the battle of the boards 52-27. Florida's 52 total team rebounds was the second highest total this season.

Kristen Mann, UCSB's leading rebounder, was held to only two rebounds and four points in the first half alone. However, Mann ended the game leading the Gauchos (4-2) in points with 15 with just two rebounds. April McDivitt rounded out the double-digit scoring with 10, while pulling down four rebounds. The Gators defense put in a tremendous performance holding UCSB's leading scorer Lindsey Taylor to only five points in the first half, and only one free-throw point in the second half.

The game marked the latest home opener for UF, which began the 2003-04 season playing seven straight road contests.

UF ended the first half on a 15-7 run and headed into the locker room leading 33-23. The Gators started the game in a point-for-point battle with the Gauchos, until the Gators pulled away on a 9-0 run, with 7:33 remaining. The run was sparked by a jumper from Hayden and included the first three-pointer of the game for the Gators by Morehead.

In the second half, UF pulled farther away from UCSB on a 19-12 run, of which, Hayden scored 14 points. The Gators continued their defensive attack, forcing nine UCSB turnovers in the second half, alone. The Gators put the icing on the cake, finishing the game with a 20-3 run, which featured scoring by five different Gators.

Game 9: Florida 86, Bethune-Cookman 50 Dec. 19, 2003 • Orlando, FL • UCF Arena

Florida played a balanced game en route to a dominating 86-50 victory over Bethune-Cookman (1-5) Friday afternoon at UCF Arena. All 14 Gators played and saw significant minutes, with 13 contributing on the scoreboard in the game, which began UF's first of three contests over a four-day span.

Sophomore **Tishona Gregory** scored a game-high 14 points and dished a career-high nine assists with just two turnovers for Florida, which improved to 7-2. All-American **Vanessa Hayden** was the only other player for either team scoring in double-figures, as she recorded 12 points with nine rebounds in 20 minutes of action.

"We entered this game with the understanding that we were going to play a lot of people because of our current stretch of playing three games in four days, so it was important for us to establish a tone and that every player off the bench maintain that tone," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "We were able to do that. We didn't want anyone to play more than 20 minutes, and with the exception of Tishona playing 21, we were able to do that, as well."

UF's shooting percentage of 57.1 tied a season-high mark, while its 36-point margin of victory was its best this year. The Gators, playing for the first time in five days, did look a bit rusty, committing 20 turnovers. However, UF dished 23 assists while forcing 20 turnovers and holding the Wildcats to 30.5 percent (18-59) shooting. The Gators also held a 44-25 rebounding advantage. BCC did not have a player score in double-figures.

Among the 13 Gators scoring were freshman **Kim Dye**, who recorded her first collegiate points, and **Kelly Stevenson**, who also tallied her points of the year. Rookie **Briana Phillips** netted a career-high nine points with four rebounds in 16 minutes of action.

Tashia Morehead scored seven points during UF's 11-4 run to begin the second half, helping the Gators extended their 20-point halftime lead to 57-30 en route to the convincing victory.

The Gators used a 23-7 run over a 10-minute span midway through the first half to take a commanding 31-13 lead en route to a 46-26 halftime advantage. Eleven different players scored during the opening period, with **Tishona Gregory** netting a team-high nine points with six assists in 12 minutes of action.

The rust from playing their first game in five days showed early on for the Gators, who missed five of their first six shots before settling down and exploding on the game-breaking run. UF committed 11 first-half turnovers, but overcame the miscues by shooting a commanding 68 percent (17-25) from the floor and outrebounding BCC 23-10. The Wildcats shot 29.4 percent (10-34) from the field while turning the ball over seven times.

Game 10: Florida 79, UCF 48 Dec. 20, 2003 • Orlando, FL • UCF Arena

Senior **Vanessa Hayden** put on a show in front of her hometown fans, scoring 20 points with 11 rebounds in just 19 minutes in a convincing 79-48 victory over UCF Saturday at the UCF Holiday Classic in Orlando. The double-double was Hayden's sixth of the season and the 39th of her career and has been instrumental in helping the Gators to a 8-2 record this season. Both teams were playing their second game in as many days, but the Gators benefited from rotating their entire bench into Friday's 86-50 blowout of Bethune-Cookman and didn't show any signs of fatigue. By building a significant early lead in Saturday's game, UF again was able to have multiple players see quality action and hopefully not drain the team in preparation for the Gator's next outing which tips-off in less than 48 hours.

UF's bench was assessed a technical foul as the teams headed into the locker room and UCF (2-6) capitalized by hitting two free throws to begin the second half. The Golden Knights then took possession and Takira Allen hit a jumper to cut the Gator lead that had reached 17 points with four seconds remaining in the first half, to 10 points, 38-28, with 19:31 remaining in the game.

But **Vanessa Hayden** scored UF's first basket of the second half and nine points during an ensuing game-breaking 19-0 run that lasted almost seven minutes, as the Gators upped their lead to 29 points, 57-28, with 13 minutes to go in the contest. UCF called a pair of timeouts during the spree and was out of timeouts with 14:07 remaining in the game.

Danielle Santos added 13 points with four assists and four steals, hitting 6-of-9 shots from the floor, while Tara Taylor posted a season-high 10 points on 4-of-7 shooting to complete the double-figure scoring Gators.

UF committed just 10 turnovers and forced 25, shooting 42.3 percent (33-78) during the game and holding UCF to just 34 percent shooting.

The Gators raced out to a quick 7-0 lead with scoring from **Vanessa Hayden**, **Brittany Davis** and **Danielle Santos**. But UCF hit the next four points and the team's continued to trade baskets for the next five-plus minutes. That's when UF went on a 9-0 spree capped by a three-point play from Hayden that gave the Gators a 19-7 lead with 9:32 left in the first half.

The Gators appeared to have the momentum until Celeste Hudson exploded for the first eight points during a 10-0 Golden Knight run the cut UF's deficit to two, 19-17, with 7:28 on the clock. **Bernice Mosby** finally ended the UCF run with an up-and-under two-footer. After Ali Roberts canned a jumper from the baseline with 6:55 remaining that kept UCF within two, Mosby answered with a jumper from the free throw line and ignited a 14-0 that extended the Gator lead to 35-19 with 1:06 left. Roberts ended the UCF drought with a short jumper, but Mosby followed with a three-pointer from the top of the key with four seconds left. However that wasn't the end of the first half scoring, as Lashaunda Slade canned a trey at the buzzer and the Gators headed into the locker room with a 38-24 lead.

Game 11: Florida 80, George Washington 63 Dec. 22, 2003 • Gainesville, FL • O'Connell Center

Sophomore **Bernice Mosby** scored a career-high of 31 points with 11 rebounds, leading Florida to an impressive 80-63 victory over George Washington Monday afternoon in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The win was the fourth consecutive for the Gators, who recorded their ninth victory this season matching their entire win total from last year.

Monday's game was the third win in four days for the Gators (9-2), who don't play again until hosting Baylor on December 30. Florida has won its last four games by an average of 28.5 points, which includes a 75-49 victory over then-No. 15 UC Santa Barbara. The win also extended UF's home court winning streak versus non-conference opponents to 15 games.

Mosby became the second Gator to score at least 30 points this season, as senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** most recently scored 31 points Dec. 14, 2003 versus then-No. 15 UCSB.

Florida (9-2) dominated the boards, outrebounding the Colonials 51-39. Mosby grabbed a game-high 11 rebounds to record her third double-double this season and her ninth of her career. **Tashia Morehead** recorded 15 points and five rebounds, while Hayden tallied 14 points with eight boards in 20 minutes of action. **Danielle Santos** continued her impressive play, contributing 12 points with five rebounds and five assists without a turnover in the win.

Cathy Joens scored 22 points, while Ugo Oha tallied 18 for the Colonials (5-3), who saw their five-game win streak snapped.

George Washington head coach Joe McKeown said he thought his team did a good job on guarding Hayden, but had trouble with Mosby.

The Gators perimeter game was sizzling, hitting 50 percent (8-of-16) from downtown, including a perfect 4-of-4 from Mosby. UF held GWU to just 16.7 percent (2-of-12) from beyond the arc.

George Washington scored the first four points of the second half to close the gap 35-33 before UF went on a mini 4-2 run to maintain and quell the Colonials early momentum. Mosby, Hayden and junior **Tashia Morehead** teamed up to put Florida on a 15-4 run, putting the Gators up by 12 (56-44) with less than 11 minutes remaining in the game. UF went on a 13-6 run to up the score 71-56 with under six minutes remaining. The Gators held the Colonials without a field goal for the final four minutes of the contest.

Florida went on a 7-2 run to take a 9-7 lead in the beginning of the first half. The Gators and the Colonials battled it out in the first half, which had 11 lead changes. **Bernice Mosby** lit up the scoreboard as she scored eight consecutive points to lift Florida over George Washington 35-29 heading into the locker room.

Game 12: Baylor 71, Florida 54 Dec. 30, 2003 • Gainesville, FL • O'Connell Center

Despite a game-high 26 points and 13 rebounds from senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden**, the Florida women's basketball team couldn't overcome a poor shooting night and lost to Baylor 71-54 in the O'Connell Center Tuesday evening. The loss snapped the Gator's four-game win streak and ended their non-conference home winning streak at 15 games.

Florida (9-3) shot a season-low 26.9 percent from the floor, hitting just 18-of-67, which included Hayden's 10-for-18 effort. The Gators managed just 25 percent (8-32) in the second half, when Baylor (11-1) outscored them 42-23. UF also committed 10 of its 17 turnovers in the final 20 minutes. The Lady Bears shot 41.5 percent (27-65) from the floor during the game and held a 47-45 rebounding edge, including grabbing eight more in the second half.

The Gators held a 40-37 lead with 14:38 remaining in the game when Baylor used an aggressive defense and a flustering 3-2 zone to ignite a 20-3 run highlighted by several steals and fast break opportunities. **Danielle Santos** finally halted the Lady Bear scoring spree with 7:32 on the clock, which cut the Baylor lead to 57-45. A late surge by the Gators, highlighted by a pair of three-pointers from **Tamia Williams**, would not be enough to overcome Baylor's devastating run.

Bernice Mosby was UF's only other double-figure scorer, recording 10 points for the Gators.

Steffanie Blackmon led the Lady Bears with 24 points and nine rebounds, while Jessica Stratton added 14 points and Sophia Young tallied 10 points with nine rebounds.

The game started slowly as the two teams recorded just three baskets in the first six and a half minutes of play. Hayden scored twice for the Gators while Blackmon posted the lone Baylor score. The two teams began to find their rhythm with about 13 minutes left in the half. Baylor took its first lead of the game when Sophia Young went coast to coast on a steal at the Gator foul line and made the score 15-14 in favor of the Bears with just over 10 minutes to go in the first half.

The two teams would go back and forth for much of the remainder of the period, with Hayden dominating down low scoring 17 in the half while pulling down seven rebounds. In one stretch UF's senior center scored six straight points for the Gators and made it nine of 11 points on an impressive dribble drive where she was fouled. The drive came after a **Tishona Gregory** three-pointer that put the Gators on top 21-20, a lead that they would not relinquish in the first half.

Blackmon led the way for Baylor in the first half scoring 10 points on 4-5 shooting but could only bring her team within two of the home standing Gators at 31-29 as the teams headed to the locker room entrenched in a defensive battle.

Game 13: Florida 62, Temple 49 January 2, 2004 • Philadelphia, PA • Liacouras Center

Vanessa Hayden led a balanced scoring attack and a stifling defense in the Gator's 62-49 victory over Temple at the Liacouras Center. Hayden scored 15 points with 17 rebounds and seven blocks, as UF improved to 10-3 overall, which surpassed the Gator's entire win total from last year.

Tashia Morehead posted her first career double-double, recording 14 points with 11 rebounds. Bernice Mosby added 13 points with five boards, while Tishona Gregory scored 12.

With her seventh block of the night, Hayden moved into third place all-time in Southeastern Conference history, passing Georgia's Katrina McClain who swatted 290 during her All-American career.

The Gator defense held Temple (4-6) to just two points in the final 13:05 of the first half, while ending the period with a 15-2 run and turning a 3-point deficit into a 25-13 halftime lead. The Owls shot only 21.4 percent from the field during those first 20 minutes and missed 14 straight field goal attempts during a 8:04 span.

The Gators committed a quick turnover to begin the second half and Temple scored the first bucket. But Tishona Gregory responded with a three-pointer that was followed by a trey from TU's Cynthia Jordan. However, the Gators ripped off a 9-2 run with five points from Vanessa Hayden that gave UF 37-20 lead and the Gators never looked back en route to the win.

UF also dominated the boards, outrebounding Temple 47-33. The Gators also held the Owls to just 33.9 percent shooting during the game.

Temple grabbed an early 11-8 lead behind some offensive putbacks, but once the Gators began to secure the boards they turned up their defensive intensity which translated on the offensive end of the floor. Tishona Gregory's crossover dribble from the top to the key allowed her to coast down the lane where she was fouled. Gregory made both free throws that ignited a 12-0 run lasting seven minutes, as UF took a 20-11 lead with 5:01 remaining in the first half. Candice Dupree finally ended the Owl scoring drought with a short jumper, but Tashia Morehead answered immediately for the Gators with a three-pointer from the left side to extend UF's lead to 10 points, 23-13, with 3:52 left on the clock. That was the last points either team would score until Danielle Santos blocked Toni Belafonte's 6-footer with less than five seconds remaining. Santos then grabbed the missed shot and heaved the ball down court to a streaking Gregory, who sank a layup at the buzzer to give UF a 25-13 halftime advantage.

Florida held Temple to a 21.4 percent shooting effort in the first half, as the Owls managed 6-of-28 from the floor. The Gators, who shot 36.7 percent, also held a distinct rebounding advantage, winning the battle of the boards 24-18. Morehead led UF with seven points with several of those coming off tough offensive rebound putbacks, while Hayden tallied four points with nine rebounds and four blocks.

Game 14: Ole Miss 79, Florida 72 January 8, 2004 • Oxford, MS • Tad Smith Coliseum

Florida shot the ball with better accuracy and outrebounded Ole Miss by 19, but couldn't overcome 24 turnovers in a 79-72 loss to the hosting Lady Rebels in the Southeastern Conference opener for both squads.

The game was the first time the Gators (10-4, 0-1 SEC) have taken the court against their former coach Carol Ross, who coached or recruited 11 of the 14 players on UF's current roster. Ole Miss (10-5), which committed just seven turnovers during the game, extended its win streak to five games.

UF shot 45.5 percent (30-66) from the floor and held a 54-35 rebounding edge in the game, but Ole Miss found its way to the free throw line 36 times compared to the seven trips by the Gators. The Lady Rebels shot 36.2 percent (25-69), hitting 9-of-18 from the three point line while canning 20-of-36 from the charity stripe.

Vanessa Hayden led UF with 22 points, 12 rebounds and six blocks, while Brittany Davis scored a career-high 16 points in the loss.

Geniece Terry scored a game-high 26 points for Ole Miss, hitting 5-of-11 from the 3-point line. Arminie Price also contributed 18 points, hitting 10-of-16 from the free throw line.

The Gators committed their 14th turnover to start the second half and Ole Miss made them pay as Geniece Terry canned a three-pointer to tied the game at 41-all. UF regrouped on its next two possessions and Brittany Davis scored the next two baskets, being the recipient of a Vanessa Hayden pass. Danielle Santos then followed with a pair of free throws to give the Gators a 47-41 lead with 17:21 remaining in the game. But the Rebels continued their sharp shooting from the outside, as Tywana Inmon nailed UM's seventh trey of the game and prevented UF from making a significant run.

The teams traded baskets, but the Gators couldn't stage a run because they continued committing unforced turnovers and giving the ball back to the Lady Rebels. With UF holding a 51-45 lead, Ole Miss used a 6-0 run to tie the game with 11:33 remaining. Dalila Eshe next converted a three-point play to give UF the lead again, but the Lady Rebels refused to go away and answered every point.

The Gators held a 60-57 lead after Eshe hit a short jumper, but UF scored the next five points, as Carletta Brown canned a three-pointer that gave the Lady Rebels a 62-60 lead with seven minutes remaining in the game. However, Tishona Gregory and Tashia Morehead answered with back-to-back three-pointers, as UF regained the lead, 66-62. But the Gators committed turnovers on their next five possessions and UF took advantage with an 11-0 run to build a 73-66 lead with 2:55 left.

Eshe finally ended the scoring drought with a long jumper, as UF got within five, 73-68, with 2:44 remaining. The teams continued to trade baskets, Ole Miss converted clutch shots and free throws and the Gators couldn't make up the deficit.

Vanessa Hayden racked up her 10th double-double of the year and 43rd of her career, leading the Gators to a huge 67-61 conference victory over 22nd ranked (ESPN/USA Today Poll) Vanderbilt in front of 3,303 fans, the ninth largest crowd in school history. Hayden had 22 points on 8-of-10 shooting, 11 rebounds and seven blocks to log her fifth consecutive double-double.

The Gators (11-4 overall, 1-1 Southeastern Conference) played relentless defense, forcing 24 Vanderbilt (13-2, 1-1) turnovers and holding the Commodores to their second-lowest point total of the season. **Tishona Gregory** led the defensive effort with a career-high seven steals. **Danielle Santos** also added three steals, while Hayden, **Tashia Morehead** and **Sarah Lowe** swiped two each to tally a total of 18.

"That's one of the things we worked on — having great defense," Florida head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "I could see it in their eyes when we were in the locker room before the game that they were ready to play great defense because their focus and concentration was there."

Morehead scored 17 points and **Bernice Mosby** had 11 for the Gators. **Abi Ramsey** led the Commodores with 20 points, going 6-of-10 from behind the arc. Leading scorer Jenni Benningfield played just six minutes in the game due to injury, while starting guard Dee Davis saw just one minute of court time for similar reasons.

Florida jumped out to an early 5-0 advantage and led 20-14 with 7:50 to play in the first half. Vanderbilt then went on a 12-2 run over the next three-and-a-half minutes, surging on top 26-22. Hayden snapped the Vanderbilt rally with a two-foot hook shot with 3:48 on the clock, beginning a 9-2 Gators run to close out the first half with a 31-28 lead.

The Gators opened the second half the same way they played throughout the first period, with great defense. They held Vanderbilt to just six points in the first seven-and-a-half minutes out of the locker room. Then Vanderbilt's offense heated up quickly, going on a 10-3 run over the next two minutes to take back the lead 44-41.

Florida answered Vanderbilt's run with a 10-0 run of its own, taking back the lead for good.

Vanessa Hayden clearly was the focus of the Gator's offense and LSU's defense, but UF's 6-foot-4 center couldn't carry the Gators to the upset, as the 14th-ranked Lady Tigers edged the visiting Gators 74-59.

Hayden ended the game with 14 points and 10 rebounds to post her fifth consecutive double-double and her 11th of the season. Hayden was triple-teamed throughout the game and her performance was just as, if not more, impressive than that of LSU's Seimone Augustus, who scored a career-high 28 points with 13 rebounds.

LSU (14-2, 2-0 SEC) used a 12-0 run over a three-plus minute span midway through the second half that turned a 35-33 Florida lead into a 45-35 Lady Tiger advantage, and the teams traded baskets for virtually every other minute of the game, as the Gators (11-5, 1-2 SEC) fell at the Maravich Assembly Center.

Seimone Augustus hit the first bucket of the second half to give LSU a 33-30 lead, but Tishona Gregory quickly answered for UF with a 3-pointer from the left side to tie the game. Vanessa Hayden then followed with an offensive put-back at the 17:41 mark that gave the Gators a 35-33 lead, their first of the game. But Hayden picked up her third foul with 17:26 left in the game and UF holding a 35-34 lead. Hayden went to the bench and the Gators committed a turnover on their next possession.

The teams traded turnovers before Augustus hit a 4-footer to give LSU a 36-35 lead. The Gators again turned the ball over two more times and missed on their next offensive series, as the Lady Tigers exploded on a 12-0 run that ballooned their lead to 45-35, with 13:40 remaining in the game. Hayden was forced to return to the floor and immediately scored for the Gators to stop the run, but she was whistled for her fourth foul on the next LSU series and had to return to the bench with 13:13 left in the contest.

The teams traded baskets before LSU continued its hot shooting and tallied two quick buckets to extend its lead to 51-39. But Tamia Williams nailed a 3-pointer to cut the deficit to single digits with just under 11 minutes remaining in the game. Augustus canned two free throws, before Williams hit another jumper from just inside the arc. However, Augustus nailed a deep 3-pointer from the left side to give the Lady Tigers a 56-44 advantage with 7:15 to go.

Both squad exchanged buckets over the next five-plus minutes and UF was unable to make up any ground on the deficit, as LSU continued to milk the clock and not attempt a shot until there were single digits on the shot clock.

Bernice Mosby was the only other Gator to log a double-figure scoring effort, contributing 11 points with 10 rebounds. For LSU, Doneeka Hodges added 15 points, while Scholanda Houston netted 10.

Game 17: Florida 83, No. 11/9 Georgia 73 January 18, 2004 • Athens, GA • Stegeman Coliseum

Florida proved it was more than simply a one-player team during its stunning 83-73 victory over No. 11/9 (AP/ESPN) Georgia in front of a crowd of 6,474.

All-American Vanessa Hayden played just 19 minutes - three in the first half - because of foul trouble, but that didn't stop the Gators (12-5, 2-2 SEC) from posting their first win over a nationally ranked opponent on the road when the Gators were unranked themselves since stunning No. 10 Alabama back on Jan. 16, 1994.

Junior Tashia Morehead stepped up with a career-high 22 points and 12 rebounds, while sophomore Bernice Mosby recorded 18 points and six boards. Danielle Santos tallied 16 points with four rebounds, four assists and three steals in 40 minutes of action. Sarah Lowe scored all of her 11 points in the second half, when the Gators shot 59.3 percent (16-27) from the field. Hayden finished with six points, nine rebounds and two blocks, almost all of which came in the second half.

UF shot 49.1 percent (28-57) from the floor during the game, out-rebounding the taller Lady Bulldogs 43-34. The Gators hit 9-of-15 three-pointers and 18-of-23 free throws in the victory, while Georgia canned 12-of-32 three-pointers and 13-of-19 from the charity stripe.

The Gator victory snapped multiple streaks, including Georgia's 23-game home winning streak which was the second longest active streak in the country. The win ended UF's SEC road losing streak at 11 games, a run that dated back to the 2001-02 season. Finally, the victory marked UF's first over Georgia in Athens since February 8, 1995.

The Gators ended the first half on a 17-6 run to take a 36-34 halftime leading after trailing by nine points with nine minutes remaining in the period.

Georgia began the second half with a three-pointer, but Tishona Gregory answered right back with one from the right corner. Tashia Morehead then hit a layup off an in-bounds play, but Cori Chambers nailed another trey for the Bulldogs to give the lead back to Georgia with 17:26. Morehead continued her offensive stroke and went on a 7-0 run by herself. Shortly afterwards, the Bulldogs began a 8-2 run that cut UF's lead to one point, 54-53, with 12:01 remaining. But the Gators refused to relinquish their lead, as Morehead hit a 7-footer and Santos came up with a steal and dribbled the length of the court and converted the layup to bring UF's lead back to five, 58-53. Hayden then hit another tough jumper in the paint, before Kendrick hit a 15-footer to stop UF's run at 6-0. However, the Gators continued their aggressiveness on the offensive end, when Santos canned a three-pointer and Sarah Lowe was the wide-open recipient of a pass underneath the basket to hit a short jumper that gave UF a 65-55 lead with 8:12 remaining in the game. The Gators went a perfect 8-for-8 from the line in the final 1:05 as Sarah Lowe, Tishona Gregory and Danielle Santos all hit from the stripe to preserve the victory.

Game 18: Florida 61, South Carolina 56 January 22, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

University of Florida All-American Vanessa Hayden surely made an impression on WNBA Vice President of Player Personnel Renee Brown, who witnessed the 6-foot-4 senior power the Gators past South Carolina 61-56 Thursday night in the O'Connell Center.

Hayden posted her 12th double-double of the season and the 45th of her career by recording 28 points and 17 rebounds in 29 minutes of action, guiding UF to a 13-5 overall record and a 3-2 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Hayden finished the night one rebound shy of the 1,000th of her career, as she is on pace to become just the fifth different Gator to record 1,000 career points and rebounds.

Also in double figures for Florida was Tashia Morehead and Bernice Mosby, who recorded 10 and 11 points respectively for the Gators, who committed 23 turnovers in the game, but benefited from a commanding 43-27 rebounding advantage.

Cristina Ciocan led the Gamecocks (8-8, 0-4 SEC) with 16 points, while Iva Sliskovic added 14.

The Gators held a 33-32 halftime advantage, but both teams struggled to score after intermission, exchanging turnovers in the opening moments of the second half. Hayden started the scoring by making her presence felt down low. The Gamecocks used a combination of gritty defense and timely shooting to pull even, and then take the lead at the 14-minute mark thanks to a 7-0 run. When Hayden made yet another bucket inside, this time against three South Carolina players, Florida tied the game at 39 and then took the lead 41-39 when Morehead hit a driving lay-up off a Florida fast break. Morehead followed with a jumper to extend the lead to four until USC responded with a 5-0 run to take the lead, 44-43.

A Hayden basket put Florida on top 45-44 but once again the Gamecocks responded with some key baskets capitalized by a Sarah Burgess three from the top of the key that gave South Carolina 49-47 lead. Hayden responded with another bucket inside to close the gap to two with seven minutes remaining.

South Carolina hit another three to extend its lead to five but Florida would respond again with a bucket from Hayden inside, a Danielle Santos jumper, and steal and lay-up by Sarah Lowe to put the Gators on top, 53-52. Another Ciocan three-pointer for the Gamecocks put the visitors on top by two until Hayden answered again to tie the score at 55 with four minutes remaining. Baskets by Morehead and Hayden contributed to a 59-56 lead going into the closing moments of the game.

With pressure defense, the Gamecocks gained possession and called timeout with a little over 12 seconds on the clock to set their strategy for what would probably be their last offensive possession of the game. South Carolina passed in the ball near their bench and found Kelly Morrone for an open but deep three-pointer that found the back of the iron and fell into the waiting arms of Hayden for her 17th rebound on the night putting her over 1,000 for her career. The All-American then added two points at the charity stripe to secure the 61-56 win for Florida.

Game 19: Florida 76, Alabama 69

January 29, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center
Despite being triple-teamed for much of the game, University of Florida senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** still was able to record 14 points and 15 rebounds helping the Gators defeat Alabama 76-69 Thursday evening in the O'Connell Center.

In addition to logging her 13th double-double of the season and the 46th of her career, Hayden also dished a career-high six assists, as UF's perimeter game came alive with five different Gators hitting at least one three-pointer en route to a 9-of-19 effort from beyond the arc. Eighteen seconds into the game, Hayden collected her 1,000th career rebound as she became just the fifth different Gator to top the 1,000-plateau for scoring and rebounding.

Tashia Morehead led UF (14-5, 4-2 SEC) in scoring with 19 points, including three treys, while grabbing seven rebounds and canning both of her free throw attempts to extend her streak to 20 consecutive from the charity stripe. **Tishona Gregory** also recorded three 3-pointers en route to 14 points, while **Bernice Mosby** added 13 points and seven rebounds in the winning effort.

Monique Bivins led Alabama (10-9, 2-4) with 19 points, while Katie Sipe added 15 points behind a 5-of-9 effort from the three-point line. Kate Mastin came off the bench for 12 points and Dee Merrriweather added 11 points with eight rebounds.

The game was extremely well played by both teams, as UF committed a program-record low three turnovers, while Alabama had just eight total miscues.

Florida started the game with a dominating 14-4 run, leaving the Tide struggling for much of the half to catch up. In the first half alone, junior **Tashia Morehead** lit up the boards scoring 13 points, nine of which came from her contributions from three-point-range. Florida's impressive defensive effort held Alabama's leading perimeter attackers, Monique Bivins and Katie Sipe to nine and four points respectively.

After returning from the half with a 40-30 lead, the Gators struggled a bit to get into a rhythm, as the Tide went on a 19-9 run, sparked Alabama's Dee Merrriweather, to tie the score at 49-all with 12:11 left to play. However, the Gators would not give up as they continued their offensive and defensive pressure sparked by two crucial free throws from Morehead and an off-balance three from sophomore **Bernice Mosby** with 11:29 to play.

Alabama attempted one last run to catch the Gators with 3:40 left to play, when Bivins converted on two crucial free throws to bring the Tide to within one point, 67-66. But Florida finished strong, going on an 8-to-3 run, sparked once again by a critical Hayden free throw and a three-point field goal from the top of the arc by junior **Tishona Gregory** with 1:33 remaining that gave UF a 73-64 advantage. Sipe was off the mark on a 3-point attempt and Hayden collected the miss, as the Gators ran time off the clock before Morehead nailed a tough 12-footer with 39 seconds left that extended UF's lead to nine, 75-66.

Tashia Morehead scored a career-high 26 points and Vanessa Hayden added 22 points with 11 rebounds and five blocks leading Florida to an impressive 92-83 upset victory over No. 24 Vanderbilt Sunday afternoon at Memorial Gymnasium.

Also scoring in double-figures was Bernice Mosby, who tallied 16 points, and Danielle Santos, who added 13 points with a career-high seven assists and four steals for the Gators (15-5, 5-2 SEC).

Jenni Benningfield led the Commodores (16-4, 4-3 SEC) offensively, scoring 20 points off the bench, while Carla Thomas added 17 points, Abi Ramsey and Ashley Earley both 13 points and Hillary Hager tallied 11 points.

Both teams shot extremely well from the floor, as Florida hit 50.8 percent (33-65) from the field, including a 60.7 percent (17-28) effort in the second half. Vanderbilt averaged 52.5 percent (31-59) from the field, hitting 58.1 percent in the second half, when the Gators outscored their hosts 56-49.

The Gators shot an impressive 21-of-26 from the free throw line, hitting 14-of-16 during the final 2:21 of the game to preserve the victory. Morehead led the way from the charity stripe, hitting 8-of-10 and had extended her consecutive made free throw streak to 28 before missing a pair with 20 seconds remaining in the game.

Vanderbilt scored the first basket of the second half to tie the score at 36-all, but Hayden scored four points during UF's ensuing 6-0 run that as the Gators retook the lead. However Abi Ramsey began to get hot and nailed long range attempts on back-to-back possessions that helped Vanderbilt cut the lead to 44-42 with just under 16 minutes remaining.

The teams then traded buckets, with neither team able to connect with back-to-back scores until Vanderbilt managed to with 11:30 remaining and tied the score at 55-all. But Florida struck right back as Sarah Lowe nailed a three-pointer and Hayden hit a tough fall-away jumper to give the Gators a 60-55 lead with 10:42 left.

But Florida got sloppy and the Commodores took advantage by stealing an in-bounds pass and converting a fast break layup that resulted in a 6-0 run that gave VU a 60-61 lead with 9:16 on the clock. However, the Gators tightened up by giving better care of the ball and Santos nailed a three-point before Mosby hit back-to-back shots that lifted UF to a 67-61 lead with 7:30 remaining. Then Vanderbilt began to show why it's ranked 12th in the country in field goal percentage, staging a 9-2 run that tied the game with 5:10 remaining.

The Gators refused to relinquish their lead, as Tishona Gregory nailed a jumper from just inside the three-point arc. Morehead then put back an offensive rebound to extend the run, which grew to a 10-1 spree ending when Santos converted a pair of free throws after stealing the ball and running the length of the floor for a layup, as the Gators took a 80-71 lead with 2:21 remaining. But Vanderbilt continued hitting from the outside, as Hager canned a trey to cut the deficit to six points, 80-74, with 1:59 left in the game. But as composed as the Commodores were shooting from the floor, the Gators were just as smooth from the free throw line, answering every VU field goal with a pair of free throws, hitting 14-of-16 in the final 2:21 of the game to seal the win.

Game 23: No. 16/16 LSU 91, No. 20/-- Florida 72 February 15, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Sophomore **Bernice Mosby** led No. 20 Florida with 19 points, but it was not enough to overcome the hot-shooting 16th-ranked LSU Tigers 91-72 in front of a crowd of 2,519 in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Back-to-back three-pointers by Mosby and **Sarah Lowe** brought the Gators within nine points, 61-52, with 10:45 remaining in the game, but LSU responded with a quick 6-0 run and Florida was unable to get within double-figures again. After winning a season-high five consecutive games, the Gators now have lost two straight for the first time this season and next travel to No. 3 Tennessee for a Thursday night game in Knoxville.

The Gators (16-7, 6-4 SEC) struggled to stop the Tiger's scoring attack and couldn't get the ball to drop offensively. LSU (20-4, 8-2) was able to get many high-percentage looks at the basket and capitalized by shooting 61.3 percent (38-62) from the floor. Meanwhile, the Gators struggled to hit 35.2 percent (25-71). Florida did continue to control the boards, earning a 42-35 edge while holding LSU to just five offensive rebounds and collecting 21 themselves.

Vanessa Hayden scored 17 points for UF but seemed uncomfortable finding a rhythm, shooting 7-for-24 from the floor. Hayden also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds with three blocks. **Danielle Santos** also scored in double figures with 11 points. Mosby added six rebounds and two steals to her offensive output.

Seimone Augustus led the Tigers with 26 points on 10-of-17 shooting from the field. She also topped the Tigers rebounding effort with seven. Temeka Johnson added 17 points with six rebounds and six assists in 36 minutes of action, while Wendlyn Jones and Doneeka Hodges each tallied 15 points and Scholanda Hoston chipped in 11.

The game was played evenly through the first 12 minutes of the opening half. The teams traded baskets and were deadlocked at 22-22 with 7:38 to play in the half before LSU went on a 15-5 run over the next four minutes and led 37-27 with 3:38 remaining in the period.

UF was able to cut the lead to nine before the half, going into the break trailing 42-33, but was never able to close the gap any further in the second half. LSU stayed hot, outscoring the Gators 14-6 during the first six minutes out of the locker room, pushing the lead to 56-39.

The Gators fought back to within eleven, 52-63, with 10:18 to play, but came no closer to catching the Tigers the rest of the way. LSU led by as many as 22 in the final frame.

Game 24: No. 3 Tennessee 88, Florida 79 February 19, 2004 • Knoxville, TN • Thompson-Boling Arena

Florida made more field goals, more three-pointers and outrebounded Tennessee 37-33, but the difference came at the free throw line where the third-ranked Lady Vols hit 32-of-38 to escape with a 88-79 decision over the Gators in front of 12,773 at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Vanessa Hayden's 19 points led UF, who shot 44.4 percent (28-63) from the floor and 18-of-23 from the free throw line during the game. Tashia Morehead added 18 points with eight rebounds, while Sarah Lowe contributed a season-high 18 points with seven rebounds. Bernice Mosby tallied 11 points with eight rebounds off the bench for the Gators (16-8, 6-5 SEC), who lost their third consecutive game.

Tennessee shot 30 of its free throws in the second half, when the Vols also shot 57.7 percent (15-26) from the floor. Shanna Zolman scored a game-high 23 points for UT, hitting all eight of her attempts from the charity stripe. Tahsa Butts added 18, including nine points from the stripe, while Shyria Ely also netted 18.

Florida held a 33-30 halftime lead, but Hayden picked up two quick fouls and went to the bench with 19 minutes remaining in the game after drawing three personals, as UF held a 33-32 lead. Tishona Gregory then canned a tough fall-away jumper from the side, but UT followed with the next three points to tied the game with 18:06 left in the game. Tashia Morehead and Brittany Davis scored the next four points of the game to give UF a 39-35 lead with 17:21 remaining. Shyria Ely hit for UT next, but Bernice Mosby answered right back for the Gators who then led 41-37 with 16:53 left.

Unfortunately for the Gators, that was the last time they would score for the next 2:47, when Tennessee ripped off a 14-0 run, giving the Vols a 51-41 lead. During that spell, Hayden picked up her fourth personal foul and returned to the bench with 14:18 on the clock.

The Gators didn't fold after that quick run by the Vols, and regrouped to stage a balanced 14-5 run to get within one point, 56-55, with 11:14 remaining. Morehead capped the run with a brilliant baseline drive where she converted the bucket and drew the foul. Morehead left with an injury and Tishona Gregory came in to make the free throw. Morehead immediately returned to the game.

Zolman nailed a three-pointer and Sidney Spencer hit an 8-footer to extend UT's lead back to six, 61-55, with 10:28 to go. But Sarah Lowe and Bernice Mosby each canned three-pointers between a Vol free throw to again get within one, 62-61, with 9:34 on the clock. UT again rallied with a 6-1 run to take a 68-62 lead with 7:20 remaining. After the teams traded scores, Morehead drove for another bucket and Hayden powered her way to a short jumper in the paint to bring UF within two, 70-68, with 5:13 remaining.

The Lady Vols returned by scoring the next two field goals of the contest, before Hayden nailed two free throws and Lowe hit a driving layup that again brought the Gators within two, 74-72, with 3:05 left in the game. Tasha Butts hit two free throws for UT, but Mosby canned a jumper to keep the score within two points with 2:30 on the clock. Butts hit again from the field and Zolman followed with two free throws to extend the deficit back to six, 80-74, with 1:39. Lowe nailed a jumper with 1:22, but the Gators picked up a touch foul and the Vols made them pay from the charity stripe and UF just couldn't quite make up the difference before the clock ran out.

Game 25: Arkansas 82, Florida 68 February 22, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Florida committed a season-high 27 turnovers and shot only 36.1 percent in a disappointing 82-68 loss to Arkansas Sunday afternoon in front of 1,353 at the O'Connell Center.

Arkansas (16-9, 5-7 SEC) struggled to a 13.5 percent shooting mark in the first half, hitting only 5-of-37 from the floor, but trailed just 35-28 at halftime as the Gators (16-9, 6-6 SEC) couldn't take advantage of the Lady Razorbacks shooting woes by committing 16 turnovers. Arkansas shooting percentage in the first half was the lowest in school history against an SEC opponent, but the Razorbacks were never out of the game and even ended the half on a 10-4 drive, which featured a buzzer-beating three-pointer to end the half. Arkansas carried that momentum into the second half, when the Razorbacks shot 65.2 percent in the final period outscoring UF 54-33.

The Gators held Shameka Christon to just three points in the first half, but the SEC's leading scorer went wild in the second frame, scoring 22 of her game-high 25 points. Kristen Peoples and Rochelle Vaughn each scored 18 points for the Razorbacks.

UF led 33-18 with 3:07 remaining in the first half after **Brittany Davis** converted a layup. But that's when Arkansas began its comeback, staging a 25-6 run that extended into the second half and lasted over eight minutes to take a 43-39 lead. **Vanessa Hayden** then sank a pair of free throws to get the Gators within two points, but Arkansas used a 18-7 spree over the next seven minutes and never looked back.

UF's Hayden logged her 15th double-double of the season with a team-high 16 points in addition to a game-high 11 rebounds and five blocks. **Danielle Santos** was the only other Gator scoring in double-figures, netting 12 points.

Again, the Gators outrebounded their opponent, 47-41, marking the ninth straight game UF has won the rebounding battle.

The entire game was sloppy, with the teams combining for 59 fouls and getting to the free throw line 83 times. Arkansas was 38-of-54 from the charity stripe, while UF was 23-of-29.

Sophomore **Bernice Mosby** scored 14 of her team-high 19 points in the second half during the Gator's 69-59 upset victory over No. 19 Georgia Thursday evening in the O'Connell Center.

The victory snapped a four-game losing streak for Florida, which improved to 17-9 overall and 7-6 in the Southeastern Conference, while the Lady Bulldogs fell to 18-8 and 7-6 in league action.

"Bernice came in, stepped up and played with a lot of energy," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "I think our back court defense was outstanding and Bernice was a big part of that. She came out focused and took shots that flowed with our offense."

UF senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden**, who was playing in the final home game of her career, contributed 18 points on 9-of-14 shooting, in addition to grabbing a game-high nine rebounds with three blocks. **Danielle Santos** added 14 points with eight rebounds for the Gators, who play at No. 18 Auburn on Sunday in the team's regular season finale.

The Gators have won eight more games than they did all of last season, when they finished 9-19. The eight-game swing is tied for the greatest turn-around in program history. Tonight's victory also completed UF's two-game sweep over Georgia, marking just the second time the Gators have won two against their SEC rival in the same season and the first time since the 1978-79 season.

Santos' free throw with 14:20 remaining game the Gators a 37-36 lead, their first of the game. Sherill Baker answered with one from the charity stripe to tie the game for the fifth time, before Mosby nailed a three-pointer from the top of the arc to give UF the advantage. However, Jessica Pierce canned a trey on Georgia's next possession and the game was tied again with 12:50 on the clock.

The teams then traded missed attempts before Santos hit a driving layup and **Tashia Morehead** then followed with a trey from the left side that gave the Gators a 45-40 lead with 11:26 remaining. Georgia responded with a layup from Ebony Felder and a short jumper from Christi Thomas, as the Lady Bulldogs closed within one, 47-46, with 8:24 remaining.

But Mosby rallied and scored the next six points of the game, giving UF a 53-46 advantage with 6:14 left. Georgia refused to fold and whittled the deficit to two points, 54-52, with 4:50 remaining, but the Gators were steady from the free throw line down the stretch, hitting 9-of-12 to secure the victory.

Georgia actually outscored UF from the floor by two points, but the Gators capitalized from the free throw line, where they were 17-of-24 while the visiting Bulldogs were just 5-of-6.

Florida overcame a 10-point halftime deficit and outscored No. 18 Auburn 45-24 in the second half to post a 71-60 victory in the regular season finale.

Vanessa Hayden led all scorers with 22 points on 9-of-14 shooting from the floor, while grabbing five rebounds and blocking six shots, but the victory truly was a team effort. Bernice Mosby was instrumental in the second-half comeback, as she finished the game with 14 points and skied for team-high eight rebounds.

Danielle Santos added 11 points in addition to dishing a career-high seven assists with just one turnover. The Gators shot 53.8 percent (14-26) in the second half against an Auburn defense that ranked third nationally for opponent field goal percentage. UF shot 41.7 percent for the game for the floor.

LeCoe Willingham led the Tigers with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while Mandisa Stevenson added 10 points and 12 rebounds, as Auburn outrebounded the Gators 52-40, but shot just 28.2 percent (20-71) from the floor during the game, including a 17.6 percent (6-34) effort in the decisive second half.

Tashia Morehead led UF in the opening minutes of the second half, scoring nine straight points as the Gators exploded on a 27-12 spurt out of the locker room to erase a 36-25 deficit and take a 53-48 lead with 8:40 remaining. Hayden powered her way for 10 tough points in the paint during the run, while Santos spread the Auburn defense by scoring eight points from the perimeter, including a 3-pointer with 10:16 remaining that gave UF a 49-46 lead and they would never trail again.

Louise Emeagi hit a deep jumper for Auburn to cut UF's lead to three, 53-50, but Hayden answered with another power layin from under the bucket, where she was fouled. Hayden missed the free throw, but collected the loose ball. However, as Hayden moved toward the basket she was whistled for an offensive foul, her third personal of the game with 6:46 remaining. Natasha Brackett then capitalized on one of multiple offensive rebounds the Tigers collected on their next possession by nailing a three-pointer from the right side, bringing the score to 55-53.

But Mosby drove in the lane and hit a fall-away eight-footer to give the Gators a cushion. After Willingham sank a pair of free throws, Sarah Lowe canned a three-pointer from the right corner and then stole a pass on the other end of the floor, racing down the court for a layup. Lowe missed the short shot, but Tishona Gregory was there for the miss and was fouled as she attempted to put back the offensive rebound. Gregory made both from the charity stripe and the Gators took a 62-55 lead with 4:43 remaining in the game. Nitahsa Brown then converted two from the free throw line, but Mosby coolly stepped to the line and hit two for the Gators with 1:38 left in the game. Auburn refused to go quietly and Natasha Brackett nailed a three-pointer from the right side of the arc with 1:26 remaining to close within four points, 64-60. However that was the last time the Tigers would score, as Hayden followed with another tough power jumper in the lane with 1:04 on the clock. Mosby then followed with three straight free throws and Hayden with two more with 18 seconds on the clock to close the scoring for the game.

Tishona Gregory scored five points during a 7-0 Gator spurt that gave UF a 21-16 lead with 6:53 remaining in the first half. However, UF went cold from the floor and Auburn ripped off a 20-5 run to a close the period and take a 36-26 halftime lead after a close first half featured six lead changes and seven tied scores until the Tigers closed the final 4:14 of the period on a 14-2 run.

Vanessa Hayden scored 26 points with 12 rebounds but it wasn't enough to lead Florida past No. 20/16 Georgia in a thrilling 76-72 decision in the quarterfinal round of the SEC Tournament Friday evening at the Gaylord Entertainment Center.

In what was a game of significant and decisive runs, Georgia's 15-4 spree that began with just over seven minutes remaining in the game erased a 62-56 Gator lead and became a 71-66 Bulldog advantage with 2:07 left.

Hayden and UG center Christi Thomas exchanged buckets in the paint after the Georgia run, before Bernice Mosby completed a three-point play that dropped the deficit to 73-71 with 39 seconds remaining. Janese Hardrick then made one free throw on the other end of the floor after being fouled during UF's full court press. Tishona Gregory grabbed Hardrick's miss and the Gators got the ball inside to Hayden, who was fouled attempting a power jumper with 17 seconds left and Georgia holding a 74-71 lead. Hayden made the first and missed the second, but Tashia Morehead snared the offensive rebound and called a timeout.

UF worked the ball around the perimeter and found Danielle Santos on the right wing. Santos drove hard along the baseline and put up a short jumper that missed with six seconds remaining. The Gators were forced to foul immediately on the inbound play and Alexis Kendrick coolly canned two free throws with four seconds remaining to give UG a 76-72 lead and concluded the game's scoring.

Cori Chambers provided back-breaking back-to-back three-pointers late during Georgia's game-deciding run that energized the Bulldogs and gave them a 67-64 lead with 4:11 remaining and they would not trail again.

Bernice Mosby also scored in double figures for UF, netting 17 points with five rebounds. Hayden's double-double was her 16th this season and the 48th in her career, helping the Gators to a 43-35 rebounding advantage for the game. UF shot 43.3 percent (29-67) from the floor during the game, but hit just 60 percent (12-20) from the free throw line. Sherill Baker scored a team-high 18 points for Georgia, which shot 46.4 percent (26-56) from the floor and nailed 70.4 percent (19-27) from the line. Thomas scored all of her 13 points during the second half, including eight points during the Bulldog's game-ending run.

Georgia opened the game scoring the first five points, but Florida battled and after exchanging buckets, the Gators ripped off an 18-2 run that featured seven points from Santos, five from Morehead and four from Mosby. The spree lifted UF to a 22-11 lead with 9:59 remaining in the first half.

Georgia collected several fouls during the run, as the Gators drove hard to the basket and continued to pound the ball inside to Hayden. However, with the Bulldogs post players collecting fouls quickly and Gators taking advantage by running out to a 22-11 lead, the Lady Bulldogs changed their strategy and began driving into the paint and drawing fouls instead of attempting the outside shot. The move worked as Florida began accumulating foul trouble and Georgia rallied with 14-0 run and regained the lead, 27-24, with just under five minutes left in the half. From that moment through the end of the half, the game featured four lead changes and three tied scores that included the 36-36 halftime mark.

Hayden scored the first bucket of the second half, but Sherill Baker netted the next two baskets as the lead changed hands again. Mosby then scored to tie the game and begin a 7-0 Gator swing resulting in a 45-40 lead with 16:39 remaining. Florida slowly increased its lead to seven points, 58-51, after Hayden's bucket with 9:24 on the clock and held a 62-56 advantage with 7:37 after Sarah Lowe's jumper. But that's when Georgia began its game-deciding run.

Game 29: Florida 68, New Mexico 56 March 20, 2004 • Albuquerque, NM • The Pit/Bob King Court NCAA Championship First Round

Vanessa Hayden scored 15 of her 17 points in the second half as the University of Florida women's basketball team fought off a furious late rally to defeat New Mexico 68-56 in the first round of the NCAA Championship. The game was played at The Pit/Bob King Court in front of 16,029 frenzied Lobo fans, marking the third largest crowd the Gators have ever played in front of in program history.

The No. 5-seeded Gators (19-10) scored the final 10 points of the game after Melissa Forest hit a 3-pointer with 2:57 remaining that cut UF's lead to two points, 58-56. After Forest's trey, the Gators turned the ball over with a 30-second violation that could have been credited to the 16,029 crazed fans that made communication between UF's coaches and players impossible.

However on UNM's ensuing possession, **Tishona Gregory** picked the pocket of Fatima Maddox and raced the length of the court where she completed a three-point play after being fouled by Maddox. Gregory then returned to the free throw line after being fouled by Maddox in the backcourt and nailed both ends of the one-and-one to extended UF's lead to 63-56 with 1:41 remaining. On UNM's next possession, Maddox missed a jumper and Hayden collected the miss and the Gators raced down the court where Santos put up an 18-footer with her toe on the three-point line that extended UF's lead to nine points, 65-56, with 1:03 on the clock. Hayden hit one free throw with 39 seconds remaining and **Bernice Mosby** closed the game's scoring with two more from the charity stripe with 30 ticks left.

Mosby shared game-high scoring honors with Hayden, netting 17 with seven rebounds off the bench. **Tashia Morehead** recorded all of her 16 points in the first half, when Hayden collected two fouls after playing just six minutes. Morehead joined Hayden with a double-double, as she collected a game-high 11 rebounds to post her fourth double-double of the season. Hayden snared nine of her 10 boards in the second half en route to posting her 17th double-double of the year and the 50th of her career.

Florida shot 40.7 percent (24-59) from the floor and scored 68 points against New Mexico which entered the game with the nation's top defense that had allowed just 50.5 points per game and opponent to shot just 33.0 percent from the field.

Lindsey Arndt scored 11 points to lead No. 12-seeded New Mexico (23-8), which saw its 11-game win streak snapped.

Sarah Lowe hit a jumper that gave the Gators a 53-39 lead with 11:33 remaining before New Mexico rallied with a 15-5 run, cutting UF's advantage to two points, 58-56 with 2:57 on the clock.

Tashia Morehead carried the Gators offensively in the first half, netting 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting that included a 4-for-4 effort from the three-point line. Morehead began the game's scoring hitting her first free throw en route to scoring all Gator points during a game-opening 8-3 run.

Melissa Forest answered with a trey for New Mexico and the teams continued to trade baskets for the next three minutes until Morehead canned another from behind the arc and Bernice Mosby followed with a pair of free throws to give UF a 19-11 lead with 13:01 remaining in the first half. But the Lobos struck back with five straight points after Judy Vogt put back an offensive rebound and Mandy Moore followed with a three-pointer that cut UF's lead to three points, 19-16.

But Morehead canned her fourth try of the game to spark a 7-0 run for the Gators that lifted the lead to 10, 26-16. UNM responded with a 5-0 spree and the teams traded baskets for the remainder of the half, as UF held a 33-26 lead entering the locker room.

Game 30: #15/17 Baylor 91, Florida 76 March 22, 2004 • Albuquerque, NM • The Pit • NCAA 2nd Round

Baylor used a devastating 21-3 run late in the first half to blow open a close game, defeating Florida 91-76 in second round of the NCAA Championship played at The Pit in front of 15,544. The Gators end their remarkable turnaround season with a 19-11 record, one year removed from 9-19.

With senior All-American **Vanessa Hayden** on the bench in foul trouble after playing just eight minutes in the first half, No. 4 seeded Baylor (26-8) outscored fifth-seeded UF 30-6 in the paint during the opening period to take a commanding 46-32 halftime lead.

Before Baylor's game-breaking run, the lead changed hands 11 times and the score was tied five times. UF never led by more than one point, which it did on six occasions. The 14-point halftime deficit was tied for the largest the Gators had faced this season.

Florida cut Baylor's lead to nine points twice during the first six minutes of the second half, but Baylor's Emily Niemann immediately answered with deep three-pointers on both occasions to prevent UF from making a serious run.

The teams traded buckets for the next two minutes, as Baylor held a 63-51 lead with 13:32 remaining. But the Gators staged a 9-2 run with **Danielle Santos** hitting back-to-back field goals, Hayden netting a tough jumper and **Tamia Williams** nailing a three-pointer from the right corner, as UF closed within five, 65-60, with 11:16 to go in the game.

Monique Jones then scored for BU, but Hayden followed with two free throws and the deficit again was at five with 10:46 on the clock. However, Florida had some defensive breakdowns, allowing multiple offensive rebounds and a break-away layup as Baylor used a 6-0 spurt to up its lead to 11, 73-62, with 7:58 remaining. UF scored the next three points, but Dionne Brown scored four of BU's next five points, as the Bears increased their lead back to double figures, 78-65, with 5:21 remaining. Baylor notched its last point of the 5-0 run from the free throw after Hayden was whistled for her fifth personal, fouling out of a game for the first time this season.

The main difference in the game came on the boards, where Baylor held a 51-39 rebounding edge, snaring 19 on the offensive end alone. It was tied for the largest rebounding deficit the Gators faced all season, however UF did manage to defeat Auburn in the other contest.

Bernice Mosby came off the bench to score a team-high 16 points with seven rebounds. Hayden netted 12 of her 15 points in the second half, grabbing seven rebounds and blocking five shots. **Danielle Santos** scored 13 points with six assists, while **Tashia Morehead** added 12 points and five boards.

Sophia Young scored a game-high 23 points, with 17 of those coming during the deciding first half. Emily Niemann netted 16 points with four three-pointers, including two key treys during the second half when the Gators were making their run. Baylor shot 44.3 percent (31-70) from the floor during the game, while UF finished with a 38.1 mark (24-63) that included a 27.3 effort in the first half.

The lead changed hands on the first four scores of the game until Baylor hit back-to-back buckets to take a 6-3 lead. But the Gators followed with three free throws from **Vanessa Hayden** and **Danielle Santos** to tie the game at the 16:22 mark. Sophia Young answered for the Bears by converting a three-point play and extended BU's back to three, 9-6.

Hayden then hit an 8-footer that rolled around the rim and fell through and **Bernice Mosby** came off the bench and canned her first field goal attempt, a 12-footer from the right corner, as UF regained the lead. But Hayden picked up her second foul with 14:39 remaining in the half and went to the bench for the rest of the period after scoring three points with three rebounds and UF holding a 10-9 lead.

Sarah Lowe canned a 3-pointer from the right side of the arc that gave the Gators a 24-23 lead with 7:20 remaining. The teams traded scores again before Baylor ripped off a devastating 21-3 run, scoring 14 straight at the end of the spree to race out to a 46-29 lead. **Morehead** hit her first field goal of the game, a 3-pointer, with three seconds remaining to finally end the run, as the Gators trailed 46-32 at halftime.
