Depree (dee-PREE) Bowden was the lone senior on the 2007-08 squad ... a quick, athletic guard with excellent court vision ... high school teammate of 2007-08 Gator sophomore Sharielle Smith ... earned a place on the 2006, 2007 and 2008 Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll and the 2005 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll ... named to the 2008 SEC Community Service Team ... earned SEC Player of the Week honors during the 2007-08 season ... received her bachelor's degree in criminology on May 3, 2008 ... plans to attend graduate school.

Career Notes

Totaled 987 career points, increasing her scoring total each season, including a team-leading 13.4 points her senior year ... 491 career rebounds ... tied for the sixth-most games player in a Career (120) ... eighth-most 3-pointers made in a career (87) ... eighth-most 3-pointers attempted in a career (298) ... 10th-most steals in a career (185) ... seventh-most 3-pointers made in a season (55 in 2007-08) ... third-most 3-pointers made in a season by a Gator senior (55 in 2007-08) ... fourth-most steals in a season by a Gator senior (68 in 2007-08) ... 45 career double-figure scoring games, 17 career double-figure rebounding games, 15 20-point scoring games and 16 double-doubles.

Senior Year (2007-08)

Team tri-captain and lone senior on 2007-08 squad ... one of two Gators (with Sha Brooks) who started all 33 games and one of five who played in every game ... scored in every game ... scored in double-figures in eight of her final 10 games ... in the SEC statistics for all games, ranked No. 7 for scoring, No. 6 for field goal percentage, No. 9 for steals, No. 8 for 3-pointers made and No. 16 for minutes played ... at the conclusion of UF's SEC Tournament run, jumped into the top spot as the team's scoring leader after a strong performance in the league's postseason event, where she averaged 18.0 points, shooting 58.3 percent (14-24) overall and 63.6 percent (7-11) from the three-point arc in two games ... against South Carolina in the SEC Tournament first round (March 6), scored 21 points, hitting 5-of-7 three-pointers, while dishing a career-high seven rebounds with zero turnovers; also in that game against the Gamecocks, scored 19 of her points in the first half, when she single-handedly outscored USC, 19-17, helping UF take a 34-17 leading into the locker room... led UF in scoring (13.4 ppg), steals (68) and made three-pointers (55), while ranking second in assists (80), three-point percentage (31.8%, 55-173) and minutes played (999, 30.3 mpg) and fourth in rebounding (5.1 rpg) ... tallied a season-high 24 points, thanks to a career-high six three-pointers, against FAMU (Jan. 2) ... voted to the 2007 State Farm Classic All-Tournament Team (Dec. 29), the first all-tournament team honor in her career, helping UF win its home event ... named SEC Player of the Week (for Dec. 17-23) for the first time in her career after tying her then-season-high of 23 points in a victory over Saint Louis and helping UF win its third consecutive game ... recognized on Feb. 26 as SEC Community Service Player of the Week ... 24 double-figure scoring games ... five 20-point scoring games.

Junior Year (2006-07)

Starting guard/forward in every game except two: against Louisville (Dec. 21), when she did not play due to injury; and came off the bench against Vanderbilt (March 2) in the SEC Tournament quarter-final because of injury ... earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status ... reset or tied her career-high point total five times, highlighted with 28

points with 13 rebounds at Vanderbilt (Jan. 14) ... at Alabama (Feb. 18), topped the 500-point plateau for her career ... tallied a 20-point, 9-rebound effort at LSU (Feb. 8), netting her fourth 20-point game of her career ... has reset every career statistical category except blocks in a game (3), which she tied once ... UF's leading scorer in six games, leading rebounder in 11 and assists leader 13 times ... led UF in assists (2.5 pg), steals (2.3 pg) and blocked shots (23) ... ranked second on the team in rebounding (6.9 pg) and third for scoring (12.8 ppg) ... in the SEC standings for league games ranked: t-No. 10 for scoring, No. 8 for rebounding, No. 8 for free throw percentage, No. 5 for steals and No. 6 for minutes played ... all six of her career double-doubles came during the 2006-07 season, with the last a 24-point, 12-rebound, 6-assist effort against Ole Miss (Feb. 1) ... more than doubled - in some cases tripled - every offensive career category she had established entering the 2006-07 season: in 2005-06, she averaged 3.7 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing 13.8 minutes per game, while in 2006-07 contributed 12.8 points and 6.9 rebounds while seeing 30.8 minutes of court time ... collected a career-high 15 rebounds at South Alabama (Dec. 1) ... had a season-long streak of 14 consecutive made free throws, along with two different streaks of 12 ... tied UF game record by going 11-for-11 from the free throw line at TCU (Dec. 8) ... 19 double-figure scoring games ... seven double-figure rebounds games ... six double-doubles ... four 20-point scoring games.

Sophomore Year (2005-06)

Appeared in all 30 games, starting the first three of the year ... scored in 21 games and totaled 111 points ... contributed seven points against Auburn (Feb. 2), hitting 3-of-3 from the floor with one free throw, sparking the Gators to the win by scoring four points in the final two minutes of the first half after the Tigers closed within one point ... played a valuable 16 minutes during the Jan. 22 win over No. 19 Vanderbilt ... sprained her right ankle during the Jan. 19 game at Ole Miss and played just two minutes as a result ... thrilling performance in the comeback win against Florida State (Jan. 2), scoring 13 of her then-career-high 15 points in the second half, while collecting four rebounds and four steals ... sparked UF's 16-point second-half comeback at Charlotte (Nov. 30), collecting a then-career-high four steals all in the second half along with four points and six rebounds ... grabbed a then-career-high nine rebounds vs. Stetson (Nov. 27) ... scored a then-career-high 13 points in the season-opener against St. Francis (NY).

Freshman Year (2004-05)

Appeared in 27 of UF's 29 games while averaging 7.4 minutes per outing ... scored in 13 games, netting a season-high eight points on 4-of-6 shooting against Delaware State (Dec. 6) ... played a season-long 17 minutes in the victory over Temple (Dec. 4), scoring five points with three rebounds ... played an SEC-long 12 minutes at LSU (Feb. 27), when she canned a pair of free throws, while collecting two rebounds and two assists ... hit 11-of-14 free throws for a 78.6 percentage ... canned a three-pointer at Alabama (Feb. 6) to score her first points in an SEC game ... did not travel with the team to its January 30 game at Vanderbilt due to strep throat and did not play in UF's ensuing game versus Tennessee ... during UF's first win of the season (vs. Akron, Nov. 27), scored her first collegiate points, putting back an offensive rebound with 17:03 remaining in the game ... her performance versus Akron was her most complete game of the season, putting up nine points, five rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block in 15 minutes of play ... cited by then-coach Carolyn Peck for jump-starting the defense on numerous occasions, stating after the Akron game, "We really picked up our defensive pressure

and again Depree Bowden had a lot to do with our run.”

Graduated in June of 2004 from Bradenton Southeast High School, where she was coached by John Harder ... a two-year captain and four-year starter for the Seminoles ... completed her career netting a school-record 1,919 points along with 976 rebounds and 477 assists ... produced the best four-year record in program history, 118-14, by any Southeast girls basketball player, winning four district championships, two region titles and advancing to the final four twice ... Class 4A state runner-up her junior season, while helping the team to the semifinals in 2004 and the Elite 8 her first two years ... team was 58-8 her final two seasons ... her senior year she averaged 15.5 points, 7.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists, helping Southeast to a 27-4 record ... averaged 14.6 points, 6 rebounds and 6.4 assists per game her junior season, when she guided Southeast to the state Class 4A championship game ... Herald-Tribune named her its 2004 Female Player of the Year ... 2003 and 2004 Florida Sports Writers Association 4A All-State First Team selection, as well as a three-time Street & Smith All-America Honorable Mention honoree ... recognized as a 2001 adidas Top Ten Camp, an adidas Top Ten Camp Upperclass All-Star and a 4A All-State honorable mention selection in 2001 and 2002 ... also an accomplished volleyball player, Bowden broke Southeast's record for kills, previously held by former Gator teammate Briana Phillips (614).

Press' All-SEC Honorable Mention team ... 2005-06 All-SEC Second Team (coaches' and media teams) ... 2006 SEC All-Freshman Team ... 2006 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll ... four-time recipient in 2005-06 of SEC Freshman of the Week award ... has added more than 20 pounds of muscle to her slim frame since her freshman year ... underwent lateral meniscectomy surgery on March 19, 2007 to repair a lateral meniscal tear in her left knee.

Ended the 2007-08 season having started 91 consecutive games and 94 overall, starting all except one in her career ... has never missed a game in her career ... during her junior year eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau, the 19th Gator to reach the scoring milestone ... her 164 career 3-pointers are third-most in program history ... ranks No. 3 all-time at UF for made 3-pointers (164) and No. 3 for 3-point attempts (566) ... during the 2007-08 season, held career-long streak of 25 consecutive made free throws ... twice tied UF's record for free throw percentage in a game, hitting 10-of-10 versus Temple (Jan. 5, 2008) and Stetson (Nov. 26, 2007) ... tied program record for second-most three-pointers in a game (7 at Tennessee, Feb. 28, 2008) ... fifth-most free throws made in a career (295) ... eighth-most steals in a career (190) ... tied program record for most games started by a Gator junior (33 in 2007-08) ... third-most free throws made in a season by a Gator junior (103 in 2007-08) ... third-highest free throw percentage in a season by a Gator junior (79.8%, 103-129 in 2007-08) ... seventh-most minutes player in a season (1,064 in 2007-08) ... made 117 free throws in 2006-07, ranking as the fourth-most in UF's all-time season chart ... tied UF record for free throw attempts in a game (16 vs. Kentucky, Feb. 25, 2007) ... tied UF sophomore game-record for made free throws made (11 vs. Kentucky, Feb. 25, 2007) and attempted (16 vs. Kentucky, Feb. 25, 2007), as well as for steals (9 vs. Stetson, Dec. 18, 2006) ... sank a UF freshman-record 61 three-pointers and in the process became the first Gator rookie to lead the team in made 3-pointers ... hit at least one 3-pointer in 18 consecutive games that spanned over the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons, the fourth-longest streak in program history ... 68 double-figure scoring games ... 17 games scoring at least 20 points.

Junior Year (2007-08)

One of two Gators (with Depree Bowden) who started all 33 games and one of five who played in every game ... ended the year having scored in double-figures in 12 consecutive games, averaging a team-best 15.3 points during that span, connecting on 34.4 percent (22-64) from the three-point arc and 82.4 percent (42-51) from the free throw stripe ... during UF's WNIT second-round win versus Florida Gulf Coast, topped the 1,000-minute mark for the season, marking the 16th time a Gator has played at least 1,000 minutes in a year - 11 different Gators have played 1,000 minutes in a season, including Brooks, who played 1,021 minutes in 2006-07, as she is just the fourth Gator to have played at least 1,000 minutes in two different seasons, joining Dana Smith, Murriel Page and Brandi McCain - who had three-1,000-minute seasons ... her fourth blocked shot of the was the Gator's 100 of the season ... emerged as more of a complete player, averaging 12.3 points, logging 32.2 minutes per game and contributing a team-high 87 assists (2.6 apg), in addition to ranking second in steals (62) and made three-pointers (48) ... in the SEC

statistics for all games, ranked No. 13 for scoring, No. 2 for free throw percentage (79.8%, 103-129), No. 14 for steals, No. 13 for three-pointers made and No. 11 for minutes played ... UF's second-leading scoring in SEC games (12.9 ppg), while hitting 36.6 percent (26-71) from the three-point arc ... drained a career-high seven three-pointers at No. 3 Tennessee (Feb. 28), connecting on 7-of-11 from behind the arc en route to a season-high 27 points ... the seven treys tied for the second-most in a game in UF history, one behind the eight Bridget Pettis canned against Georgia on Jan. 20, 1993 ... also cracked into the record book by twice tying the UF mark for free three percentage in a game, hitting 10-of-10 in victories over Temple (Jan. 5) and Stetson (Nov. 26) ... hit the game-winning free throws with 1.2 seconds remaining in the thrilling 75-73 victory over Arkansas (Feb. 17) ... held a career-long streak of 25 consecutive made free throws during the season ... versus Saint Louis (Dec. 22), became the 19th Gator to score 1,000 points during her career, nailing a three-pointer from the right side of the arc that put her over the top of the milestone with five minutes remaining, eclipsing the 1,000-point mark in her 72nd career game, the seventh fastest in program history ... left the January 10th game at Kentucky with 1:03 remaining, holding her right knee and did not re-enter during the thrilling finish (a two-point UF loss) ... tied her career-high with eight rebounds against Holy Cross (Dec. 28) ... dished a career-high nine assists in a win over Florida Gulf Coast (Dec. 4) ... 24 double-figure scoring games ... three 20-point scoring games.

Sophomore Year (2006-07)

Named to the Associated Press' All-SEC Honorable Mention team ... starting guard in all 31 games ... ended the season having started 58 consecutive games ... led UF in scoring (15.4 ppg), 3-pointers made (55), free throws made (117), free throw attempts (150) and minutes played (32.9 pg), while ranking second in assists (70), steals (62) and free throw percentage (78.0%) ... in the SEC standings for league games, ranked No. 8 for scoring (15.3 pg), No. 9 for free throw percentage (77.6%, 52-67), t-No. 8 for steals (2.07 pg) and No. 5 for minutes played (34.79 pg) ... scored in every game except one, playing just 11 minutes versus IUPUI (Nov. 21) because of injury ... one of four Gators who played in every game (Marshaë Dotson, Kim Dye and Briana Phillips) ... during the Jan. 4 game at Georgia suffered a lateral meniscal tear in her left knee which required surgery at the end of the season ... the injury did not cause her to miss any game action, but her practice time for the remainder of the year was limited ... scored in double-figures in each of the last seven games, averaging 17.9 points during that run ... tied her career-high of 28 points in the regular-season finale, leading the Gators to the 83-79 win over Kentucky (Feb. 25), as she found her way to the free throw line a program-record-tying 16 times (seventh time in UF history), hitting 11 of those attempts which tied for the ninth-most in UF history ... in the last three games of the season found her way to the free throw line 34 times, hitting 26 of those attempts (76.5%) ... at Alabama (Feb. 18), topped the 800-point plateau for her career ... scored a career-high 28 points against Arkansas (Jan. 21) ... had a streak of hitting at least one 3-pointer in 18 consecutive games end at Kentucky (Feb. 4), which was the fourth-longest streak in UF history ... posted a team-best streak of 22 consecutive made free throws ... became seventh Gator to record 100 career 3-pointers (Jan. 25 at South Carolina) ... collected nine steals against Stetson (Dec. 18), one shy of the school record shared by DeLisha Milton and Cathy Bell ... Preseason Naismith National Player of the Year candidate, one of 50 players selected ... team-leading 24 double-figure scoring games ... seven 20-point scoring games.

Second Team All-SEC, as selected by the league's coaches and media ... voted to the All-SEC Freshmen Team ... played in all 30 games, starting 29 games and scoring in 29 ... UF's second-leading scorer (13.7 ppg) ... led Gators with 65 steals and 61 three-pointers, hitting at least one in 24 games ... scored at least 22 points in four of the last six games, tying her then-career-high of 25 twice (LSU & Tennessee) ... ended the season hitting at least one 3-pointer in 11 consecutive games ... in the SEC (all games), ranked No. 9 in scoring, No. 12 in free throw percentage, No. 4 in three-pointers made, No. 14 for 3-point field goal percentage and No. 5 in steals ... honored four times as SEC Freshman of the Week, last for the span of Feb. 20-26, when she matched her career-high of 25 points in the upset at No. 5 Tennessee (Feb. 26), hitting two free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining in overtime to give the Gators a four-point lead ... her third of four three-pointers against LSU (Feb. 16), broke UF's freshman record of 49 treys set by Talatha Bingham in 1996 ... UF's leading scorer nine times ... led the Gators with a then-career-high 25 points in the upset win over No. 2 LSU (Feb. 16), when she also collected five steals ... exploded for a game-high 21 points in the win at No. 21 Kentucky (Feb. 5), including a pivotal three-point play with 1:21 remaining ... hit 17 consecutive free throws (spanning the games against Rhode Island and Liberty), with the streak ending against Liberty but still hitting 11-of-12 that game ... scored 10 of her 11 points in the final 4:23 of the game against Rhode Island, as she hit two free throws to push UF's advantage back to nine at 65-56 with 3:54 left ... three times tied UF's freshmen record with five 3-pointers in a game (Nov. 27 vs. Stetson, Dec. 21 vs. FAMU & Feb. 2 vs. Auburn) ... scored 17 of UF's first 22 points versus Stetson, on 5-of-5 shooting from behind the arc, finishing with a game-high 19 points while hitting 5-of-7 from deep along with five assists ... received the starting nod at the point guard spot for the season-opening game against St. Francis, replacing senior Sarah Lowe, who was interviewing for the Rhodes Scholarship, becoming the first true freshman to start a season-opener since Lowe and senior Brittany Davis earned starts in the initial game of the 2002-03 campaign ... led a balanced scoring attack in both wins during the season-opening Seton Hall Basketball Classic, netting 13 against St. Francis (NY) in her collegiate debut, before recording 18 points with seven steals in 40 minutes of action against Seton Hall ... 21 double-figure scoring games.

One of five Gators who played in all 33 games ... averaged 10.9 minutes off the bench, even seeing time at the '4' position ... scored in 20 games ... grabbed at least one rebound in all but eight games ... totaled 92 points, more than doubling her scoring total from 2006-07 (40) ... in the season-finale at N.C.
