SEC TOURNAMENT HISTORY

On Feb. 7, 1980, the first SEC Women's Basketball Tournament began play. It ended four days later with Tennessee defeating Ole Miss for the title. Fast forward 28 years later and the SEC Tournament continues to enjoy success and increased popularity.

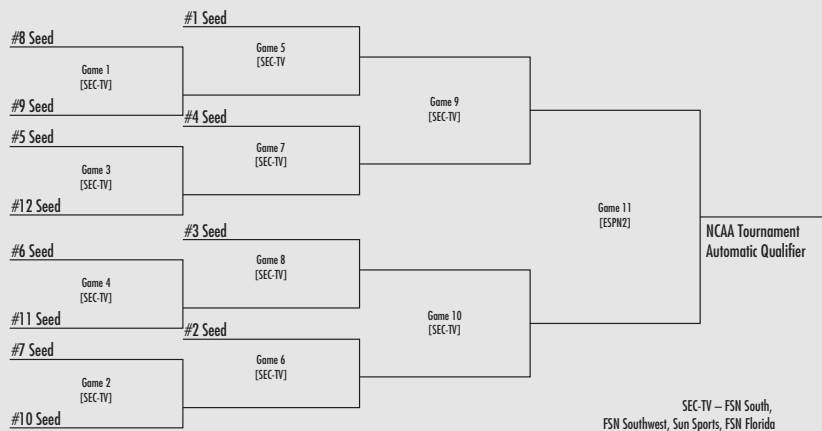
Beginning with its inception and through 1986, the tournament was held at campus sites. The tournament was then sent to Albany, Ga., which served as the site for six years from 1987-92. The tournament then moved to Chattanooga, Tenn., where it was held from 1993-2000, with the exception of 1998 when the tournament moved to Columbus, Ga.

Since 2001, the tournament has enjoyed many new sites, including Memphis (2001), Nashville (2002, 2004, 2008), North Little Rock, Ark. (2003, 2006), Greenville, S.C. (2005) and Duluth, Ga. (2007).
