## 2009 SEC Tournament



On Feb. 7, 1980, the first SEC women's basketball tournament began play. It ended four days later with Tennessee defeating Ole Miss for the title.

Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament

then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001 the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008), North Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006, 2009), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007).

This season, Vanderbilt defeated the Auburn Tigers 61-54 to win the SEC tournament for the sixth time. It was the 10th straight year the No. 1 seed failed to win the SEC tournament.

The All-Tournament team consisted of DeWanna Bonner, Auburn; Whitney Boddie, Auburn; Angie Bjorklund, Tennessee; Jennifer Risper, Vanderbilt and MVP Christina Wirth, Vanderbilt.

Total Attendance for the 2009 tournament was 24,277. Session Attendance was as follows: Session 1: 2952; Session 2: 3880; Session 3: 3386; Session 4: 5041; Session 5: 5757; Session 6: 3261.

## Team Notes

### Alabama Crimson Tide

Alabama ended its season with a 68-49 loss to Tennessee in the first round of the SEC Tournament. With the loss, the Crimson Tide finished with a record of 13-17 overall and 1-13 in the conference. Alabama, under first-year head coach Wendell Hudson, won five more games than it did last season and got off to its best start since the 2000-01 season going 12-3. In addition, the Tide scored nearly 10 points more on average than it did last season and 8.3 less turnovers per contest.

### Arkansas Razorbacks

Making their first postseason appearance in five years, the Arkansas Razorbacks finished the season 18-14 in the WNIT Sweet 16. Leading scorer Ceira Ricketts became the first Razorback player to sweep rookie honors as the SEC Co-Freshman of the Year and the Associated Press Newcomer of the Year. Junior Charity Ford became the first Arkansas women's basketball player to receive Sixth Player of the Year. Ricketts and Lyndsay Harris were SEC All-Freshman, only the second teammates to earn the honor. Seniors Whitney Jones and Ayana Brereton closed their careers with their first-ever postseason appearance. The Razorbacks return three starters for next season with head coach Tom Collen.

### Auburn Tigers

The Auburn women's basketball team concluded its 2008-09 season in the second round of the NCAA Tournament with an 80-52 loss at seventh-seeded Rutgers. The Tigers finish the season 30-4, the fourth-best season ever at Auburn by total number of wins. The second-round appearance came after Auburn downed Lehigh, 85-49, in the first round - Auburn's biggest win ever in the NCAA Tournament. It marked the first time for AU to make the second round since 2004. National Player of the Year Finalist DeWanna Bonner led the Tigers against Lehigh with 26 points and seven rebounds. Senior Trevesha Jackson followed with 11 points and a team-high eight rebounds. In the second-round game at Rutgers, Bonner led the Tigers with 17 points and nine rebounds. With her nine assists against Lehigh, Nancy Lieberman Point Guard of the Year Finalist Whitney Boddie became Auburn's all-time assist leader. Bonner also made the record book over the weekend, becoming Auburn's single-season scoring record holder with her 17 points against the Scarlet Knights. The game at Rutgers was the last for Auburn's senior class of Bonner, Boddie, Jackson and Sherell Hobbs.

### Florida Gators

One of the finest seasons in Gator women's basketball history came to a close in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The 2008-09 Florida squad tied a program record with 24 wins also achieved by the 1995 (24-9), 1997 (24-9) and 2001 teams. The 2009 NCAA Tournament is Florida's 15th postseason appearance in the last 17 years. Amanda Butler is the eighth different full-time head coach in the 35-year history of the Florida women's basketball program and became the first to guide the Gators to a postseason berth in each of her first two years. The Gators will graduate four

seniors from this year's team: Sha Brooks, Kim Critton, Marshae Dotson and Aneika Henry. The quartet finished its Florida career with two NCAA Tournament appearances and a record of 72-53 during the four-year stretch. That group of seniors was part of three teams that posted 19 or more wins and advanced to postseason play. Brooks and Dotson were voted First Team All-SEC performers by the league's coaches this season and let their impressions throughout the Gator career record book. Other team highlights from the season included a top-10 national ranking for the first time since Feb. of 2001, compiling a program-record 15-game winning streak and a program-record seven-game SEC win streak.

### Georgia Lady Bulldogs

Georgia finished the season with an 18-14 record, the 30th consecutive winning season under Andy Landers. The Lady Bulldogs earned their 26th NCAA Tournament bid and moved into sole possession of the No. 2 spot among national leaders in all-time "March Madness" invitations. Ashley Houts led the SEC in minutes played for a second straight year and broke her own Georgia season record for game action by playing 37.7 mpg. Angel Robinson led the SEC in rebounding, the fourth Lady Bulldog to do so and the first since Tammye Jenkins in 1987-88. Houts was named second-team All-SEC by both league coaches and the AP, while Robinson was a second-team selection by coaches and an honorable mention selection by the AP. Georgia's lone senior, team co-captain Danielle Taylor, enjoyed a solid final season in Athens. After reaching double figures in two games during her first three seasons with the Lady Bulldogs, Taylor posted eight double-digit performances in 2008-09. Georgia will welcome one of the nation's top-five recruiting classes this fall when Anne Marie Armstrong, Jasmine Hassell, Jasmine James and Tamika Willis – who all rank among the country's top-50 prospects by various recruiting services – join the Lady Bulldogs.

### Kentucky Wildcats

Kentucky ended its 2008-09 season with a heartbreaking 49-45 loss to Wisconsin in the second round of the Women's Invitation Tournament. The Cats shot a dismal 27.5 percent from the floor, their second-lowest shooting performance of the season. Seniors Carly Ormerod and Eleia Roddy led the Wildcats with 11 points each while sophomore Victoria Dunlap grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds to go along with eight points and three blocks. Roddy also grabbed double-digit rebounds with 11, marking her 16th career and SEC-high 12th double-double of the season. The Cats participated in their school-record fifth consecutive post season tournament and won 16 wins for the fifth straight season.

### LSU Lady Tigers

The LSU women's basketball team saw its season come to an end with a 62-52 loss to No. 7 Louisville in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Baton Rouge on Tuesday night. The Lady Tigers enjoyed a remarkable season, reaching the tournament for the 11th straight year and posting a 19-11

overall record to go with a 10-4 mark in league play. Allison Hightower finished her junior season with a team-best 14.9 point per game average, and she led the Lady Tigers in nearly every category. LSU loses only one senior in Kristen Morris. Hightower had a career-high 26 points in LSU's first round win over Green Bay. The Lady Tigers won by a score of 69-59 before falling to Louisville.

### Ole Miss Rebels

The Ole Miss women's basketball team finished its season with an 18-15 overall mark and a 5-9 ledger inside the Southeastern Conference. Rebel head coach Renee Ladner guided her team to five more wins than in her first season at Ole Miss in 2007-08. After an up-and-down regular season, the Rebels entered the SEC Tournament as the No. 9 seed and defeated eighth-seeded Arkansas in the opening game to reach the quarterfinals for the sixth straight season. Despite falling to top-seeded Auburn in the following game, Ole Miss still earned a berth in the WNIT to reach the postseason for the fifth time in the last six seasons. The Rebels defeated Murray State in the second round of the WNIT before losing to eventual champion USF in the third round. Individually, the Rebels were led this season by junior guard Bianca Thomas. Thomas finished the season third in the SEC in scoring and among the league leaders in three-point percentage and free throw percentage. She set a new school record for most three-pointers in a season as she finished the year with 73 treys. She was named to the All-SEC first team by the league coaches and to the All-SEC second team by the AP. Thomas was also selected as one of the three finalists for the Cellular South Gillom Trophy Award, given annually to the top female basketball player in the state of Mississippi. Expectations are high for next season as Ole Miss returns four starters and six of its top seven players overall.

### Mississippi State Lady Bulldogs

The season for the Mississippi State women's basketball squad came to a halt Monday evening as the Lady Bulldogs dropped a 63-58 decision to Ohio State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Columbus, Ohio. State concluded the season with a school second-best record of 23-10. To reach the second round, Mississippi State defeated sixth-ranked Texas 71-63 in first round action. It marked the fourth-straight time that State had won its first round game in the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Bulldogs have now reached the NCAA Tournament five times but have yet to reach the Sweet 16. Next season, State will anticipate the return of 11 players off this year's squad including five players that started this season.

### South Carolina Gamecocks

South Carolina closed its season with a loss to Mississippi State in the first round of the SEC Tournament. After losing their top two scorers and top rebounder just five games into the SEC schedule and holding a 9-9 record at the time, the Gamecocks finished the season 10-18 and 2-12 in league play. Freshman Lakeisha Sutton shone as she was forced into

the spotlight in the latter stages of the season, scoring 11.0 points per game overall, including 13.6 ppg against SEC foes, to become the first Gamecock on the SEC All-Freshman team since 2005-06.

### Tennessee Lady Volunteers

Tennessee finishes the 2008-09 season with a 22-11 record. The 22 wins recorded by the Lady Vols is the third fewest in school history and the 11 losses ties for the most in school history with the 1975-76 team which also had 11 in the loss column. UT had a program worst 4-8 record versus ranked teams. The 2008-09 Lady Vols lost to three unranked teams in a single season for the first time in school history. Previously, Tennessee lost to two unranked teams in each of the following seasons: 1980-81, 1981-82 and 1984-85. The Lady Vols .413 field goal percentage is the worst in UT history. The Lady Vols managed to connect on .661 of its free throw tries – third worst in school history. UT managed just 249 steals in 2008-09, the worst in school history. The Lady Vols scored just 837 field goals, the worst in school history. UT was bounced out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the 28-year history of the tournament. Coming into the 2009 NCAA Tournament, the Lady Vols had been 42-0 in First/Second Round games. Prior to losing to Ball State, the Lady Vols had been to 27 consecutive Sweet 16 games. UT's fifth-seeding was the program's worst for the NCAA Tournament. The Lady Vols still have an NCAA best 104-20 (.830) record in the Tournament all-time. Lady Vol coach Pat Summitt has an overall career record of 1,005-193 in 35 seasons, all at UT. Tennessee graduates one senior, 6-3 forward Alex Fuller, 7.5 ppg and 5.9 rpg. UT returns four starters and 10 players overall for 2009-10. The Lady Vols signed Taber Spani, a 6'1" home-schooled shooting guard from Lee's Summit, Mo., playing for the Metro Academy Mavericks; Kamiko Williams, a 5'11" combination guard from Northeast High School in Clarksville, Tenn., and Faith Dupree, a 6'3" post from The Webb School in Knoxville, Tenn.

### Vanderbilt Commodores

Vanderbilt advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the 14th time in school history after winning the program's sixth Southeastern Conference Tournament championship (VU's fourth in eight years). The Commodores posted a record of 26-9, winning 25-or-more games for the third consecutive season. For their careers, VU seniors Amy Malo, Jennifer Risper and Christina Wirth won 100 career games. Risper was named the 2009 WBCA National Defensive Player of the Year after earning similar honors from the SEC. The Most Valuable Player of the 2009 SEC Tournament, Wirth was named the 2009 SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was a finalist for numerous national awards. The Commodores will return eight letterwinners to next year's squad while welcoming four freshmen to Nashville for Head Coach Melanie Balcomb's eighth season in the Music City.

### Leader In Women's Basketball

The Southeastern Conference stands firmly as the nation's premier intercollegiate women's basketball conference. The league leads the nation with **EIGHT** national championships, **TEN** runner-up finishes, **34** Final Four appearances and **94** first-team All-America honors.

### SEC Ends 27th Season Of Conference Play

This was the 27th season of conference play for the SEC. Women's basketball first came under the auspices of the SEC in the 1982-83 season. Games played between SEC teams before that time are not counted in the all-time SEC standings, since there was no uniform number of conference games played prior to that time.

## SEC Postseason Notes

### .500 SEC Record Teams In NCAA Tournament

Thirteen SEC teams have received NCAA Tournament bids after posting sub .500 conference records. Only six teams have failed to receive a NCAA bid after posting a .500 record in SEC games, including last season's 8-6 Kentucky team.

In 1989, the Ole Miss team went 4-5 in league play but went on to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament before losing to SEC foe Auburn.

Since the SEC went to a 14-game schedule (1997-98 season), four teams have made the NCAA Tournament with a sub .500 league record. 1999 - Florida (6-8) lost in first round; 2000 - Vanderbilt (6-8) lost in second round; 2001 - Arkansas (6-8) lost in second round; 2002 - Georgia (6-8) lost in first round.

During that same span, eight teams have gone 7-7 in conference play and made the NCAA tournament. 1998 - Arkansas went 4-1 in postseason; 1999 - Alabama went 1-1, Kentucky went 1-1 and Mississippi State went 0-1; 2002 - Arkansas went 1-1; 2003 - Arkansas went 1-1; 2004 - Ole Miss went 0-1; 2008 - Auburn went 0-1.

### SEC Among Leaders In NCAA Tournament Bids

The SEC has led or shared the lead of bids the pack 21 times in the 28-year history of the women's NCAA tournament. The other six years look like this:

Until 2004, the SEC was the only conference to ever have eight teams receive NCAA bids. The league achieved this feat in 1999 and 2002. The league was also the first to have seven teams receive NCAA bids. The league has earned that honor eight times, including this season. Seven SEC teams danced to the postseason in 1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 2003, 2004 and 2009.

At least six teams from the SEC have reached the NCAA Tournament in 20 of the last 24 tournaments. The least number of conference teams getting bids was four (1985 and 1992), while the league has garnered five bids a total of six times.

### Postseason Tough

The SEC is one of a handful of leagues to have won three national tournament titles with eight NCAA, two WNIT and three NWIT. Along with the eight NCAA championships won by Tennessee, Arkansas (1999) and Auburn (2003) captured the current Women's NIT titles. But the first-ever SEC national title belongs to Georgia, winner of the 1981 NWIT which predates the current NCAA tournament. LSU (1985) and Kentucky (1990) also each won the NWIT title.

## Misc. Notes

### WNBA

Since the inaugural WNBA draft in 1997, the SEC has had 104 former players drafted for the professional league.

Last season, with 44 players to choose from, the SEC is the conference that has produced the most WNBA talent. Three schools - Tennessee, LSU and Georgia - account for 30 of the 44 players from the conference.

### All-Americans

The SEC has had 56 student-athletes named as a First-Team All-America selection. Those 56 have been named a total of 83 times since the 1982-83 season (first year of SEC sponsorship).

All-Americans were first named in women's basketball in 1975. Since that time, league schools have had 64 players named first-team a total of 95 times.

### Individual Honors

The league has had six Honda Sports Awards winners in Katrina McClain, Georgia (1987); Bridgette Gordon, Tennessee (1989); Chamique Holdsclaw, Tennessee (1997 and 1998); and Candace Parker, Tennessee (2007 and 2008).

Tennessee's Chamique Holdsclaw was named the winner of the Honda-Broderick Cup, as the Collegiate Woman Athlete of the Year, in 1998.
