## Exhibition Game 1: Florida 106, Warner Southern 28 Nov. 1, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

New head coach Amanda Butler claimed throughout the preseason that the Florida women's basketball team would play an up-tempo, full-court style game. During the team's lone preseason exhibition game, the Gators looked every bit like the squad Butler described they would be, as Florida dominated Warner Southern, 106-28, Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center.

All 10 scholarship players who entered the game scored at least six points, with five Gators tallying a double-figure scoring effort.

Junior Aneika Henry led the Gators with a double-double, scoring 19 points on 7-of-8 shooting, along with 10 rebounds. The tallest player on the floor at 6-foot-3, Henry also recorded three blocks and two steals.

"I think you got a glimpse of what Aneika's impact is," Butler said. "She's able to do a lot of things on the court that other people just aren't capable of doing. Combine that with the fact that she plays very hard and really wants to get better every time she steps onto the court, her future is very bright."

Senior Depree Bowden and junior Sha Brooks followed Henry with 14 points a piece, while fellow juniors Kim Critton and Marsha Dotson topped the 10-point mark with 13 and 12 points, respectively. The duo also followed Henry on the boards with nine rebounds each, helping Florida to a 60-34 rebounding edge.

Warner Southern was led by freshman guard Ivana Soberal, who contributed 19 of the Royals' 28 total points. The West Palm Beach, Fla., native also led Warner Southern with seven rebounds and two steals in the contest, but turned the ball over 15 times.

Riding the momentum from the first half, when Florida assumed a commanding 57-16 halftime lead, Butler's locker room talk kept the Gators focused on both ends of the court.

The Royals couldn't connect on their first field goal of the second half until the 12:22 mark, while Florida continued to extend its offensive advantage and out-rebounded the visitors, 39-15, in the final 20 minutes.

"From a coaching standpoint when you go into a locker room and issue a challenge and a team responds like that, you certainly have to be pleased," Butler said.

Florida finished the game hitting 56 percent (42-of-75) of its shots, while forcing the Royals into 37 turnovers and shooting just 16.4 percent (10-61).

The Gators outscored the Royals, 57-16, in the first half, shooting 22-of-34 (64.6%). The Orange and Blue were led during the opening 20 minutes by Brooks and Henry, scoring in double figures with 10 and 11 points, respectively. Henry also snagged five rebounds to go with two blocks and a steal in the first half.

## Game 1: Florida 82, #rv/rv Xavier 71 Nov. 9, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Amanda Butler could not have planned her debut game as Florida's head coach any better, as the Gators used a complete team effort in defeating Xavier, 82-71, Friday evening in front of 3,330 in the 2007-08 season opener for both schools.

"The biggest thing had nothing to do with strategy or game plan. It was show your Gator pride and the team really came out and did that," said Butler, who became the sixth consecutive Gator head coach to earn a win in their inaugural Florida game. "When things didn't go our way, we didn't drop our head. We stuck our chest out and were ready for the next play, whatever that was."

Depree Bowden and sophomore Brittaney Thomas scored 17 points each, while Sha Brooks tallied 16 points and Marsha Dotson added 14 points. While Bowden, Brooks and Dotson have become accustomed to notching double-figure scoring efforts during their careers, it was a first for Thomas, who made the most of her first career start.

The defending Atlantic 10 champion Musketeers scored the opening bucket of the second half to take a 34-31 lead. Gator junior Aneika Henry, who finished the game with six points, four rebounds and three blocks, slipped in a short jumper and Bowden followed with a driving layup to give Florida a one-point advantage.

The lead changed hands four more times during the next three-plus minutes, before Thomas hit a jumper in the paint to give Florida a 40-39 lead with 16:40 remaining. The Musketeers got within one point before Bowden canned a pair from the charity stripe to keep the small cushion.

Jerri Taylor, who led all scorers with 26 points, followed with one free throw and Xavier was within two, 44-42, at the 14:38 mark. Brooks then stepped up and hit Florida's first three-pointer of the season after the Gators had missed eight straight. Lonnika Thompson followed with a trey and the Gator's lead was eight, 50-42.

Xavier star Amber Harris, who finished with 21 points, hit one of her four three-pointers and pulled the visitors within five at the 11:29 mark, but that's when Florida ripped off a game-changing 21-7 run over the next five minutes to take a 71-52 lead with 6:42 remaining. Six different Gators scored during the run, while two others dished assists and another collected a steal en route to the victory and avenge last year's 86-70 loss to the Musketeers.

Xavier led most of the first half, but the tide turned less than a minute before half time. Thomas' steal in the final minute allowed the Gators to take the lead after she made a free throw. A Florida foul in the final seconds, however, allowed Xavier to go into halftime with a 32-31 lead.

The Musketeers continued to battle and cut the deficit to eight points twice in the final two and half minutes of the game, but Ndidi Madu countered one with a bucket in the lane and Thomas nailed a 3-pointer after the other to quell any thoughts of a Xavier comeback.

## Game 2: Florida 67, Robert Morris 63

Nov. 12, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Marsha Dotson scored 25 points and collected 16 rebounds, powering the University of Florida women's basketball team past Robert Morris, 67-63, Monday evening in the O'Connell Center.

The Gators (2-0) built a 10-point lead midway through the first half, but the Colonials (0-1) ripped off a 15-6 run and cut UF's lead to one, 30-29, with just under two minutes remaining in the period and the teams nearly matched each other shot for shot the rest of the game, as the Gators came away with the hard-fought victory.

The final 20 minutes featured five tied scores and RMU even taking the lead on four different occasions. The Gators, however, responded every time including a jumper by senior Depree Bowden to even the score at the 42-41 with just under 16 minutes remaining and then a tough put-back by Dotson with 14:27 on the clock to give the Gators a 46-44 advantage and the lead for good.

Dotson's bucket sparked an 8-2 run that gave the Gators a 52-46 lead, but Robert Morris continued to battle and got within one point five times during the final 10:28 of the game, the last time with 1:19 on the clock, but Florida answered each challenge and never surrendered its advantage.

Dotson, who shot 10-of-19 from the field en route to posting her eighth double-double and the 11th 20-point game of her career, snared 11 of her game-high 16 rebounds on the offensive end, helping the Gators to a 50-41 rebounding edge.

Joining Dotson in double-figure scoring column was Bowden, who added 16 points with seven rebounds, five assists and a pair of steals, while sophomore Brittaney Thomas added 14 points with five boards and three assists. Junior Kim Critton had a solid effort on both ends of the floor, as she finished with seven points and a career-high seven rebounds in 18 minutes of work.

Sade Logan led Robert Morris with 20 points on 8-of-21 shooting, while Chinata Nesbit added 16 points and 12 rebounds, and Angela Pace chipped in 12 points with a game-high six assists for the Colonials, whose roster features 10 new players.

With 3:35 remaining in the game, Bowden found Dotson on an entry pass out-of-bounds to give Florida a 62-59 cushion. The Gators then forced a missed 3-point attempt and a turnover on the ensuing defensive possessions, as Robert Morris endured a three-minute drought without a field goal.

Logan canned a jumper with 1:19 to go and pulled Robert Morris within one point, but Bowden countered with a driving layup to push UF's lead back to three. Thomas then connected on the front end of a one-on-one but Logan answered with a sideline jumper to keep it a one-possession game with 10 seconds remaining. Dotson then iced the game when she coolly sank two from the stripe with six seconds left and provide the final points of the night.

## Game 3: #/rv Nebraska 90, #rv/ Florida 63

Nov. 17, 2007 \* Lincoln, Neb. \* Bob Devaney Sports Center

Nebraska road the momentum from a game-changing 22-4 run early in the second half to hand the Florida women's basketball team a 90-63 loss Saturday evening at the Devaney Sports Center in front of 3,117.

Sha Brooks scored the first points of the second half after the Gators (2-1) opened with a defensive flurry and closed within four points, 38-34.

Nebraska (3-0) responded with a 9-0 run over the next two minutes, taking a 47-34 lead, but Brooks canned a try to stop the run and Depree Bowden followed with a layin after a dish from Brooks, as the Gators cut the deficit to single digits. The teams traded baskets again, with Aneika Henry adding the jumper to pull Florida within eight, 49-41, with just over 14 minutes remaining.

That's when the Huskers ripped off the devastating spree over the ensuing seven minutes to take a commanding 71-45 lead and the Gators couldn't recover.

"In no way did we resemble the Florida team that defeated Xavier and Robert Morris to start the season," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "There was no aspect of our game that was composed or settled at any point tonight and I have to give Nebraska credit for that. They set the tone and we never adjusted to it. We lost our composure on the court and they took advantage."

One bright spot of the night was the return of Sharielle Smith, who scored 12 points in her first action of the season and sparked Florida off the bench early.

Brooks and Bowden chipped in 12 points each for the Gators, who managed to out-rebound the Huskers, 49-44, collecting 26 offensive boards, but committed 33 turnovers that Nebraska converted into 38 points. Marsha Dotson, who was plagued with foul trouble for the majority of the night, collected a game-high 12 rebounds but scored just three points from the charity stripe before being whistled for her fifth foul in 21 minutes of action. Henry posted her first double-figure rebounding effort, snaring 10 boards to go along with six points and three blocks while playing 22 minutes before fouling out.

Dominique Kelley's 16 points led five double-figure scorers in a balanced attack that featured 12 different Huskers contributing offensively. Nebraska shot a steady 65.5 percent (19-29) in the second half en route to hitting 52.2 percent (35-67) during the game, while Florida managed to convert only 27.3 percent (9-33) of its attempts in the deciding second half, 30.6 percent (22-72) overall.

The Huskers started quickly, scoring the first five points of the game, before Brooks put back an offensive rebound to get the Gators on the board. That bucket started a back and fourth trend and the teams exchanged two-point field goals eight times over a five-minute span before Brittaney Thomas continued the trend, but this time with a three-pointer, as Florida was within two. After two more possessions trading buckets, Nebraska hit on consecutive tries, and Florida answered with back-to-back field goals by Henry and Brooks, whose make was a try, and the Gators were again within two points, 20-18. This time, however, Florida had multiple chances to tie or even take the lead, but turnovers hampered the team's effort.

Nebraska took advantage and ripped off the next six points to spark a 14-4 spree to take a 34-22 lead with 3:33 left in the first half. Florida was able to drop the deficit under single digits, closing the period on a 9-4 march to enter the locker room down six, 38-32.

## Game 4: Florida 69, Prairie View A&M 63

Depree Bowden scored a game-high 23 points as the Gators used a solid defensive effort and team play in their 69-63 victory over Prairie View A&M on Tuesday evening at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

In a tough defensive battle, the teams scrapped for possessions and momentum, combining for 53 turnovers, 25 steals and seven blocks, but it was Bowden's leadership and team defense that helped the Gators earn the hard-fought victory.

"There were two reasons why we won the game," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "The first one was defense. We had to play tough, stingy, solid defense. Lonnika Thompson had some huge plays for us and we came up with the loose balls in the second half. The other was because of Depree Bowden's consistency. Every time she had the ball in her hands, we knew something good was going to happen."

Bowden shot 9-of-17 from the field, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc, while junior Marshae Dotson earned her second double-double of the season and the ninth of her career, tallying 15 points, to go along with 11 rebounds. Dotson also dished out a career-high six assists, leading all players on the floor. Junior Sha Brooks chipped in 10 points, including two clutch free throws with eight seconds remaining that gave the Gators a 67-63 lead.

PVAMU's (1-4) leading contributor was sophomore Candice Thomas, scoring 21, while sophomore Gaati Werema tallied 18 points. Thomas scored 10 of the Lady Panthers' first 15 points.

After trading short runs for most of the second half, the Gators jumped to their largest lead of the contest, 63-54, thanks to an 11-0 run with 3:05 left in the game.

PVAMU quickly cut the deficit to four points, 63-59, after a three-pointer from senior Shavonne Smith at the 1:55 mark. A jumper at the top of the key from Werema placed the Panthers within two points, 65-63, with only 9.2 seconds remaining. The Gators, however, would not relinquish the lead, as Brooks and Lonnika Thompson (New Orleans) each hit a pair of free throws to secure the victory. Thompson trip to the line came after she stole the ball from Werema with eight seconds remaining and the Gators holding a four-point lead.

The Lady Panthers jumped on the Gators early, making the first three baskets of the contest. The two teams would exchange buckets until PVAMU would cap off a 6-0 run at the 10:22 mark in the first half.

Florida would answer with a 12-3 run of its own, sparked by a three-pointer from Bowden, earning its first lead of the contest, 27-24, with 2:49 left in the first half. PVAMU would get a jump shot from freshman Dominique Smith to fall with 18 seconds left in the half to take the teams in locker rooms, knotted, 31-31.

## Game 5: #20/21 Florida State 81, Florida 78

Marshae Dotson powered in 22 points with a game-high 15 rebounds, but it wasn't enough as the Florida women's basketball team fell just short of upsetting No. 20 (AP)/21 (ESPN-USA Today Coaches') Florida State, 81-78, Friday evening.

"Obviously, we are very disappointed," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We played well enough for about 37, 36 maybe 35 minutes to win the ball game, but it goes for 40. Florida State made plays when we didn't. They capitalized on our mistakes. We have to learn from it and get better. They are a good basketball team, but I was proud of the way we fought."

Despite trailing by nine points with 2:37 left on the clock, the Gators (3-2) turned in an 8-2 run to pull within four with 57.4 seconds left on the clock. Sha Brooks took the ball the length of the floor and just barely missed a fast break lay up attempt, but Sharielle Smith was there for the rebound and was fouled on the possession. Smith hit both of her free throws to pull the Gators to within two, 78-76, with 42 seconds remaining.

The Seminoles' Shante Williams sank a short jumper, and Florida answered when Dotson connected with Brittaney Thomas for two points with five seconds remaining. The Gators were forced to foul and FSU's Mara Freshour hit one of two free throws, leaving the Gators down three with under five seconds remaining. Bowden was forced to put up a 3-pointer that hit the rim and just missed.

Dotson, who posted her second straight double-double and third in four games, was joined in double figures by Brooks, who finished with 13 points, and Depree Bowden, who added 17 for the Gators. Florida shot 49.2-percent from the floor for the game, including draining 8-of-17 three-pointers.

FSU's Tanea Davis-Cain led all scorers with 27 points, hitting 5-of-10 from the three-point arc, while Jacinta Monroe added 14 points and Williams dropped in 11.

The Gators lost to Florida State (5-1) by 22 points in last year's meeting, but Butler, who is in her first year coaching Florida, did not find comfort in the closer outcome.

"Moral victories are something that exist in other competitions, but not in this one," Butler said. "We are not measured or rewarded by getting close, especially when we were in position to win. Should we be confident that we know we can beat good teams? No doubt about it. This is a game that we expected to win."

Florida outscored FSU 33-20 through the second portion of the first half. Dotson led the way for the Gators, dropping in 16 points. She also helped her own cause, pulling down six rebounds while going 4-of-7 from the line for the half.

After trading the lead in the early minutes, FSU jumped out to a 12-2 run before the Gators responded, going on a 12-2 run of their own to cause a six point swing and take the lead. The Seminoles took a three point lead with 7:15 remaining, but Lonnika Thompson found the answer for the Gators, draining a jumper to cut the lead to one.

Florida would find the basket seven more times over the course of the next 3:16, as the Gators took a seven-point lead. Two free throws by Dotson capped a 12-7 run for the Gators. FSU would make a final push at the end of the half, but Florida responded, taking a four-point lead into the half at 41-37.

## Game 7: Jacksonville 75, Florida 64

Nov. 28, 2007 \* Jacksonville, Fla. \* Veterans Memorial Arena

In a game that featured 22 lead changes and 14 tied scores, it was a 10-0 run by Jacksonville in the final five minutes of play that made the difference, as Florida lost 75-64 on Wednesday evening at the Veterans Memorial Arena.

In the first-ever meeting between the two programs separated by just 61 miles, the Gators (4-3) held a 55-53 lead with 6:17 remaining before Jacksonville (5-2) ripped off the game-deciding spree to take a 63-55 advantage with just under four minutes left.

Sha Brooks, who finished the game with 12 points and extended her consecutive made free throw streak to 17, converted a nifty three-point play that brought the deficit down to five, but JU's Virginia Gregoire answered with a trey to dampen any thoughts of a rally.

"The way we closed out the ballgame had everything to do with how badly Jacksonville wanted to beat us," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Jacksonville wanted to win more than we did. We showed spurts of fight, but they out-played us during crucial moments."

Marshae Dotson scored a game-high 18 points and collected six rebounds, six shy of her average entering the contest, as the Gators lost the rebounding battle for the first time this season, 33-30. Depree Bowden and Aneika Henry contributed 10 points each for Florida, which when 0-11 from the three-point arc, ending a streak of 215 consecutive games with at least one trey.

Regina Omoite scored a team-high 17 points and collected eight rebounds for Jacksonville, which won its 13th consecutive home game. Gregorie added 14 points, seven rebounds and three steals in a complete performance, while Lynsey Paschal tallied 10 points, hitting five-of-five from the floor.

The first half was played at a frenetic and sometimes sloppy pace, as the teams combined for 24 turnovers in the opening 20 minutes. The frame also featured two primary runs, one by each squad, that fittingly resulted in a one-point Florida lead, 31-30, at halftime. The period had nine lead changes and five tied scores.

The teams traded buckets early before the Dolphins used a mini 6-0 run that the Gators countered with 5-0 run sparked by Jennifer Mossor, who had been sidelined all season with a broken finger, entered the game at the 14:01 mark of the first half. She collected an offensive rebound, put back the miss, picked up a foul and hit the ensuing free throw to convert a three-point play with 12:14 remaining.

Florida's lead was short-lived, as JU used a 13-4 march to assume a 23-15 lead with 7:26 remaining in the half. That's when the Gators rallied, as Marshae Dotson scored six points during a 12-3 spree that gave UF a 27-26 advantage with just over four minutes left. The teams alternated buckets and leads during the closing minutes of half with the buzzer sounding just as a Dolphin layup missed the mark give Florida the lead entering the locker room.

## Game 8: #rv/rv Louisville 79, Florida 62 December 2, 2007 \* Louisville, Ky. \* Freedom Hall

Florida played its best first-half of basketball, taking a six-point halftime lead on the road at Louisville. The second half, however, belong to the Cardinals, who scored the first 19 points of the second half and outscored the Gators 18-8 in the final five and half minutes to take the 79-62 decision on Sunday afternoon at Freedom Hall.

Florida (4-4), which was playing its fourth game in eight days, began to rally after the Cardinal's second-half-opening stretch and dropped the deficit to seven points with over seven minutes to play. Louisville (4-2), however, looked like a team that was playing its first game after an eight-day rest, and denied the Gators their first road win of the season.

Marsha Dotson led nine different Gators who scored, as she posted her fourth double-double of the year and the 11th of her career with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Sha Brooks and Jennifer Mossor scored nine points each for Florida, which committed 31 turnovers and shot 34.3 percent (22-64) for the game, including 25.7 percent (9-35) in the deciding second half.

UL's Angel McCoughtry tallied 22 points with nine steals and eight rebounds, but it was Keshia Hines who garnered top scoring honors with 25 points and eight rebounds off the bench.

Louisville ripped out of the halftime locker room with an 19-0 run, quickly erasing UF's four-point lead to take a 51-38 advantage. Depree Bowden ended the drought with a deep two-point jumper with 13 minutes remaining, but the Cardinals followed with two more buckets and built a 55-40 cushion. Lonni Thompson stopped the run with a 3-pointer and put the Gators within 12.

The teams traded field goals for the next two minutes before Florida used a 7-0 run, as Marsha Dotson put back an offensive rebound, Brittaney Thomas collected steal and raced the length of the court for the layup and Sha Brooks nailed a 3-pointer in front of the Gator bench to bring Florida within seven points, 59-52, with just over seven minutes left.

UL's Keshia Hines hit a jumper to stop UF's run and Thomas answered with a bucket to keep the Gators within seven. After the teams exchanged points, the Cardinals started to take control with a 7-0 run of their own to take a 68-54 lead with just over five minutes left. During the run Florida turned the ball over three times and managed just one shot attempt, as Louisville turned up its defense and foul trouble put several starters on the bench for UF. That 7-0 run began the game-ending 18-8 march that put the game out of reach.

The first six minutes of the game could not have been any closer, with the teams traded shot for shot on each possession. The Cardinals struck first and the Gators responded to tie the score, as the pattern continued until Marsha Dotson hit a tough inside shot and Sha Brooks followed with a pair of free throws to give Florida its first lead of the game. Louisville answered with two buckets and claimed the two-point advantage. That's when Brooks drove the lane, was fouled and extended her made free throw streak while sparking a 6-0 run that gave UF a 14-10 lead. UL's Brandie Radde nailed a three-pointer, but Dotson countered with an old fashion 3-point play and Sharielle Smith followed with a pair from the charity stripe, as the Gators' lead grew to six, 19-13, with just under nine minutes remaining in the half. McCoughtry, who had six points to this stage of the game, started to heat up, scoring the next four points of the game and Radde added a trey to swing the lead back to the Cardinals. The teams traded field goals before Kim Critton skied for an offensive rebound, put back the miss while being fouled and converted the 3-point play to give UF a two-point lead. The teams again exchanged field goals over the next minute before Jennifer Mossor ended the Gator's cold spell from the 3-point arc by cannying one from the left side and ignite a 7-0 spurt and give UF a 33-26 lead with 2:22 remaining. McCoughtry prevented Florida from pulling away, scoring Louisville's final six points of the half, while Smith added a tough jumper in the lane and Mossor canned her second trey with 11 seconds left to give the Gators a 38-32 halftime lead.

## Game 9: Florida 78, Florida Gulf Coast 52 December 4, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Highlighted by a near triple-double by Sha Brooks and dominate inside play by Aneika Henry, Florida defeated Florida Gulf Coast, 78-52, on Tuesday night. Brooks finished the game with 10 points, as well as nine assists and seven rebounds, both career-highs. All 11 scholarship players scored, paced by Henry's game- and career-best 17 points, shooting a perfect 8-for-8 from the field while blocking three shots.

Depree Bowden and Sharielle Smith scored in double figures, adding 16 and 10 points, respectively, for the Gators, who improved to 5-1 at home this season. The victory also marked the Gator's 200th win against other teams from the state of Florida, as the team fields a 34-year record of 200-58 vs. Sunshine State foes.

Florida shot a season-best 68 percent (17-25) from the field in the second half, en route to hitting 31-of-54 field goals for a 57.4-percent field goal percentage for the game. The Gators also connected on 6-of-14 shots from behind the arc, paced by Bowden and Brooks, who sank two apiece.

"Our biggest focus tonight in every huddle was winning. We just wanted to win," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We told the team, 'we aren't going to talk about turnovers. We aren't going to talk about rebounds. We're not going to talk about missed shots or made shots. We're going to win,' and that's what we wanted to do. I think that you saw that in the way we handled ourselves defensively and with the confidence we had shooting the ball."

After a back and fourth opening to the second stanza, Florida closed the game on a 14-2 run, holding Florida Gulf Coast (2-4) to just two points for the final 5:13. A lay up by Henry off an assist from Brooks, followed by a Bowden steal that turned into three points from Brooks, led off the run for Florida. Ebonie Crawford capped the scoring for the Gators when she sank two free throws with 32 seconds remaining. The Eagles did not score their final two points of the evening until there was 15 seconds remaining in the game.

Florida Gulf Coast was led by Adrienne McNally, who scored 15 points for the Eagles, which shot 32.8 percent (19-58), including 15 percent (3-20) from the 3-point arc. Chelsea Dermeyer added another 14 points, while Delia De La Torre had 10.

The Gators took a 33-22 lead into the locker room thanks in large part to an 18-2 run that started with a Henry lay-up and was capped by another from Bowden. Florida led by just two at 15-13 with 9:53 remaining in the opening half before the run began. The Gators managed to rattle off eight straight points before FGCU could answer. Following a McNally jumper with 7:23 to go, the Gators scored 13 unanswered points to go up by 18 with three minutes left in the half.

Bowden led the Gators in the first stanza, dropping

## Game 10: Florida 80, TCU 76 (overtime)

December 16, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Led by 21 points from Depree Bowden's and a career-high 17 points from Jennifer Mossor, Florida defeated TCU in overtime, 80-76, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Sunday afternoon. The game featured 11 lead changes and 12 ties, including the 69-69 score at the end of regulation, before the Gators (6-4) came out on top during overtime.

"You don't win games against good teams in overtime unless you're tough," coach Amanda Butler said. "Our team was tough tonight and I am very proud of that."

Marsha Dotson scored six of her 18 points during the extra frame, when UF outscored the Lady Frogs, 11-7, to overcome an outstanding offensive show by senior Adrienne Ross, who scored a career-high 38 points, one shy of TCU's program record. Aneika Henry also stepped up big the Gators, scoring 12 points with eight rebounds and four blocks. Bowden pulled down a game-high nine boards, while Dotson collected eight and helped UF win the rebounding battle, 43-37.

Dotson started the overtime period hitting two free throws, before TCU (4-6) countered with a pair from the charity line from Ross. Henry then collected a loose ball in the paint and sank the short jumper with 2:46 left in overtime to give UF the 73-71 lead. Ross, however, canned her sixth three-pointer of the game that put TCU back in front, 74-73, with 1:52 on the clock.

That's when the Gators went on a 6-0 run, getting points from Mossor, Bowden and Dotson during the spree, as Dotson capped the march with a steal of an inbound play under the Gator basket and sank the layup that put UF ahead by five, 79-74, with 31 seconds remaining.

TCU missed on its next offensive possession and UF held the ball, but committed its 28th turnover of the game, giving the ball back to the Frogs, who tightened the score after Moneka Knight's uncontested layup cut the Gator lead to three, 79-76 with 11 seconds to go. Dotson hit one of two free throws to seal the win, as Florida improved to 6-1 at home this season.

Mossor surpassed her previous career high of 13 points thanks to stellar shooting from behind the arc. She drained 4-of-7 opportunities from three-point land and sank 6-of-12 shots from the field for her career day. Bowden, who hit all four of her free throws, sank five three-pointers to lead Florida, which shot 45 percent (27-60) from the field, including 44 percent (11-25) from behind the arc, where the Gators tied a program record with 11 treys.

The teams traded the lead for much of the second half, both holding a lead no greater than six points when Ross connected on a free throw with 12:06 remaining to cap an 8-2 run by the Frogs. Florida responded, going on a 9-2 run of its own, taking a one-point advantage with 9:12 on the clock. The remainder of the half featured two lead changes and four ties. Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) went to the line with 1:44 remaining and the game tied at 67-all, but missed the front-end of her one-and-one, snapping her career-long free throw streak at 25. Brooks, who ended the game with seven points and six assists, now sits just three points shy of the 1,000-career point milestone.

The Gators led by two points with 53 seconds left on the clock but a turnover followed by a lay-up from TCU's Lori Butler-Rayford tied the game with just 10 seconds remaining to send the game into overtime.

Florida took a 33-32 advantage into the locker room following the first half thanks to seven three-pointers. The Gators scored five of their first six buckets from behind the arc, accounting for 15 of their first 17 points. Mossor kicked off the scoring for the Gators, sinking the first of her three 3-pointers during Florida's first trip down the court. She finished the half with a team-leading nine points. Bowden also joined Mossor with nine points in the half. The Gators held their largest lead of the game at six points with 17:04 remaining on the clock thanks to a Bowden three pointer. TCU answered back, rattling off 11 straight points over the next five-plus minutes to take a 19-14 lead, before Mossor dropped in her second three-pointer of the half to cut the lead to 17-17. Following four unanswered points for TCU, the Gators responded with a 6-0 run to tie the game at 23.

## Game 11: Florida 83, Saint Louis 77

December 22, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Depree Bowden tied her season-high with 23 points and Sha Brooks collected her 1,000th career point in Florida's 83-77 victory over Saint Louis on Saturday at the O'Connell Center. The Gators (7-4), who suited up just eight scholarship players because of injuries and illnesses, enter the holiday break on a three-game win streak, the program's longest since the 2005-06 season.

"I am really proud of our effort today. We had a short bench and everyone stepped up and contributed in the win," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "All eight of our players who played scored and everyone was on the court for double-figure minutes. We've had two very good weeks of practice and it showed today. We had some key transition baskets late in the game, got some steals and conversions; and our conditioning and fitness was a big reason why."

Florida also was clutch from the free throw line, hitting 12-of-14 in the final three minutes, including 6-of-8 in the final minute to preserve the win, as the Gators to 7-1 at home this season.

Brooks became the 19th Gator to score 1,000 points during her career, nailing a three-pointer from the right side of the arc that put her over the top of the milestone with five minutes remaining in the contest. Brooks missed her first eight shots from the floor and didn't score until a free throw with 5:24 remaining, but ended with 12 points as she canned 7-of-8 from the charity stripe in the waning minutes, while collecting four steals and dishing two assists. She eclipsed the mark in her 72nd career game, the seventh fastest in program history.

Bowden had another complete performance in the win, adding seven rebounds, a career-tying six assists and four steals while converting 5-of-5 from the free throw line in her 23-point showing. Marsha Dotson joined Brooks and Bowden with a double-figure scoring effort, contributing 15 points, nine rebounds and five assists while battling foul trouble most of the game, picking up her fourth personal with 10:10 remaining. Dotson's fellow healthy post players, Aneika Henry, who finished with eight points and five rebounds, and Sharielle Smith, who tallied six points and six boards, also found themselves in foul trouble, which forced the Gators to look to 5-foot-7 Kim Critton to play the '4' position. Critton more than held her own in the paint, where she scored a season-high eight points with six rebounds in 21 minutes of action.

With Florida holding a 49-35 lead and just over 18 minutes remaining, Saint Louis (4-8) began to heat up offensively thanks to a career performance from sophomore Theresa Lisch, who tied the Billikens' game record with 35 points. Lisch scored eight points during a 16-4 run that cut the Gator lead to two, 53-51, with 12:31 left. Dotson countered by scoring five points in Florida's 10-1 spree that returned its lead to double-figures, 63-52, with 9:14 on the clock, as Bowden and Lonnik Thompson (New Orleans) also contributed during the run. SLU scored the next five points of the game and closed within seven at the 8:24 mark before both teams when cold from the floor. The next points scored were from Brooks, who hit one of two free throws with 5:24 left to bring her career point total to 998, before she followed with the trey 24 seconds later that pushed her over the 1,000-point plateau and return UF's lead to 11.

The first four and half minutes were tight, with both teams making mini runs before the other answered. With Florida leading, 11-10, Bowden's three-pointer from the left side of the arc sparked a 14-4 run over the next six-plus minutes, when the Gators built a 25-14 lead. Five different players contributed in the spree, with Brittaney Thomas, Sharielle Smith, Aneika Henry and Dotson also hitting field goals. The Billikens dropped Florida's lead to six points three different times, even reducing it to five points, 32-27, with just over four minutes remaining in the period. Bowden again stepped up and ignited a Gator run, connecting on a three-point play that sparked a 12-3 march to end the half with Florida owning a 44-31 lead entering the locker room. Bowden capped the period nailing a trey at the buzzer to end the half with 17 points on 5-of-8 shooting from the field, including a 4-of-6 effort from long range.

## Game 12: Florida 66, Holy Cross 52

Depree Bowden and junior Sha Brooks scored 15 points apiece leading a balanced offense in Florida's 66-52 victory over Holy Cross in the first round of the 17th Annual State Farm Classic on Friday at the O'Connell Center.

The Gators (8-4) will play Alabama A&M in the championship game on Saturday beginning at 7 p.m. The Bulldogs (2-6) defeated UNC Asheville, 66-63, in their opening round game, jumping out to a 15-point lead before staving off a furious rally to capture the three-point victory. Holy Cross (4-7) and Asheville (7-6) meet in the consolation game beginning at 4:30 p.m.

Florida has reached the State Farm Classic championship game all 17 times the event has been played, winning the title 13 times.

In Friday's win, four Gators tallied a double-figure scoring effort en route to the team's fourth consecutive victory. Junior Marshae Dotson and sophomore Sharielle Smith joined Bowden and Brooks by contributing 12 and 11 points, respectively.

Brooks and junior Aneika Henry collected eight rebounds each, while Bowden added seven and Lonnika Thompson snared a career-high six, as Florida also won the battle in the paint, out-rebounding Holy Cross, 48-33, and dominating the offensive glass, 20-5.

Bethany O'Dell was Holy Cross' lone player in double-figures, netting 12 points.

After building a 39-21 halftime advantage, Florida's largest lead at intermission this season, the Crusaders used an 11-6 run early the second half and shaved their deficit to eight points, 44-36, with 14:53 remaining.

The Gators, however, countered with key shots and apply defensive pressure, staging a 19-5 run over the next nine-plus minutes to take a 63-41 lead and put the game out of reach. Dotson started the spree with a power layin in the paint and Brittaney Thomas (Montgomery, Ala.) answered a Crusader bucket with a slashing layup of her own, as Brooks, Smith, Bowden and Thompson all contributed during the game-changing run.

"Holy Cross was in the NCAA Tournament a year ago, and anytime you can beat a team of that caliber, it has got to be a confidence builder for you team," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "They have a fantastic coach who has been there a long time, and beating a quality team like the one we faced tonight has got to be a good thing for our club. Anytime you can out rebound a team by 15, especially on the offensive end, you have to be proud as a coach."

In the opening half, Bowden led all scorers as the only player in double-figures, registering 12 points on 4-of-9 shooting and six rebounds. Florida wrapped the first frame with a 16-6 run, highlighted by a pair of three-pointers from Smith.

## Game 13: Florida 70, Alabama A&M 49 (State Farm Classic - Championship)

Dec. 29, 2007 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Marshae Dotson tied her career high with 26 points and added a team-high 10 rebounds to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 70-49 win over Alabama A&M in the championship game of the 2007 State Farm Classic.

Combined with her 12-point, four-rebound effort on Friday night, Dotson's play on Saturday earned her State Farm Classic Most Valuable Player honors. She is the ninth different Florida player to earn the distinction in the 17-year history of the tournament, and the first to do so since Bernice Mosby won the second of her back-to-back awards in 2004. Dotson was joined on the all-tournament team by senior guard Depree Bowden, both of whom garnered the first all-tournament selections of their Florida careers.

Saturday's victory was Florida's fifth in a row, marking its first five-game winning streak since the 2005-06 season. The Gators (9-4) also picked up their ninth win of the season, equaling their win total from the entire 2006-07 season, which saw them post a mark of 9-22. The win also gave UF the State Farm Classic title for the 14th time in the event's 17 years, and its third in the last four editions of the event.

"We won a championship, that was our goal and that was what we set out to do," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "Since I became the head coach here and this became my team, we've talked about generating championship expectations. We've practiced and trained with those expectations, and to have an opportunity to win a championship on our home floor, in front of our home fans, was big for us, and I'm proud that we were able to do that."

Dotson, who tied the career high that she set against Auburn on Jan. 18, 2007, earned her fifth double-double of the season and 12th of her career - both team highs. She was joined in double figures by sophomore forward Sharielle Smith, whose 10 points marked the fifth time this season in which she's reached double digits in the scoring column.

Dotson also hit 8-of-9 free throws on the night, matching the career high that she has posted twice during her tenure as a Gator.

Florida began to pull away near the midway point of the second half, getting five-straight points from Dotson to open up a 14-point margin, 49-35, with just over 12 minutes left in regulation. Florida's lead stretched to 21 points at 59-38 on a three-point play by sophomore guard Brittaney Thomas with 8:01 to play, and sophomore guard Jennifer Mossor came up with another three-point play exactly four minutes later to run the lead to 64-40.

Florida outscored the Bulldogs (2-7) by a count of 30-16 in the final 14 minutes of the game, rattling off separate runs of 9-0 and 8-0 during that time frame.

UF came racing out of the gate to open the game, building an 8-0 lead in the opening minutes and seeing its advantage increase to 13 with just over nine minutes left to play in the first half. Alabama A&M managed to cut the lead to three points on two occasions, but timely buckets from junior center Aneika Henry and Thomas allowed Florida to claim a 32-27 edge at the break.

The catalyst of the Gators' offense throughout the night, Dotson poured in 15 first-half points on 5-of-7 shooting from the field and a 5-of-6 effort from the free throw line.

Rebekkah Barnes led Alabama A&M with 11 points on the night, hitting 4-of-9 shots from the field for a Bulldogs squad that shot only 28.1 percent on the night. Alexis Faulk hauled in 10 rebounds to tie Dotson for the game high, and Christian Malone chipped in four assists to lead AAMU.

## Game 14: Florida 71, Florida A&M 51

January 2, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Aneika Henry grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds and blocked a personal-best six shots to lead a defensive charge that sparked the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 71-51 win over Florida A&M at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Wednesday evening.

Henry's 15 boards led a Florida (10-4) effort that hauled in a season-high 55 in the contest and won the rebounding battle by a 55-34 margin. She was also a force in the middle, blocking six of the Gators' season-high seven shots. The Gators also forced 21 turnovers and limited FAMU (9-2) to just 32.5 percent (20-61) shooting from the field on the night. The Gators' +21 rebounding margin was its largest since Dec. 14, 2003, when they out-rebounded UC-Santa Barbara by a spread of 25 boards.

"When you dominate a category as important as rebounding, it's a good indication that you were the more aggressive team," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "In the first half, shots weren't falling, but we were chasing them down and giving ourselves second-chance opportunities.

"When Aneika cleans the glass and owns the paint like that, it allows us to be more aggressive on the perimeter," Butler continued. "I'm proud of the fact that not only was this a team-win, but we also had individuals step up and play great games."

Senior Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) led the scoring attack with a season-high 24 points — four shy of her career high — that featured a 6-of-11 clip from behind the three-point arc. Sophomore forward Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) chipped in with a career high-tying 14 points to reach double figures for the third consecutive game, while sophomore guard Brittaney Thomas (Montgomery, Ala.) went for 10 to give UF three players in double digits.

Junior guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) directed Florida's offense to the tune of a game-high six assists, while also adding three steals.

The victory gave UF 10 wins on the season, eclipsing its win total from the entire 2006-07 campaign, when it posted a 9-22 record. It also marked the 50th head coaching win of Butler's career, as the first-year Florida leader has compiled a 50-26 ledger in just over two seasons on the sidelines.

The Gators reeled off the first 11 points of the second half, powered by six from sophomore guard Lonnika Thompson (New Orleans, La.), to open up a quick 40-25 lead. Florida's lead dipped to 10 points on two occasions near the midway point of the half, but Bowden answered both times with a three-point field goal to help the Orange and Blue maintain a double-digit lead for the remainder of the game en route to their sixth consecutive victory.

UF entered the locker room with a 29-25 halftime lead after forcing Florida A&M to shoot just 30.3 percent from the field, while also out-rebounding the Lady Rattlers by a count of 33-19, in the opening frame. Henry pulled down 10 rebounds, equalling her single-game career high, and swatted three shots in the first half to lead the defensive effort.

Down 11-7 with just over 12 minutes left in the first half, the Gators embarked on an 11-0 run, during which Bowden poured in nine of her dozen first-half points, to grab an 18-11 advantage. FAMU narrowed the gap to two at 23-21, but six-straight Florida points moved the lead back to eight, 29-21, before the Lady Rattlers collected the final four points of the frame.

Junior guard Stephanie Foster led FAMU with 16 points on 7-of-18 shooting, while senior guard Q'Vaunda Curry and junior forward Denise Tate shared the team lead with seven rebounds apiece. Junior guard Evette Young dished out five assists to pace the Lady Rattlers.

## Game 15: Florida 68, Temple 54

January 5, 2008 \* Philadelphia, Pa. \* Liacouras Center

Sha Brooks scored a season-high 23 points leading the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 68-54 victory over Temple on Saturday afternoon at the Liacouras Center.

The outcome marked the Gator's seventh consecutive victory, as Florida closed its non-conference slate with an 11-4 record. Absent from the Gator sideline on Saturday was head coach Amanda Butler, who was tending to a family emergency. Assistant coach Susie Gardner assumed Butler's duties on the bench.

The Gators rallied for their coach, sprinting out of the gate with an 11-1 run in the first four minutes, as Brooks, Depree Bowden, Marsha Dotson and Lonnika Thompson all chipped in during the offensive spurt. After a 2-plus minute scoring drought, Brooks sank a pair of free throws and extended Florida's game-opening run to 13-1.

"We thought it was important to keep our winning streak intact and our confidence level high entering SEC play," Gardner said. "Our run to start the game reflected that confidence and that was a key for us today."

Temple (7-9) finally found its stroke, as Lady Comfort put back an offensive rebound and Lindsay Kimmel canned a three-pointer to pull the Owls within seven. Florida, however, countered with a 15-4 run with Bowden ending the march with a trey to put the Gators ahead, 28-10, with 6:37 remaining in the opening frame.

With Florida holding a 16-point advantage with just under two minutes remaining until half-time, Temple out-scored the Gators 17-10 and closed the period with five straight points, including an offensive put-back at the buzzer, cutting UF's lead to 11 at the break.

The Owls scored quickly to begin the second half and were within single digits at 38-29, before Dotson answered just as fast and ignited an 11-2 run that drove the lead back to 18 points, 49-31. Dotson and Bowden scored four points apiece during the spurt and Sharielle Smith nailed a three-pointer. After trading scores, Temple tried to rally with Shaqwedra Wallace and LaKeisha Eaddy converting back-to-back three-point plays in a 15-second span to grab the momentum and cut UF's lead to 12 points, 51-39, with 13:14 remaining.

Jennifer Mossor and Brooks responded with buckets of their own for Florida, whose lead returned to 16 points with just over 10 minutes left. The teams exchanged equal scores over the next six-plus minutes, as the Gator lead alternated between 14 and 16 points.

Brooks ended the trend with a back-breaking three-pointer, that bounced high off the rim before dropping through, and Florida assumed a 64-47 lead with 3:25 on the clock and Temple never threatened again. While her trey was key, a crucial portion of Brooks' offense came from the free throw line, where she equaled the Gator efficiency record by hitting 10-of-10.

"Coach (Brenda) Kirkpatrick, who scouted the game for us, watched film with Sha this morning before the game and challenged her not to settle for the three-point shot," Gardner said. "Sha drove to the basket and got herself to the free throw line. She leads the SEC in free throw percentage and we want her to get there as much as she can."

Joining Brooks with a double-figure scoring effort were Dotson, who powered up 16 points along with nine rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a pair of steals, as well as Bowden, who added 12 points, and Smith, who contributed 11 points and seven boards.

"We know Coach Butler is going through a difficult time right now and it was important for us to step up for her," Bowden shared. "We've faced adversity before this season and not having her with us was another, but our coaches prepared us and Coach Gardner kept reminding us how important it was to play hard for Coach Butler."

## Game 16: Kentucky 60, Florida 58

January 10, 2008 \* Lexington, Ky. \* Memorial Coliseum

Marshae Dotson tied her career-high of 26 points, snared a game-high 12 rebounds and was involved in two crucial plays in the final six seconds of Florida's tough 60-58 loss to Kentucky.

Florida (11-5) had two offensive possessions with under seven seconds remaining, but both opportunities went awry and the Wildcats (7-8) managed to snap the Gator's seven-game win streak and earn the victory in both teams' Southeastern Conference opener.

"We're disappointed in the outcome but at the same time, it's a road game and you don't expect the ball to bounce your way or decisions to be made in your favor, especially when they're in the heat of the moment," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We have to control the things we can control. We missed some free throws, we started slow, we didn't score enough points, we didn't play Florida Basketball and you have to credit Kentucky for that."

The usually accurate Gators hit just 13-of-20 from the free throw line for 65 percent during the game, while committing 24 turnovers.

Florida was aggressive out of the locker room and quickly eliminated a five-point deficit, as Dotson converted a feed inside from Lonnika Thompson to start a 7-2 run that tied the game at 32-all after Sha Brooks' 3-pointer from the left corner.

The Gators had a couple chances to take the lead, but couldn't get a shot to fall, as UK tallied the next four points. UF came right back with four straight points after Sharielle Smith took a dish from Dotson in the paint before Dotson, herself, connected on an acrobatic layin and the game was tied at 36 with 15:43 to go. Brooks then sank one free throw to give the Gators their first lead since three minutes into the game.

The lead was short lived, as Samantha Mahoney drove the lane for a short jumper before Smith added one free throw to tie the game at 38. Chelsea Chowning nailed a three-point for UK and sparked a 7-0 run, as the Wildcats led 45-38 with 11:26 remaining.

The Gators came right back after Jennifer Mossor's jumper ignited a 7-0 run, as Dotson converted a three-point play and came up with a steal on UK's ensuing possession, driving the length of the court for the layup to tie the game at 45-all with 10:12 on the clock.

The game was tied twice more over the next three-plus minutes, the last time after Smith nailed a three-pointer from the right corner with 6:42 remaining. UK hit the next bucket and Chowning again came up with a huge three-pointer, extending the Wildcat lead to five, 55-50, with 5:10 left in the game.

The teams exchanged buckets and the Gators found their way to the free throw line, but had trouble sinking both, coming away with one each from Depree Bowden and Dotson, as UF whittled the lead down to three, 57-54, with just under two minutes remaining. Mahoney countered with a field goal that swelled the lead back to five with 1:32 to play. Dotson came right back, found her way to the line and made both with 1:15 left in the game, before she followed that with a slashing drive with 50 seconds left and the Gators were within one point, 59-58.

After a strong defensive stand where the Gator forced a shot-clock violation, Florida held the ball and placed it in Dotson's hands, where she when high for a pass but came down and fell to the floor, where the Wildcats took the ball away and called a timeout with 6.4 seconds left.

Florida stole the ball in the inbound pass and fed Dotson, but she was called for an offensive charge with 2.3 seconds remaining. Chowning made one free throw and intentionally missed the second with under two seconds remaining, as UF was unable to go the length of the court for a chance to tie or win the game.

## Game 17: Florida 80, Alabama 65

January 13, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Depree Bowden scored 18 points and Marshae Dotson added 17 to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team to an 80-65 victory over Alabama on Sunday afternoon in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

On a day when the Gator's welcomed back the program's alumnae, Florida notched its eighth consecutive home victory, tying for the fifth longest home win streak in program history. More importantly, however, the win was the team's first Southeastern Conference victory, as the Gators improved to 12-5 overall and 1-1 in league play. Alabama fell to 8-9 overall, 1-1 in the SEC.

"It was crucial for us to begin our home SEC season with a win, you have to defend your own court," said UF head coach Amanda Butler, whose team improved to 11-1 overall at home this year. "In terms of confidence, our team did a great job of not looking for excuses, but being accountable and looking for a way to get better after a tough loss at Kentucky. Anytime you can beat an SEC opponent in double figures you've got to be proud, regardless of the circumstances or anything else surrounding it."

Sunday's 15-point victory was Florida's largest in an SEC regular-season game since its 63-48 win over Mississippi State on February 9, 2006 in Starkville.

Three of the four Gators who scored in double-figures were post players, as Florida outscored Alabama 46-24 in the paint. Joining Bowden and Dotson on the scoreboard were junior center Aneika Henry, who hit 7-of-11 shots in her 14-point performance, and sophomore forward Sharielle Smith, who added 10 points on 5-of-8 shooting, as the Gators hit 56.6 percent of their shots, their second-highest percentage this season.

Dotson and Smith each collected six rebounds, while Bowden swiped a game-high five steals. Junior guard Sha Brooks turned in another solid performance, scoring eight points with six assists and a steal in 31 minutes of action.

"We wanted the ball in the paint," Butler said. "Aneika (Henry) did an excellent job getting the ball down low and scoring points. She played today like she was going to catch any ball that was thrown to her down low."

The Gators opened the second half with a 7-3 run, taking a 13-point, 49-36 advantage with 17:12 on the clock. The teams traded buckets for the next five minutes, but Alabama was able to cut the lead to eight points after a three-pointer from Dedrea Magee with 10:07 remaining.

## Game 18: Florida 92, Arkansas 74 January 20, 2008 \* Fayetteville, Ark. \* Bud Walton Arena

Jennifer Mossor scored a career-high 19 points and led a balanced scoring effort in Florida's 92-74 victory over Arkansas on Sunday afternoon at Bud Walton Arena.

The win, which was the first time since early February 2006 the Gators (13-5, 2-1 SEC) have won back-to-back regular-season Southeastern Conference games, was Florida's first in Fayetteville since January 6, 2005, when the Gators topped the Lady Razorbacks 68-56.

"I was really pleased with this win for several different reasons," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "It was a win on the road in the SEC and it was a great team win. One area that we've really wanted to emphasize was our bench and Jenn responded to that call and had a career night. She did it in aggressive fashion and a lot of her points came from the plays she made on defense. Jenn led us in that regard. We had great overall play from a lot of different people."

Mossor, who hit 6-of-11 shots from the field, including 3-of-4 from behind the arc and tied her career-high of five assists, took game scoring honors while helping Florida's bench outscore Arkansas', 39-14.

Marshae Dotson logged her eighth double-double of the season and the 14th of her career, as she recorded 15 points and 13 rebounds, hitting 6-of-10 from the floor while dishing three assists. Sha Brooks, who had a chance to play in front of several family members, scored 17 points, nailing four three-pointers, with six rebounds, while Depree Bowden added 15 points and five boards, as Florida also out-rebounded Arkansas, 46-34.

Sophomore Sharielle Smith also proved herself inside, scoring eight points with six boards, as she hit all six of her free throw attempts, as the Gators nailed 16-of-19 from the charity stripe.

Florida used three primary runs during the game, but it was its final one that proved the difference. With Arkansas (16-3, 1-3 SEC) whittling Florida's lead down to six points, 61-55, with 11:14 remaining, the Gators exploded on a 16-0 run to take a commanding 77-55 lead and never looked back en route to the important SEC road win.

Dotson started the game-deciding spree by powering back an offensive rebound. Brittaney Thomas the drove the paint for a quick bucket and dished a nice pass to Bowden, who followed with a three-pointer. Aneika Henry then hit a short jumper in the paint, before she blocked a shot that Mossor corralled and threw half the court to a sprinting Dotson, who completed the impressive hustle play.

While Florida scored 42 of its points in the paint, the Gators did tie a season-high by sinking 10 three-pointers, also tying the program record for treys in an SEC game. UF hit 10-of-21 attempts from long range, while canning 45.2 percent (33-73) overall.

Arkansas also had a balanced scoring effort, with Whitney Jones' 16 points leading five players in double figures, as the Lady Razorbacks hit 43.5 percent (30-69) from the field while committing 18 turnovers that the Gators converted into 27 points.

Florida's 92 points were its most in an SEC regular-season game since a 95-93 overtime win against Tennessee in Knoxville on February 26, 2006.

Holding a 31-28 advantage with 3:12 remaining in the first half, the Gators went on a 14-6 spree to end the period, as Bowden began the run converting a nice feed in the paint from Dotson. Mossor followed with a steal and drove the length of the court for a layup, before freshman Ebonie Crawford canned her first field goal in SEC action that gave UF a 37-28 lead. The teams traded scores before UF's final two field goals were 3-pointers, one from Mossor and the other from Bowden, whose closed the half with eight seconds remaining and gave the Gators a 45-34 halftime lead.

## Game 19: #17/14 Georgia 82, Florida 55 January 24, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Sophomore guard Brittaney Thomas (Montgomery, Ala.) netted a career-high 18 points on Thursday night, but the University of Florida women's basketball team dropped an 82-55 decision to No. 17/14 Georgia at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Thomas' career-best output came on 7-of-11 shooting from the floor, eclipsing the 17-point effort during the season-opening win over Xavier. Her 18 points sparked the Gators to a 34-15 advantage in points off the bench, but that was one of the few areas Florida (13-6, 2-2 SEC) carried an edge.

With Florida trailing just 8-6 after a Thomas lay-up at the 14:29 mark of the opening half, Georgia's Megan Darrah answered quickly with a three-pointer and ignited a 20-2 run over the ensuing nine-plus minutes that pushed the lead to 28-8 and the Gators never recovered.

"In the SEC, you're playing against the some of the best teams and players in the nation," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "If you don't come out and throw the first punch, you'll find yourself laying flat on your back. That's what happened to us tonight. You can't dig a hole for yourself against a team that talented and expect to come back from that deficit."

Junior forward Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) pulled down a team-high eight rebounds and added seven points, while junior center Aneika Henry (Coconut Grove, Fla.) recorded seven boards in the contest, as Florida lost the rebounding battle, 47-32, in its largest deficit of the season.

Junior guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) connected from beyond the arc with just over 13 minutes left in the second half to bring her total of three-point field goals to 142 as a Gator, tying Dana Smith (1994-98) for third on the Florida career list.

UF was carried by its bench in the opening frame, as the Gators' reserves outscored Georgia's bench by a 15-7 margin. Thomas led the way with 11 first-half points on 4-of-5 shooting from the floor. Florida also forced 10 UGA turnovers in the first half, converting them into eight points, but the Bulldogs rode a 50 percent shooting performance to a 43-21 halftime lead.

Sophomore guard Ashley Houts scored a career-high 25 points to pace Georgia (16-3, 3-2 SEC), while senior forward Tasha Humphrey chipped in with 23 points and a team-high eight boards. Houts also dished out a game-high six assists for the Bulldogs, who presented their Andy Landers with his 700th win as Georgia's head coach.

## Game 20: Florida 60, South Carolina 57 January 27, 2008 \* Columbia, S.C. \* Colonial Center

Florida built a 17-point lead early in the second half and withstood a furious rally to secure the thrilling 60-57 victory over South Carolina on Sunday afternoon at the Colonial Center. Sharielle Smith scored 17 of her career-high 18 points in the first half, while helping the Gators assemble a 33-20 halftime lead. After UF scored the first four points of the second half, the Gamecocks staged a 13-0 run to get within four points and the final 14 minutes of the contest saw the Gator's lead challenged, as USC got with one point, 53-52, with 4:25 to play, but never erased. USC's Jordan Jones hit what would have been the game-tying three-pointer, but the final horned had sounded just moments before the ball left her hand, as UF earned its first win against the Gamecocks in Columbia since January 16, 2005, when the Gators earned the 67-57 victory.

Florida was out-rebounded 48-36, allowing 21 offensive rebounds, but Marsha Dotson, who finished with 16 points on 6-of-7 shooting and seven rebounds, secured the Gator's most important rebound late, corralling one on the defensive end with under 10 seconds remaining after South Carolina had crashed the boards trying for a bucket to tie the game. Dotson hit one of two free throws to give Florida a 60-57 lead, before Jordan Jones' final shot came after the final buzzer. UF made just 11-of-21 free throws, including just 3-of-8 in the final three minutes, well below the team's 71 percent average it sported entering the game. The Gators shot 40.4 percent (23-57) overall from the floor during the game, but 32.3 percent (10-31) in the final 20 minutes when UF hit 42.9 percent, compared with its 21.9 percent (7-32) effort in the opening frame.

Bowden, who ended the game 11 points and six boards, scored the first four points of the second half to extend Florida's lead to 17 points, 37-20, before South Carolina stormed back with a 13-0 run in just under three minutes, as the Gator advantage evaporated to four points, 37-33, with 14:16 on the clock. Sha Brooks halted the run with a driving layup and followed in the next possession with one free throw to bring UF's lead back to seven, 40-33, with 13:42 remaining. USC's Demetress Adams followed with a short jumper and was fouled, but couldn't complete the three-point play, as the Gator lead stood at five points, 40-35. Jennifer Mossor then connected on an 8-footer in the paint and brought the lead back to seven with just under 13 minutes to play.

Four straight points from the home team cut UF's advantage to three, 42-39, but Brooks hit a 9-footer, before Iona Burgrova hit two from the free throw line with 11:02 on the clock and the Gators holding a three-point lead, 44-41. Dotson came alive in the paint, scoring the next six points of the game in a 45-second span to increase UF's lead to nine, 50-41, with 10 minutes to go. USC refused to fold and scored four straight points to get within five. Dotson followed with a three-point play and put UF ahead eight, with 9:06 remaining, but the Gamecocks continued their run by using a 7-0 march over the next two-plus minutes and were within one point, 53-52, with 4:23 left in regulation. Bowden ended the spree with a sweet floater in the lane and Dotson converted a pair from the stripe to build the lead back to five, 57-52, with 3:36 remaining. Ebony Jones sank two from the line for USC, before Aneika Henry hit one to swell the back to four points, 58-54, with 2:30 on the clock. The cold streak for both teams continued, as Sharielle Smith added to UF's lead with one free throw at the 1:05 mark, giving the Gators a 59-54 spread. Ebony Jones ended the dry spell by coolly nailing a three-pointer in front the Gamecock bench and brought USC within two points, 59-57, with 53 seconds remaining. Florida then turned the ball over for the 15th time in the game and USC collected the errant pass and called a timeout with 23.4 seconds on the clock.

Ebony Jones had an open look at a three and missed it, however scooped up the loose ball and put up a short jumper that also fell off the rim. Dotson skied for the rebound and came up with the ball as she was fouled. She made one of two free throws with 8 seconds remaining to give Florida a three-point margin, 60-57. UF's defensive pressure slowed USC coming up the floor and Jordan Jones was forced to launch a three-pointer that actually fell, but just moments after the final horn sounded.

## Game 21: Vanderbilt 66, Florida 56 January 31, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) scored 12 of her 16 points in the first half to lead an offensive attack that shot 42.6 percent from the field on Thursday night, but the University of Florida women's basketball team could not overcome a strong start by Vanderbilt and dropped a 66-56 decision at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Dotson hit 6-of-11 shots from the floor and collected half a dozen rebounds on the night to reach double digits for the second game in a row. Sophomore forward Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) added nine points and junior guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) had eight for the Gators, who turned in their best shooting performance in nearly two weeks, hitting 42.6 percent (20-47) against the taller Commodores, who converted 42.2 percent (27-64).

"We got beat by a very good team tonight," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "There are obvious statistical things that we didn't do, but I don't think that's why we didn't give Vanderbilt our best shot. We have to believe that we can beat some of the teams that are at the top of our league because we're talented enough, we're deep enough and we work exceptionally hard in practice."

The Gators (14-7, 3-3 SEC) opened the second half with a 5-0 run to tie the score at 30-30 with less than 16 minutes remaining on the clock, but VU responded with a 6-0 spurt of its own to extend its lead to 36-30 before Florida called for timeout. A three-point field goal by sophomore forward Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) and a buckets by Dotson and sophomore guard Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) yet again brought the Gators within a point, 38-37, but the momentum was snuffed out by an 11-2 Commodores' run.

Mossor and junior guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) combined to score seven straight points after a Florida timeout, narrowing the margin to 51-46 before a media timeout at the 7:11 mark. The Gators, however, would get no closer, as Vanderbilt shot nearly 47 percent in the second half to pull away for the 66-56 win.

Florida also struggled from the free throw line, hitting just 14-of-25 in the game, while finishing 2-of-18 from the three-point arc, where Vanderbilt canned 6-of-12 from long range, seemingly hitting a big outside shot every time the Gators made a run.

UF (15-6, 4-2 SEC) forced 12 Vanderbilt turnovers and limited the Commodores to 37.5 percent shooting in the first half, heading into the break down by a count of just 30-25. Smith and senior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) scored six points apiece to lead the Orange and Blue, which converted on 40 percent of its attempts from the floor in the opening 20 minutes.

Down by as many as 14 after misfiring on six of their first seven shots, the Gators put together an 11-0 run to cut Vanderbilt's lead to two points, 23-21, with just over four minutes left in the opening frame. After the Commodores reopened a 30-23 advantage, Dotson found space in the paint off of an inbounds play and connected on a layup to send UF into the break down just five.

Dotson ignited the Gators' 11-0, which was their longest of the season, with a layup at the 8:37 mark of the first stanza.

Liz Sherwood led the 'Dores with 20 points and a dozen rebounds, while Jessica Mooney chipped in with 16 points and three assists.

"Florida did a great job of pressuring our guards," Vanderbilt head coach Melanie Balcomb said. "They forced us into a lot of turnovers before halftime, but we were able to cut them down in the second half. They played man, but they would counter with zone or press and take us out of our rhythm."

## Game 22: #8 LSU 85, Florida 71

February 3, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) turned in a game-high 20 points and 14 rebounds, but No. 8 LSU maintained a double-digit first-half lead to defeat the University of Florida women's basketball team, 85-71, on Sunday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

"I am very proud of our effort today," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "Don't misunderstand me when I say that I am very proud of our effort because this was in no way a moral victory because we didn't get blown out or something like that. We played a very good team and woke up and realized how good of a team we were in the second half and that showed up in our effort with our passion and our energy. We had tremendous leadership from our upperclassmen."

Four Gator starters posted double figures, including Dotson, who registered her eighth double-double of the season and finished six points shy of a career high. Dotson, who trailed only LSU's Sylvia Fowles in rebounds in SEC games, pulled down a game-high 14 boards, marking her highest output since registering 15 versus Florida State on Nov. 23.

Dotson finished 6-of-15 from the field and 8-of-10 at the free-throw line. The junior is 14 points shy of becoming the 20th Gator to reach the 1,000-point milestone.

"We had tremendous leadership from our upperclassmen. We had kids that were not backing down from significant challenges," Butler said. "On the top of the list is Marshae Dotson with a double-double against one of the best post players in the country if not the best (Sylvia Fowles). So, I am exceptionally proud. I think we leave here today a more confident team about the level we can compete at, but we are in no way satisfied because we came up short."

Senior guard Depree Bowden chipped in 15 points, and junior guard Sha Brooks added 12 points. Florida shot 38 percent from the field on 21-of-55 shooting, while LSU (18-3, 7-0 SEC) finished 46 percent from the field after connecting on nearly 60 percent of its shots in the first half.

Florida (14-8, 3-4 SEC) did out-rebound the SEC's second-leading rebounding team, 39-36, and the Gators managed to make a season-high 24 free throws on 28 attempts for 86 percent. Florida's 71 points also is the second most allowed by LSU this season, with only Maryland's 75-point effort greater.

LSU built a 12-1 lead in the first four minutes as the Gators missed their first four shots from the field. Sophomore guard Jennifer Mosser buried a 3-pointer at the 15:36 mark in the first half to break the dry spell, and UF reeled off five straight points to cut the deficit to 15-11 with 13:31 remaining. The Tigers put together a 7-0 spurt in the next four minutes, but the Gators hung tough on back-to-back buckets from sophomore forward Sharielle Smith and Dotson to pull within eight at the 7:38 point in the first half.

However, LSU took control of the game in the final 10 minutes of the first half to take a 45-28 lead at halftime. Florida shot only 35 percent from the field, while the Tigers took advantage of their 3-point strength with a 6-of-13 effort, into the locker room.

Florida trimmed the lead under 20 points with 8-4 run of its own that started at the 7:10 mark in the second half. Brooks and sophomore guard Lonnika Thompson (New Orleans, La.) buried consecutive 3-point shots, and the Gators turned up their defensive pressure that forced LSU into a couple of turnovers. For Brooks, it marked the 143rd made 3-pointer of her career moving her into sole possession of third place on UF's all-time career list.

A jumper by Bowden and a free throw from Dotson at the 4:37 mark brought Florida within 16 points, 74-58, forcing LSU to make a four-player substitution as the Gators inched closer. The teams traded points and even got within 15 with 2:47 to go, and then cut the deficit to 14 twice in the final minute, but LSU's first-half margin was too much to overcome despite Florida's hard-fought second-half effort when the Gators out-scored the Lady Tigers, 43-40.

LSU was led in scoring by senior guard Quianna Chaney, who scored 13 of her 19 points in the opening half. Fowles added nine points and three rebounds before exiting early in the second half after re-aggravating a knee injury, playing 18 minutes in the game.

## Game 23: Florida 73, #r/v Auburn 67

February 7, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Jennifer Mosser poured in 13 of her team-high 17 points in the second half and Sha Brooks added 16 and four steals, as Florida notched a 73-67 victory over Auburn on Thursday night.

UF (15-8, 4-4 SEC) shot a blistering 61.5 percent in the second half, including a 44.4 percent (4-9) clip from beyond the arc, to outlast an Auburn squad that entered the contest receiving votes in both polls. Despite shooting only 67.6 percent from the free throw line in league play, Florida was true on 16-of-19 attempts (84.2 percent), hitting 7-of-10 in the last five minutes of the game.

"This was a huge win for us for a lot of different reasons," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "The most important was to continue to improve in the SEC. We're right where we want to be, and with this tough stretch that we've had, it was important for us to bounce back and get this win. We had great balance, not necessarily in our scoring, but in the way we played the game. People gave us great defensive minutes, and others stepped up to give us great offensive contributions. It was a great team win."

Mosser's 17 points were her most since netting a career-best 19 against Arkansas on January 20. She knocked down 3-of-4 shots from long distance, all after halftime, and totaled a career-high seven field goals on 10 attempts. Brooks rode an 8-of-8 night from the charity stripe to her 16 points, also marking her highest output since the victory at Arkansas. Junior forward Marshae Dotson battled through first-half foul trouble to chip in all 11 points and six of her seven rebounds in the final 20 minutes of play. One of a trio of UF players with seven rebounds on the night, senior guard Depree Bowden handed out a game-high and career-best tying six assists.

The Gators opened the second half with an 11-2 run, sparked by six points from Dotson, to build a 38-28 lead with less than four minutes gone in the opening period. After the Tigers cut the lead to five, Mosser drilled a three and Dotson added a layup on back-to-back possessions to reopen a 10-point lead and force Auburn to burn a timeout with 14:32 left in the game.

UF's lead dipped to five, 48-43, with just over 12 minutes remaining, but a jumper by Sharielle Smith and Mosser's third three of the night pushed the margin back to 10 at the ensuing media timeout. The Gators' lead reached 13 at 6:47 with just over eight minutes left in the ballgame when their transition offense yielded a three-point play for Smith and Brittany Thomas scored on a floater in the lane. With the Orange and Blue up just three with 2:30 to play, Mosser drove the lane and connected on a layup to put Florida up by a count of 68-63. After an Auburn score, Brooks sunk a pair of free throws to make the score 70-65 in favor of the home team, but the Tigers answered with another bucket and called timeout with UF holding a slim 70-67 lead. Brooks stepped to the line with 27.4 seconds on the clock and calmly nailed a pair of free throws to give UF a 72-67 edge, and Henry connected on one of two with 14.2 second remaining in regulation to put the Gators up a half dozen, 73-67. A last-gasp Auburn three-point attempt fell short and the final buzzer sounded on Florida's six-point victory.</

## Game 24: Mississippi State 83, Florida 71 February 10, 2008 \* Starkville, Miss. \* Humphrey Coliseum

Mississippi State scored the first 20 points of the game and Florida never recovered, falling to the Lady Bulldogs, 83-71, on Sunday afternoon at Humphrey Coliseum.

Florida tried to rally with an 11-2 run midway through the second half and whittled a large deficit to 13 points with 3:57 remaining, but MSU (15-9, 3-6 SEC) answered every Gator score with one of its own over the next three minutes and prevented the comeback effort.

"Mississippi State came out and punched us in the lip and we let them hit us again and again early. We got outplayed in every aspect. Clearly, we were not ready to go out of the shoot and Mississippi State was," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "They came out and protected their home floor. They took advantage of every hustle play and every time they had a chance to capitalize on one of our mistakes they did so. We did not play Florida Basketball during any point of today's game. We could not have picked a worse time to have our worst performance of the year."

Sophomore Jennifer Mossor dropped in a career-high 20 points for Florida (15-9, 4-5 SEC), which shot 41.9 percent for the game, including a 54.5 percent effort in the second stanza when the Gators outscored the Bulldogs, 50-39.

"Jenn was the one positive in the game for us," Butler said. "She played like she wanted the ball and I'm proud of the way she shot the ball well. Depree (Bowden) tried to get points any way she could, but we just got completely out-played in the paint."

Depree Bowden finished with 19 points and eight rebounds, while Sha Brooks and Marshae Dotson each contributed 10 points. During UF's late run, Dotson became the 20th Gator to hit the 1,000-point plateau, converting the first two free throws with 6:25 remaining in the game.

As poorly as the Gators started the first half, was as strong as they played in the opening minute of the second. UF stole the ball seconds into the period and Depree Bowden hit the layin, before she put back an offensive rebound to cut into the deficit, forcing the Bulldogs to call a time-out one minute into the half.

MSU regrouped and scored the next four points to resume its 23-point advantage, before UF again dropped the margin to 19. The Bulldogs used a 6-1 run to quell the Gator momentum, taking a 24-point lead. The teams traded buckets for the next several minutes and Florida couldn't make a move on the deficit until Bowden hit a pair of free throws at the 7:07 mark to start the 11-2 run that eventually saw UF cut the hole to 12 points and final margin.

The Gators committed 26 turnovers in the game, 16 in the deciding first half, while the Bulldogs had 20 miscues and held the 38-37 rebounding edge at the final horn.

The beginning of the game could not have started worse for the Gators, who missed their first six shots, while MSU hit seven of its first 10 from the floor and ripped off the first 20 points of the game. Florida collected just two defensive rebounds during the spree, turned the ball over six times and called two timeouts after less than five minutes ticked off the clock.

Dotson finally ended UF's scoring drought with a hook in the paint at the 14:44 mark and Brooks followed with a 3-pointer from the top of the arc and the Gators cut the deficit to 15 points with 13:50 remaining in the first half. After the teams traded buckets, MSU ripped off an 11-0 run over the next 3:43 and extended its lead to 26 points, 33-7, with just over seven minutes left.

Florida continued to play hard, as Brooks picked off a pass at the top of the defense and took it the length of the court for a layup to spark a 6-0 march. Jennifer Mossor added a 10-foot jumper during the run, while Brooks snared a defensive board and dribbled in traffic for a tough layin that brought UF within 20 at the 5:25 mark. For the most part, the teams traded scores for the remainder of the period, as MSU took a commanding 44-21 lead into the locker room.

The Bulldogs shot 50 percent from the field (16-of-32) and converted 10-of-15 free throws, while the Gators connected on just 27.6 percent (8-of-29) from the floor, but did manage to even the rebounding at 21-all. Florida's undoing came from its own miscues, committing 16 turnovers that the Bulldogs turned into 16 points.

## Game 25: #rv/24 Georgia 85, Florida 66 February 14, 2008 \* Athens, Ga. \* Stegeman Coliseum

Sharielle Smith contributed 14 points and 10 rebounds to post the first double-double of her career, but it wasn't enough to overcome a season-high performance from Georgia All-American Tasha Humphrey, who led the 24th-ranked Lady Bulldogs to an 85-66 victory on Thursday evening at Stegeman Coliseum.

The Gators (15-10, 4-6 SEC) committed 21 turnovers that Georgia (18-7, 5-5 SEC) converted into 38 points, while the home team shot 47.8 percent from the floor, canning 10-of-27 three-pointers in the process. Florida hit 36.4 percent of its shots and was out-rebounded by two, 38-36 against the taller Bulldogs.

"We didn't take care of the basketball," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We have to stop putting ourselves in a position where we are turning the ball over before we have a chance to run any of our offense. That happened a lot. We were aggressive and it was well-intentioned, but it wasn't smart play."

After Georgia scored the opening bucket of the second half to extend its lead to 19 points, the Gators stormed back with a 14-5 march thanks to scoring from five different players and were within 10 points, 55-44, with just over 15 minutes remaining. Jennifer Mossor started the run with a pair of free throws and followed with a three-point play. After a UG trey from Christy Marshall, Kim Critton hit a jumper and Depree Bowden converted a transition layup. Sharielle Smith nailed a three-pointer and Brittaney Thomas hit a fall-away 8-footer to cap the spree.

Marshall stopped the run with an offensive rebound put-back off a missed shot that was launched as the stop clock was expiring. Tasha Humphrey then added her third three-pointer and UF's deficit jumped back to 15 points with just under 12 minutes to go and the Gators were unable to stage another run.

"Georgia played with a lot of confidence during the end of the first half," Butler said. "Tasha Humphrey decided she was going to take of the game and we didn't do anything to stop her. She just out-played us. We got out-played in the paint again, which is disappointing for us because that is an area of our game that really is a strength, but we're really not handling it well right now."

Sha Brooks added 12 points and five rebounds for Florida, while Depree Bowden tallied 12. "Kim Critton was a bright spot for us," Butler said. "She played hard and about as well as she could every time she stepped on the court. The same thing goes for Sharielle Smith, she battled and hit some big three-pointers. Clearly, we needed other people to step and it's disappointing. On the road you have to do a much better job of protecting the basketball than we did. We lost our composure in crucial moments and you just can't do that."

Critton played 17 minutes and scored seven points with three rebounds for the Gators.

Humphrey led four Lady Bulldogs in double-figures, contributing 32 points on 13-of-18 shooting that included a 3-of-5 effort from the three-point arc. Angela Puleo tallied 18 points and Christy Marshall added 16, as the trio combined for 66 of the 85 total points for Georgia, which shot a steady 47.8 percent from the floor, including 10-of-27 from the three-point arc.

Florida used an 11-2 run and cut a 10-point deficit over a 2 minute 37 second span down to one point, 24-23, with 7:46 remaining in the first half, forcing Georgia to call a timeout. The Lady Bulldogs regrouped and exploded on a devastating 24-8 run the rest of the period to take a 48-31 halftime lead.

Georgia used keen outside shooting during the first 20 minutes, hitting 50 percent overall from the floor, including an 8-for-17 effort from beyond the three-point arc. Puleo canned 4-of-5 from long range, while Humphrey nailed 2-of-4 from behind the arc as part of her 16-point effort.

## Game 26: Florida 75, Arkansas 73

February 17, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

A pair of free throws by junior guard Sha Brooks after an intentional foul with 1.2 seconds remaining capped a dramatic ending to a 75-73 win for the Florida women's basketball team on Sunday afternoon at the O'Connell Center.

Florida (16-10, 5-6 SEC) overcame a 10-point first-half deficit, an eight-point second half hole and sophomore guard Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) tied her career high with 20 points to lead four Gators in double figures against the Lady Razorbacks (17-8, 2-8 SEC).

"We're worn out but it was a tremendous win for us for a lot of reasons," UF head coach Amanda Butler shared. "Bouncing back from a tough road swing to generate that much confidence to win the game, is a credit to our leadership from our senior and our captains. I was proud that we made some defensive plays that put us in the position that we were in to win the game at the end."

Arkansas guard Brittney Vaughn, who finished with 18 points, tied the game with 30 seconds left with a flat-footed three-pointer and the Gators were poised to strike for the win with the last possession. Florida was able to dump the ball in the post to junior forward Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) but her shot was errant and picked up by Vaughn, who inadvertently tripped up the court. Brooks hustled for the loose ball at mid-court, raced into the paint toward the basket, where she was fouled from behind by Sarah Pfeifer before Brooks could sink the layup.

The Gators put together a pair of 8-0 runs in the first half to help overcome a 10-point Arkansas lead. Florida went into halftime trailing 36-35, but riding momentum off a Bowden buzzer-beater with no time left on the clock.

The Gators, who improved to 6-2 this season in games decided by five points or less, also took care of the ball, committing a season-low 13 turnovers and were able to cash in on Arkansas' mistakes on the offensive end, scoring 23 points off of turnovers. Florida did, however, allow the Lady Razorbacks to hit 56 percent from the field, a season-high for a Gator opponent, as well as a season-best shooting performance for Arkansas.

Mossor equaled her career-high 20 points earlier in February against Mississippi State and she poured in 19 points against the Lady Razorbacks in February in Fayetteville. In Sunday's game, she shot 8-of-14 from the floor and scored five consecutive points on back-to-back possessions to give Florida a four-point lead at the 8:35 mark.

Brooks scored 16 points, senior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) chipped in 17 and Dotson scored 10, as the Gators hit just under 46 percent of their shots from the floor. Bowden had a game-high eight rebounds, including five on the offensive glass that helped lead to 16 UF second-chance points.

The fast break worked to Florida's advantage, a result of good looks from outlet passes and a product of players streaking from the wing to the basket. The Gators were able to score 18 points off the fast break compared to eight by the Lady Razorbacks.

Brooks and Bowden combined for 23 of Florida's 35 first-half points. Dotson was recognized before the game for reaching the 1,000-point mark in her career against Mississippi State, the 20th player in school history to do so.

Joining Vaughn in double-figure scoring was Anyana Brereton, who also added 18 points, Charity Ford, who tallied 17 points, and Pfeifer, who finished with 12, hitting 4-of-5 from behind the arc.

## Game 27: South Carolina 69, Florida 65

February 24, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Florida dropped a disappointing 69-65 decision to South Carolina on Sunday in the final regular-season home game played at O'Connell Center.

The Gators (16-11, 5-7 SEC) actually held a nine-point lead midway through the first half, limiting the Gamecocks (14-13, 3-9 SEC) to just seven points with 6:26 remaining in the period. That's when the visitors came alive, as a three-pointer from Ebony Jones and a pair of driving layups from Samone Kennedy ignited a 8-0 run that helped USC end the half on a 24-13 march and take a 31-29 lead entering the locker room.

South Carolina continued that momentum in the opening minutes of the second half, scoring the first six points to build a 37-29 lead, which eventually grew to 12 points (52-40) with 11:52 remaining. The Gators cut the deficit to five points, 52-47, after a quick 7-0 run started by Lonnika Thompson's three-pointer, but Ashlie Billingslea ended the march with back-to-back driving layups that started a 7-3 swing the other way and USC assumed a 61-50 advantage with 6:30 on the clock.

Florida finally found some energy, as Marsha Dotson's hook shot in the paint over 6-foot-6 Ilona Burgrova sparked a 12-2 run that included a pair of three-pointers from senior Depree Bowden and the Gators were within one, 63-62, with 2:27 remaining.

The Gamecocks didn't hit a field goal in the final 4:50 of the game, however, sealed the win at the free throw line, hitting 6-for-6 in the final 1:56, when the Gators missed a layup and one free throw that could have tightened the game.

While South Carolina hit with confidence from the free throw line, nailing 10-of-14 during the game, the Gators shot a woeful 61.3 percent, hitting just 19-of-31, while getting out-rebounded 40-34.

"South Carolina played a great game and we didn't," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Today, we didn't rebound well or hit free throws. We just opened the door. I thought South Carolina was tougher than us, which is disappointing because I think we have a real tough, scrappy team. For whatever reason, we didn't play that way this afternoon."

Dotson, who had started 57 consecutive games prior to coming off the bench for Sunday's outing, finished with a game-high 17 points, hitting 6-of-7 from the floor while collecting seven rebounds and three steals. Bowden, the lone senior of the 2007-08 Gator squad, pitched in 12 points and six rebounds, while Sha Brooks added 10 points for Florida, which hit just 4-of-19 three-point attempts, while USC canned 7-of-15 from long range.

Jordan Jones led a balanced USC scoring attack with 16 points, as she led the Gamecocks long range shooting by hitting 5-of-9 from behind the arc. Kennedy finished with 10 points, including two free throws with 3.1 seconds remaining that sealed the game.

## Game 28: #3 Tennessee 88, Florida 61

Junior Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.), who scored 25 points in the 2005-06 Gator upset of the Lady Vols, tallied a team- and season-high 27 points in this year's meeting, hitting 6-of-10 from the three-point arc. Brooks' stellar offensive performance, however, wasn't nearly enough to counter Tennessee's rebounding dominance, as the Lady Vols (26-2, 12-2 SEC) held a 57-35 advantage in the paint, with 25 of those on the offensive end alone, helping the home team outscore the Gators (16-12, 5-8 SEC), 40-16 in the paint.

"Sha played fantastic and shot the ball like we've wanted her to all season and that was great to see," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Other players had some great moments, but nothing consistent from beginning to end. You cannot come to Knoxville and not rebound. We were dominated in the paint and allowed them to have 25 extra shots because of their offensive rebounding. I'm really disappointed with that aspect of our game. I thought we did play tough in some areas, but rebounding was not one of them. You can shoot the ball great, but if you don't rebound and give a great team like Tennessee 25 extra chances, you're going to get beat by 20-some points."

In its final home game of the season, UT road the strength of its rebounding prowess and a devastating 25-4 run early in the first half that Florida was unable to match en route to the win.

Playing in her final home game, All-American Candace Parker and redshirt junior double scored 18 points to lead a balanced UT scoring effort. Nicky Anosike added a double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds, while Angie Bjorklund hit 14 points, connecting on four of UT's nine three-pointers.

Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) opened the game's scoring, after the Gators made a defensive stand. UT countered, hitting the boards hard and scoring the next five points, before Brooks ended the mini run with a driving lay-up and Florida was within one. After Candace Parker tallied a bucket in the paint, Brooks answered with another jumper and the Gators were again within one point, 7-6, with 16:04 remaining.

Tennessee stepped up even more on the boards, exploiting their superior height advantage that ignited 10 straight points as part of a devastating 18-2 run that found the Gators trailing 25-8 with just under eight minutes remaining in the half. Depree Bowden's baseline drive provided the lone Florida points during the spree, as UT held a commanding 24-11 advantage on the boards, collecting 12 on the offensive end alone.

Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) broke up the spell with a 12-footer from the left side at the 7:35 mark, before the Lady Vols rattled off seven more points to extend their lead to 32-10 with 4:37 remaining.

Brooks and Dotson then caught fire, and helped Florida answer all except one UT bucket for the remainder of the half, with Brooks canning her third three-pointer of the period at the buzzer, as the Gators found themselves down 46-26 entering the locker room.

UF shot 30 percent (10-33) during the first half, while UT hit 40.5 percent (17-42) that included a 5-of-10 effort from the three-point arc.

UT's dominance in the paint was the biggest difference in the opening half, as the Lady Vols held a 30-18 advantage, grabbing 14 offensive rebounds, while out-scoring the Gators 22-8 in the paint. Florida also committed 12 turnovers during the first half that resulted in 12 Lady Vol points.

## Game 29: Florida 72, Ole Miss 66

### March 2, 2008 \* Oxford, Miss. \* Tad Smith Coliseum

Florida rallied from a 17-point halftime deficit to earn a thrilling 72-66 victory over Ole Miss on Sunday at the Tad Smith Coliseum in the regular-season finale for both teams. The comeback tied for the second-largest deficit the Gators have ever overcome.

Florida, which snapped a two-game losing streak while ending Ole Miss' two-game winning streak, out-scored the Lady Rebels 51-28 in the second half, when the Gators shot 54.5 percent from the floor, hitting 25-of-61, as well as connecting on 15-of-20 from the free throw line, and holding a 19-11 rebounding edge. The Gators ripped out of the halftime locker room on a 7-1 run that was part of a 20-8 march covering the first six-plus minutes of the final frame that brought Florida to within five points and brought the comeback within reach.

"I'm tremendously proud of our team," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "The things that happened in the second half had everything to do with a team that refused to lose. It was a team that was going to battle and fight and show who we were because we knew we didn't do that in the first half. As a coach, you can't hope for anything more than to challenge your team and have them respond in the manner that they did tonight."

Florida began the second half on a 7-1 run to cut into its halftime deficit to get within 11 points, 39-28. Depree Bowden opened the spree with a three-pointer, before Marshae Dotson sank two free throws and Sha Brooks hit a jumper in the paint.

The teams traded scores for the next two minutes until Dotson put-back an offensive rebound and Sharielle Smith hit an 8-footer in the lane to get the Gators within single digits, 43-32, with 16:27 remaining.

Chantell Black halted UF's run with a 3-pointer from the left side, but Jennifer Mossor quickly answered with one for the Gators from the left corner, as part of a personal 7-0 run by herself that brought Florida within five, 46-41, with 13:46 on the clock. Aneika Henry sparked Mossor's final bucket in the run, swatting a shot and Mossor streaking the length of the court for the driving lay-in.

Ole Miss (12-15, 6-8 SEC) countered with four points under the basket that quelled UF's momentum. But the Gators refused to fold, as Smith hit a trey from the top of the arc and Brooks added one free throw that brought Florida within five, 50-45, with 11:47 on the clock.

After a Lady Rebel score, Florida connected on the next five points, with Brooks hitting an outside jumper and Dotson adding a free throw and put-back on offensive rebound on a miss from Smith, who had collected Dotson's stray from the charity stripe, as the Gators were within two points, 52-50, with 10:08 remaining.

Two short buckets from Ole Miss kept UF at a six-point distance before the teams exchanged scores for the ensuing few minutes. Brooks then converted a streaking lay-up and nailed a pair from the charity stripe to bring Florida within two, 60-58, with 5:02 left. But UM scored on its next offensive trip, with Bianca Thomas sinking a reverse layup under the basket and kept the home team on top by four, with 4:31 remaining.

Brooks lit the board again, this time with a deep three-pointer and the shot clock running down, that got Florida within one point, 62-61, and 3:22 on the clock. Danetra Forrest took a nice lob in the paint and hit the high percentage shot for Ole Miss, keeping it a three-point game. Dotson responded with a put back of her own miss, before UM hit a pair of free throws. Bowden then stripped the ball, streaked the length of the court, hitting the layup and was fouled, making the ensuing free throw to tie the game at 66-66 with 1:28 remaining. Brooks then stole the ball from Elizabeth Robertson, tipped it to Dotson, who threw the outlet to Bowden, who converted the layup, which gave the Gators a 68-66 lead with one minute left. Nineteen seconds later, Brooks came up with another steal, this time of Carla Bartee, and hit a sprinting Bowden in stride, as she converted the layup and extended UF's lead to four points with 38 seconds to go. Ole Miss then missed on its next possession and was forced to foul Brooks, the SEC's leading free throw shooter, who coolly sank both with 11.9 seconds left for the final scoring and secure the stunning six-point victory.

## Game 30: Florida 71, South Carolina 57 (SEC Tournament First Round) March 6, 2008 \* Nashville, Tenn. \* Sommet Center

Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) scored a game-high 21 points leading the University of Florida women's basketball team to an impressive 71-57 victory against South Carolina in the first round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on Thursday at the Sommet Center.

Bowden, the Gators' lone senior, tallied 19 of her points in the first half when she single-handedly out-scored the Gamecocks, 19-17, helping UF (18-12) build a 34-17 lead at the break.

During those opening 20 minutes, Florida ripped off a 21-3 run after South Carolina (15-15) had tied the game at 10-all with 13:53 on the clock. Bowden started the spree with a jumper and scored 11 points during the game-changing march that lasted just over nine minutes and helped the Gators take a 31-13 lead with 4:12 remaining in the period.

South Carolina scored the next four points and cut UF's lead to 14 points with one minute to go, before Bowden zipped in her fifth three-pointer of the period as the halftime horn sounded to give the Gators the momentum entering the locker room.

Florida's intense defense forced a pair of shot-clock violations and limited USC to a paltry 19.2 percent shooting effort, as the taller Gamecocks hit just 18-of-40 from the floor.

The 10th-seeded Gamecocks scored the first bucket of the second half, before Aneika Henry (Coconut Grove, Fla.) and Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) combined for the next six points and gave the seventh-seeded Gators a 21-point lead, 40-19 with just under 17 minutes left in the game.

South Carolina then turned up its play and used a 12-2 run over the next four-plus minutes to get UF's lead to 11 points, 42-31, with 12:22 on the clock, forcing a Gator timeout. Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) responded immediately by converting a three-point play that sparked a 9-2 march, during which Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) and Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) added scores and Dotson picked off a pass and ran the floor, dishing to Brooks who converted the layup that swelled the Gator lead to 18 with 9:39 remaining and the Gators were never threatened again.

"I am very pleased with the way that we played basketball tonight," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "I thought for almost 40 minutes we executed and followed the game plan and played with the type of passion and energy and confidence that you have to play with at this time of the season to make things happen. That's what we wanted to do tonight, make things happen and not be reactive. I thought we did that, especially when we faced a little adversity when Marsha (Dotson) picked up two quick fouls. We generated offense from our defense. Depree (Bowden) and Sha (Brooks) played well under a lot of pressure. Overall, this was a great team effort."

The victory was the perfect birthday present for Butler, the youngest of the 12 league coaches who celebrated her 36th on Thursday.

In addition to posting her fifth 20-point game of the season, Bowden dished a career-high seven assists with zero turnovers, shooting 8-of-13 overall, including 5-of-6 from the three-point arc.

"Once I hit my first two (shots), I gained confidence and went from there," shared Bowden, who helped Florida take the three-game series against USC, 2-1. "They beat us on my senior night so I wanted to get back at them."

Also during Thursday's victory, Brooks scored 14 points and contributed four assists and rebounds.

"I thought we played with more intensity (than in the regular-season loss to South Carolina)," Brooks said. "We really knew the game plan and knew we needed to come out and start quick in the first half and continue it in the second half. We did get into a lull in the second half and knew we had to pick it up in the end."

Henry added 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting, while swatting two shots and grabbing three boards, where USC did hold a 46-33 advantage, grabbing 21 offensive rebounds and turning them into 20 second-chance points.

## Game 31: #3 Tennessee, Florida 61 (SEC Tournament Quarterfinals) March 7, 2008 \* Nashville, Tenn. \* Sommet Center

Sha Brooks scored 20 points and Depree Bowden added 15 but it wasn't enough to quell a pair of significant runs as the Gators lost to third-ranked and second-seeded Tennessee, 92-61, in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on Friday.

In front of a crowd of 9,938, an SEC Tournament record for Session 3, the Lady Vols ripped off a 12-1 run late in the first half after Florida was within six points, 32-26, with under seven minutes left to take a 48-33 halftime lead.

When the Gators chipped away at the deficit early in the second half and closed within 11 points and then 13, Tennessee (28-2) marched off a devastating 26-4 spree and Florida (18-13) never recovered.

"Any time you lose a ball game, you're obviously disappointed," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We got beat by a very, very good team tonight. They are very talented, very deep and very well coached. There were certain aspects of our play that I was proud of, but there were areas where I was disappointed. What's impressive about Tennessee is the talent that they can bring off the bench. It's really hard to counter. Our transition defense was not our best tonight and I thought that was where we really broke down. I was really proud of our rebounding, which was a big turnaround from the first time we played them."

Tennessee wound up with a 45-41 rebounding edge, after the Gators held the lead in the paint for most of the game. Florida, however, shot 32.5 percent (25-77) in the game and committed 17 turnovers that the Lady Vols turned into 24 points. Among UF's 41 rebounds were 20 on the offensive end, but the Gators were unable to convert those only into 11 points.

UF's leading scorer and rebounder, Marsha Dotson, left the floor after spraining her left knee with 13:51 remaining in the first half and UF down just five. Brooks immediately hit a three-pointer that brought Florida within two points, 14-12, but the Lady Vols outscored the Gators 28-15 over the next 10 minutes, fueled by a 12-1 late during that span and Florida never recovered.

Florida missed its first 4 shots before Lonnika Thompson got a 12-foot jumper to fall and Dotson pulled up for a four-footer in the paint before Brooks nailed a 25-footer from behind the arc to tie the score at 7-all at the 16:28 mark of the opening half.

Candace Parker, who finished with a game-high 26 points, sank one free throw, before Brooks followed with a driving lay-up from the left side at the 15:12 mark to give the Gators a 9-8 lead.

UT added another two from the line before a field goal at the end of a 6-0 run to build its lead back to five points. Brooks halted the spree with another deep three-pointer from the left side of the arc, but the Gators committed five consecutive turnovers that the Lady Vols turned into six more quick points and their lead grew to eight, 20-12, with 12:34 remaining.

Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) cut the deficit with a trey from the right side to bring UF within five. After four more points from UT, Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) added a three-pointer from the left corner and the Gators closed to six with 11:36 on the clock.

The teams traded buckets and Florida continued to use the three-ball to cut into the deficit, with Bowden capping her third of the period with 6:48 left and the Gators were down, 32-26.

## Game 32: Florida 60, Florida Gulf Coast 55 (WNIT Second Round) March 24, 2008 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* O'Connell Center

Sophomore guard Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) scored a team-high 14 points off the bench to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 60-55 victory over Florida Gulf Coast in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament on Monday night, halting UF's three-game postseason losing skid and securing the Gators' first postseason win in four years.

Mossor's 14 points led Florida to a 23-2 advantage in bench scoring on the night, while UF's 18 offensive rebounds propelled it to a 43-36 edge on the boards and a 25-9 margin in second-chance points. Junior guard Sha Brooks tallied her 11th consecutive double-figure scoring game by adding 12 points and four of the Gators' nine steals on the evening, while sophomore Sharielle Smith led the team with 10 rebounds. Junior Kim Critton also helped out with five points and seven boards, three of which came on the offensive end of the floor, in a reserve role against the Eagles.

In addition to representing the Gators' first postseason victory since the first round of the 2004 NCAA Tournament, Monday night's victory was also the 550th in program history and marked the team's 14th home win of the campaign, which equals the second-best total in school history. The Orange and Blue also tied the program record for biggest turnaround in back-to-back seasons with 19 wins after finishing 9-22 a year ago, while Butler earned a share of the school record for most victories by a first-year head coach.

An early 4-0 deficit didn't phase the Gators, as they ripped off a 7-0 run to assume a three-point lead at the first media timeout. Florida Gulf Coast fought back to take a 22-15 lead midway through the half, but a three-point play by Critton and a slashing layup from Brooks fueled a 6-0 UF run and tied the game at 24-24 before the Eagles asked for timeout with 5:36 left before the break.

Critton provided another spark for Florida just moments later when she blocked an FGCU layup attempt and saved the ball from going out of bounds, then raced down the court to grab an offensive rebound and dish to Brooks, who nailed a jumper from the top of the key to propel the Orange and Blue to a 28-26 edge. The Gators outscored FGCU 11-1 over the last 5:40 of the first half, holding the Eagles without a field goal for the last 5:20 of the frame, and entered the locker room with a 35-27 advantage. Brooks, Depree Bowden and Mossor each scored six points in the first half to lead UF, which shot 44.1 percent from the floor and jumped out to a 24-16 edge on the boards in the opening 20 minutes. The Gators also blocked three shots in the first half en route to limiting FGCU to just a 36.7 percent efficiency rating in the opening stanza.

Brooks opened the second-half scoring with a layup in transition just after the 18-minute mark to make the score 37-27, and a three-point play by junior forward Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) kept UF in front by 10, 40-30, just after the first media timeout of the frame. A pair of driving layups by Mossor pushed Florida's lead to 44-30 with 13:37 left on the clock, forcing FGCU to burn another timeout with the Gators in the midst of another 7-0 run. The Eagles came roaring out of the stoppage with seven straight points to cut the deficit in half at the next media timeout, but Dotson rattled home a jumper in the paint to stop the FGCU streak and extend the lead back to nine, 46-37, with just over nine minutes left in regulation.

A put-back layup by Brooks gave UF a 48-38 advantage at the eight-minute mark of the second half, but Florida Gulf Coast stormed back to pull within a pair 52-50 with just under four minutes left to play. Mossor helped the Gators maintain a two-possession lead at the final media timeout after she swiped the ball from an Eagles ballhandler at midcourt and charged down the lane for a heavily-contested layup to make the score 54-50. FGCU came within a point at 54-53 before Smith converted a second-chance layup for a 56-53 lead with less than two minutes to play. Bowden drained a baseline jumper on Florida's next possession to stretch the margin to 58-53, but FGCU countered with a bucket to decrease the gap to three, 58-55, with under a minute on the clock. UF came back down the floor and misfired on a three-point attempt, but Dotson snared the offensive board and the Eagles were forced to surrender three-straight fouls to put Brooks on the free throw line, where she calmly sank a pair to put UF in front by the final margin of 60-55.

## Game 33: NC State 80, Florida 55 (WNIT Third Round) March 27, 2008 \* Raleigh, N.C. \* Reynolds Coliseum

The University of Florida women's basketball team had its season end on Thursday evening with an 80-55 loss to N.C. State in the third round of the Women's NIT played at Kay Yow Court-Reynolds Coliseum.

The Wolfpack used a 9-0 run late in the opening period to take a 15-point halftime lead and began the second with a devastating 28-6 spree en route to the final outcome.

"N.C. State came out with the agenda to win and they played like that on every possession. We never did anything to get them off track," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "The first half was what really set the tone and got us back on our heels. We didn't do anything to set the tone. We were reactive."

Just over 13 minutes into the game, the Gators found themselves within three points before the Wolfpack marched off a 10-2 run and assumed an 11-point lead. Florida rallied with a 6-0 spree of its own, with four of those points coming off consecutive driving layups from Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) that cut the deficit to five points, 20-15, with 7:30 remaining in the period.

The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes before NC State used a 9-0 run over a 2:42 span that swelled its advantage to 17 points, 36-19, with 3:15 to go in the half, as the Gators found themselves down 40-25 entering the locker room.

Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) began the second-half scoring with a pair of free throws that got Florida within 13, before the Wolfpack marched off five straight points that ignited the game-deciding 28-4 run.

Florida shot just 30.6 percent (11-36) in the first half, when the hosts hit 48.4 percent (15-31).

Brooks finished with a team-high 16 points and had three of UF's six assists in the game, while Mossor chipped in 11 points on 4-of-8 shooting, while collecting five rebounds.

Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.), the Gators' lone senior, added 10 points and seven rebounds, ending her career with 987 points.

"Depree deserved to have her career end in a different fashion," Butler said. "It's a tough way to have it end because she is such a fantastic young lady. I hope she's able to look back on all that she gave our program, especially with all the successes she was able to help this team achieve. We were able to exceed expectations on most nights, just not tonight."

Junior Kim Critton (Memphis, Tenn.) came off the bench and provided a solid 17 minutes as a 5-foot-8 post player, tying her season-high of eight points on 3-of-6 shooting.

"Kim Critton was a bright spot because she stepped outside of her comfort zone and played hard and did whatever we needed her to do," Butler shared. "She took some hard licks going to the basket, but we didn't have that across the board and when you're on someone else's home court and playing against a team that is as talented and as well coached as NC State is, than you have to have a unified effort across the board and we didn't have that tonight."

NC State (20-12) received a career-high 31 points from junior Shayla Fields, who hit 6-of-9 three-pointes and 10-of-14 overall from the floor. Khadijah Whittington added 13 points with 17 rebounds, helping the Wolfpack carry a 45-39 rebounding advantage.

The Gators end their season having posted the greatest one-year turnaround in program history, winning 10 more games than last season, posting a 19-14 overall record and returning to the postseason under the guidance of their new coach.

"We are proud of the strides that we were able to make throughout the year and that's why it's so disappointing to end the season this way because this was not our team," Butler said.
