FLORIDA FOOTBALL 2004

■ UF finished inside the Top 25 in the final coaches poll for the 15th consecutive season, the third longest active streak in the nation. Florida finished the season with a 7-5 record overall and was 4-4 in Southeastern Conference play. The Gators were ranked 25th in the final edition of the ESPN/USA Today poll and were the top team among others receiving votes in the final Associated Press poll with 85.

■ For the 32nd time in the history of the program, the University of Florida made a post-season bowl appearance as the Gators met Miami in the 2004 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. With its trip, Florida extended its school record of consecutive bowl games to 14.

URBAN MEYER NAMED HEAD COACH

■ On Saturday, Dec. 4, 2004, Urban Meyer was named the 21st head football coach at the University of Florida. Coach Meyer won multiple National Coach of the Year honors in 2003 and 2004 after posting a 22-2 record at Utah in two years (including a 12-0 season in 2004). He finished his Utah career with a 16-game winning streak, the second longest active streak in the nation at the time. On Tuesday, Dec. 7, 2004 University of Florida Athletics Director Jeremy Foley named UF defensive coordinator Charlie Strong interim head coach for the 2004 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. Strong became the third interim head coach in UF history. Galen Hall was named interim head coach for the final nine games of the 1984 season and Gary Darnell coached the final seven games of 1989.

SEASON NOTES

■ Florida changed its schedule three times in 2004 due to hurricanes. Florida's season-opening contest against Middle Tennessee State University scheduled for Sept. 4 was moved to Oct. 16 (Noon) due to Hurricane Frances. With the state of Florida still feeling the effects of that storm, UF moved its Sept. 11 meeting with Eastern Michigan from a 6 p.m. kickoff to 1 p.m. Due to Hurricane Jeanne, UF moved its 6 p.m. meeting with Kentucky up to 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 25, marking the first time in the modern era UF started a game before noon in Gainesville.

■ When UF moved the season opener, it marked the fourth time in school history a Gator football game had been moved or postponed and the second time it had affected a season opener (1957, 1964, 2001). In 1957, the Gator's season opener with UCLA was canceled when a flu epidemic struck the UF players.

■ The Gators finished the regular season on Nov. 20, 2004 with a 20-13 win against Florida State marking the first time since 1986 that the Gators defeated the Seminoles in Tallahassee.

■ UF has finished strong down the stretch each of the last three years. This season, Florida won each of its three final regular season games. The 2003 unit won three in a row and five of the last six to close the regular season. In 2002, the Gators won four of the last five regular season games.

■ Florida's eight regular season losses during the last two years were decided by a total of 45 points (5.6 per game) and five of the eight losses came to teams ranked inside the top 15 nationally.

■ Florida had six wins against ranked teams away from Gainesville the last three seasons, the top total in the nation over the three-year span.

■ Eight true freshman played for the Gators this season, two of which appeared in every game. Tate Casey and Brandon Siler appeared in every game. Javier Estopinan, Drew Miller, Phil Trautwein, Kyle Jackson, Tony Joiner and Eric Rutledge also played. Tate Casey, Brandon Siler and Kyle Jackson made the first starts of their career against Middle Tennessee State.

■ Only one SEC team (Arkansas - 18) lost more starters than did Florida entering the 2004 season, as UF lost 14 from the 2003 team.

GATOR STORYLINES

■ With the win at Florida State, the Gators secured the programs 17th consecutive winning season. Florida's current streak of 17 winning seasons is the longest in the SEC.

■ Florida finished the season leading the Southeastern Conference in 10 different statistical departments. A Florida player led the league in rushing, passing yards per game, total offense, receptions per game, scoring (touchdowns) and PAT (pct.). As a team, the Gators led the SEC in passing offense, total offense, third down conversions and PAT kicking.

■ Florida made its 14th consecutive bowl trip, which is the second longest active streak in the SEC (Tennessee, 15).

■ Florida began the 2003 season with only five players who started the fall semester in 1999. The total was up to eight in 2004 (Cory Bailey, Deshawn Carter, Jonathan Colon, Ronald Dowdy, Travis Harris, Kenny Parker, Matt Piotrowicz and O.J. Small).

■ Twelve of UF's last 25 games have been decided in the final two minutes of play.

■ The Gators returned eight starters this season on offense (5) and defense (3), which was the fifth-lowest amount for any team in the country. Arkansas returned four, Washington State and Air Force returned six, while San Jose State brought back seven starters (according to Sports Illustrated).

IN THE RED ZONE

■ Entering the 2004 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, the Gators had scored on 27 of their last 28 trips inside the red zone. UF was perfect in the red zone in eight out of 12 games in 2004 and allowed only four opponents to do so (Eastern Mich., 1-of-1; Arkansas and Mississippi State, 3-of-3; South Carolina, 2-of-2). The Gators did not allow Kentucky in the red zone, which marked the third time in three years an opponent was unable to do so (2003 vs. San Jose State, 2003 at LSU).

THE OFFENSE

■ Florida was first in the SEC and ranked 14th nationally in passing offense as the Gators threw for 271.1 yards per game this season. In addition, the Gators were 10th in the conference and were 58th in the nation in rushing offense with 155.8 yards on the ground per contest. Florida's total offense (426.9) was first in the league and 22nd in the country. UF averaged 31.8 points per game, which was second in the SEC and 19th nationally.

■ The Florida offense included the SEC's top running back in yards per game (Ciatrick Fason, 105.6), quarterback in passing yards per game and total offense (Chris Leak, 266.4 and 273.0) and the number one receiver in the league in terms of receptions per game (O.J. Small, 5.2). The Gator offense was just the second team in SEC history to finish the year with the top passer, rusher and receiver in the same season. The 1966 Gator team also accomplished the feat. The offense also became the first unit in SEC history (since records were kept beginning in 1970) to have the top passer, rusher, receiver and leader in total offense.

■ The Florida offense completed the season with 60 plays of 20-yards or more (45 receiving, 15 rushing). There were three games in which the Gators had six passes of 20-yards or more (vs. Middle Tennessee State, at Vanderbilt, vs. South Carolina).

■ Entering the Florida game, Florida State's defense led the nation in rush defense allowing 61.9 yards per game. The Gators more than doubled that total with 140 rushing yards.

■ Against the Seminoles, Florida's offense finished with 3.5 yards per carry against an FSU defense that led the country allowing just 1.87 yards per run. UF's Ciatrick Fason finished the night with 4.3 yards per carry and he averaged 6.0 yards per carry in the fourth quarter alone when he carried the ball 13 times for 86 yards.

■ Florida's 14-play, 97-yard touchdown drive in the first quarter of the Florida State game was the longest the Seminoles had surrendered all season and tied for the longest drive in terms of yards the Gators had driven in 2004. UF had a 16-play, 97-yard drive at Tennessee.

■ Only three teams in Florida football history have lost less fumbles than the 2004 team. UF lost just eight this season.

2004 SEASON REVIEW...

■ Florida led the SEC with 18 scoring drives under two minutes. UF scored five times on one play drives this season.

■ This season, the Gators were 79-of-165 (47.9 percent) on third down attempts. The total was the highest in the SEC and the best for Florida since 1995 (49.7). It was also the fourth highest conversion rate since Florida charted the statistic beginning in 1979.

■ The Florida offense scored on 62-of-157 offensive possessions this season and converted an opponent turnover into a touchdown in nine out of 12 games this season.

■ UF had over 400 yards of total offense in 10 out of 12 games this season.

■ The Gators have led the SEC in passing offense three of the last four years and nine of the last 15. In addition, UF has led the league in total offense in five of the last 10 seasons.

QUARTERBACKS

■ Chris Leak ranked first in the SEC in passing yards per game as he averaged 266.4 per outing. Leak ranked first in the SEC and 16th in the country in total offense as he accounted for 273.0 yards per game. Leak's passing efficiency (144.9) was the third highest total in the league and ranked 16th nationally.

■ Chris Leak has passed for 5,640 yards in his career, which is eighth on the career passing yardage chart (SEE PAGE 10 FOR CHARTS).

■ With his 19 completions against Miami, Chris Leak has 428 on his career which is eighth in school history. Leak stands at eighth on the Florida career attempts list. With 39 against the Hurricanes, Leak has 699 in his career (SEE PAGE 10 FOR CHARTS).

■ Against Miami in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Chris Leak threw for 262 yards, for his 17th career 200-yard effort. His effort ranks sixth on the school's all-time list for 200-yard games. Leak eclipsed 200 yards in 11 of Florida's 12 games this season to tie the school record for 200-yard games in a year (Rex Grossman, 2001; Danny Wuerffel, 1996; Shane Matthews, 1991).

■ This season, Chris Leak threw 29 touchdown passes after throwing 16 as a true freshman in 2003. Leak threw at least two touchdown passes in nine out of 12 games this season and in seven of the last nine. Leak's 29 touchdowns were the fourth highest total in school history and his 45 career touchdown passes rank seventh on Florida's career passing TD chart (SEE CHARTS ON PAGE 10).

■ Chris Leak's 45 touchdown passes through his sophomore season rank as the second best freshman and sophomore year combined total in school history. Rex Grossman established an NCAA record with 55 in 2000 and 2001.

■ In the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl game vs. Miami, Chris Leak passed Errict Rhett (1990-93) in career yardage (passing, rushing and receiving). Leak now has 5,688 yards on his career and ranks eighth in school history in the department (SEE CHART ON PAGE 10).

■ This season, Chris Leak threw for 3,197 yards which was the sixth highest single season total in school history. Leak was the fourth Gator in school history to throw for more than 3,000 yards in a season (SEE CHART ON PAGE 10).

■ Chris Leak made his 21st career start in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl against Miami. Leak now owns a 13-8 record in starts on the collegiate level.

■ Against South Carolina, Chris Leak threw for a career-high six touchdown passes. The total was the highest thrown by an SEC quarterback in a single game this season and tied UF's school record for most TD tosses against an SEC opponents. Danny Wuerffel had six against Tennessee in 1995 and against Alabama in 1996.

■ UF has thrown for at least 245 yards per game for 15 consecutive years. The Gators averaged 271.1 passing yards per game in 2004.

■ Florida quarterback Chris Leak is 59-8 in his last 67 games as a starting quarterback. He won 46 in a row at Independence High School and then his first start at Florida (at Kentucky). His eight losses have been to Ole Miss, Florida State, Iowa, Tennessee, LSU, Mississippi State, Georgia and Miami.

■ In the first six games of his UF career, Chris Leak threw six interceptions in the fourth quarter alone. From that point, Leak has only thrown four in the final quarter of his last 19 games.

2004 SEASON REVIEW...

RUNNING BACKS

■ The Gators' ground game averaged 155.8 rushing yards per game on the year. This is up 9.8 yards over last year when the Gators averaged 146.0 rushing yards and finished seventh in the SEC. In addition, the average from the 2004 season was the highest for a Gator squad in eight seasons. Florida's 155.8 rushing yards per game in 2004 continued improvement as the Gators averaged 136.2 rushing yards per game in 2002.

■ Florida's 4.5 yards per carry in 2004 ranked as the fourth highest total in the SEC and was the best average since 1999. Over the past three seasons, UF has shown progress in the department. The 2002 squad averaged 3.8 yards per carry and in 2003 the Gators rushed for 4.2 yards per attempt.

■ Ciatrick Fason became the first Gator to lead the SEC in rushing since Errick Rhett (1993) with 105.6 yards per game, which ranked 19th nationally. It marked the eighth time in school history a UF player has led the league in the department as Fason was the sixth different Gator to do so.

■ Ciatrick Fason finished second in the conference and 37th nationally in all-purpose yards with 127.8 yards per game. Fason finished the year tied for fifth in the SEC in scoring with Auburn's Carnell Williams as they averaged 6.0 points per outing. Fason's 5.7 yards per carry tied Tennessee's Gerald Riggs Jr. for the third highest total in the league this season.

■ With 170 rushing yards at Vanderbilt, Ciatrick Fason became the seventh different Gator to rush for more than 1,000 or more in a single season. Fason finished 2004 with 1,267 rushing yards on the year, which was the sixth highest single season total in UF history, and reached the 1,000 yard mark in nine games. He was the fourth quickest Gator to run for more than 1,000 yards in a single season. Only Emmitt Smith (seven games in 1987 and 1989), Jimmy DuBose (eight games in 1975) and Errick Rhett (eight games in 1993) reached 1,000 yards quicker.

■ Ciatrick Fason became the third different running back in the past four seasons and the fourth overall that UF running backs coach/recruiting coordinator Mike Locksley has had to rush for more than 1,000 yards in a season. In addition, Fason was the fourth different running back in the last six years that Locksley has worked with that led the league in rushing yards.

■ Against Florida State, Ciatrick Fason became the seventh Gator in school history to post 10-or-more rushing touchdowns in a single season. Emmitt Smith (1989) and Buford Long (1952) own the school record with 14 each. Fason finished the 2004 campaign with 10 rushing touchdowns, which accounted for half of UF's rushing TD total. He ran for one less touchdown than did UF opponents on the year.

■ Ciatrick Fason scored a touchdown and rushed for at least 80 yards in seven of Florida's 12 games this season.

■ In the game against Florida State, Ciatrick Fason finished the night with 103 yards on 24 carries. Fason became the first player since Miami's Jarrett Payton in the 2004 Orange Bowl to rush for more than 100 yards on the Seminole defense.

■ Billy Latsko caught 11 passes for 76 yards and two touchdowns this season. Last season, Latsko finished the year with two catches. The last UF fullback to catch 11 passes in a season was Kevin Randolph who caught 17 for 152 yards in 1992.

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

■ O.J. Small led the SEC and was 39th in the country with 5.25 receptions per game. Small, Andre Caldwell and Chad Jackson ranked fourth, fifth and 10th in the league in receiving yards per game with 59.9, 57.4 and 54.0 receiving yards per game, respectively. Florida was the only team in the league with three players ranked in the top 10 of the category.

■ O.J. Small completed his career with at least one catch in 30 straight games, which was the third longest streak in school history:

■ O.J. Small finished the season with a team-leading 63 catches. He was the first Gator to catch more than 50 passes in a season since Taylor Jacobs caught 71 in 2002. Small's total tied Richard Trapp (1966) for the 10th highest single season total in school history. In addition, Small finished his career with 117 receptions to match Ricky Nattiel (1983-86) at 16th on UF's career receptions chart.

2004 TEAM RECORDS

The Offense

■ UF averaged 271.1 passing yard per game, which ranked as the 11th highest total in school history and the best since 2001.

■ Florida's 426.9 total yards per game finished as the 10th highest total in school history. It also marked the 18th time in the history of the program that the Florida offense averaged 400-or-more yards per game.

■ The Gators averaged 31.8 points per game in 2004, which was the 11th best performance in UF history.

■ UF's 29 passing touchdowns this season were the 10th highest total in school history.

■ The Gators rushed for 20 touchdowns in 2004 to tie the 1997, 2000 and 2002 squads at 13th on UF's all-time chart.

■ UF ran 822 plays in 2004, the 13th highest total in school history.

■ The Gators averaged 21.6 first downs per game, which was the 12th best total ever by a UF team.

■ Florida completed 59.7 percent of its passes, which ranked 10th in school history.

■ UF completed 243 passes in 2004, the ninth highest total by a Gator squad.

■ Florida's 4.5 yards per rushing attempt tied the 1948, 1974 and 1999 teams for the 10th highest total in school history.

■ UF's 6.2 yards per play in 2004 was the eighth highest total by a Florida squad.

■ The Gators converted 79 third downs in 2004, which tied 1984 for the third highest amount by a Florida squad.

The Defense

■ Florida allowed only 11 rushing touchdowns in 2004, the fewest since 1994.

■ The UF defense held opponents to 3.7 yards per rush for the third time in the past five years.

■ Florida's 74 tackles for loss in 2004 were the highest total since UF began tracking the statistic in 1979.

■ UF intercepted 17 passes this season, matching the 1989 team for the 12th best total in school history.

Special Teams

■ UF blocked four kicks in 2004, which ranked as the fourth highest total that Florida records indicate. The total matched the number blocked by the 1978, 1990 and 2002 squads.

■ Florida allowed opponents 16.6 yards per kick return, which was the eight lowest total in school history.

■ Tate Casey's four touchdown receptions this season came on eight catches and were the most by a true freshman since Reidel Anthony set the school record with five touchdown catches in 1994. Ike Hilliard also had four touchdown catches as a true freshman that season.

■ Chad Jackson caught 29 passes for 648 yards this season. His average of 22.3 yards per catch this year was a single season Florida record (min. 25 catches). Jackson edged Wes Chandler who caught 44 for 967 in 1976 (22.0 avg.). Jackson's average yards per catch total ranked third nationally among wide receivers with at least 25 catches this season.

■ Chad Jackson caught two passes of 65-yards-or-more this season (81-yard reception at Tennessee and a 65-yard reception against Kentucky). The last time a Florida receiver had two plays of over 65 yards in the same season was Darrell Jackson in 1999. Jackson caught a 73-yard touchdown pass from Doug Johnson versus Alabama and had another 73-yard reception from Johnson in the next game versus Arkansas.

■ Chad Jackson's 81-yard touchdown reception against Tennessee was the longest of his career and the longest by a Gator since Jacquez Green's 85-yard touchdown reception in the 1996 SEC title game against Alabama. The reception also topped his previous career-high for yards in a game, which was 38 against San Jose State. The pass was also the longest against the Vols all season.

■ Andre Caldwell's 61-yard touchdown run in the second quarter of the Arkansas game was the first of his career and the longest run by a Gator this season. The run was the longest by a non-running back since Terry LeCount's 74-yard run against Utah in 1977.

OFFENSIVE LINE

■ During the regular season, UF gave up 14 sacks to lead the SEC in sacks against per attempt:

1. Florida	14 sacks, 368 passing attempts	26.2 attempt average
2. Arkansas	14 sacks, 286 passing attempts	20.4 attempt average
3. Alabama	13 sacks, 225 passing attempts	17.3 attempt average

■ Florida opened with the following players on the offensive line seven times during 2004 Jon Colon(LT), Lance Butler (LG), Mike Degory (C), Mo Mitchell (RG) and Randy Hand (RT). Steven Rissler was the right guard for the season opener against Eastern Michigan and against against South Carolina. Butler shifted to left tackle against Georgia and Vanderbilt and and Anthony Guerrero was the left guard. Guerrero also started the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl against Miami at left tackle in place of Colon who was ill.

■ Mike Degory has started each of the 38 games of his collegiate career, marking the longest active streak on the team.

■ Senior Mo Mitchell returned to the offense this season after playing 12 games on the defensive front last season. Mitchell has started 15 career games on the offensive line.

THE DEFENSE

■ Florida's defense ranked sixth in the conference and 42nd in the country as the Gators allowed 345.6 yards per game. UF's rushing defense was seventh in the conference and 53rd in the nation as it allowed 141.9 yards per contest. The Gators ranked fifth in the conference and 27th in the nation in pass efficiency defense (111.3). In addition, the Florida defense was sixth in the league and 31st in the nation in scoring defense giving up 21.1 points per game.

■ Florida's defense improved in the following categories from the 2003 season to 2004: rushing yards per attempt, yards rushing per game, average yards per catch, average yards per completion, yards per play and yards per game.

■ Florida's defense held Florida State to a season-low 34 rushing yards. The last time a defense held the Seminoles to less than 50 rushing yards was when Clemson limited FSU to 11 rushing yards in 2003. UF's defense held FSU to eight carries for no rushing yards in the first half.

■ The Florida defense allowed only three touchdowns in the third quarter this season.

■ The Florida defense held its opponents top rusher to under 100 yards in 10 of 12 games this year.

■ In the 25 games since Charlie Strong took over as Florida's defensive coordinator, the Gators have scored points off turnovers in 19 games.

■ Dating back to last season, the Gators have given up only 11 touchdowns on the ground in the last 49 quarters of play.

2004 SEASON REVIEW...

■ The Gators had 24 takeaways in 2004 after leading the SEC with 31 takeaways in 2003. In 2003, the Gators set a school record with four interceptions returned for touchdowns and also tied a school record with six defensive scores overall.

■ UF has ranked among the top three teams in the SEC in total defense 15 times in the last 25 years.

LINEBACKERS

■ Brandon Siler was the second true freshman in school history to lead the Gators in tackles as he finished the season with 77. Scot Brantley was the only other true freshman to do so with 145 in 1976. Siler had six of his 9.5 tackles for loss this season in the last three games of the year. Siler led all SEC freshmen in tackles during the regular season, marking the second straight year UF had the league's top freshman tackler.

■ Against Florida State, injuries kept Channing Crowder on the sideline for much of the game. In addition, Travis Harris returned to started for the first time since the Georgia game and Todd McCullough was out for the third straight week. Earl Everett, who missed the Vanderbilt game, returned to start against South Carolina on Nov. 13. With all four of UF's top linebackers out against the Commodores earlier this year, Alvin Butler became the second freshman walk-on linebacker to start a game. Pat Moorer started as a freshman linebacker in 1986.

■ Linebacker Brandon Siler was one of two true freshmen to play for the Gators in each game this season (TE Tate Casey was the other).

■ Channing Crowder had 73 tackles and finished his career leading the Gators in tackles 11 times in the last 18 games. Crowder was Florida's third leading tackler, despite playing in nine games this season and missing a large portion of the Georgia and Florida State games.

■ Junior Todd McCullough returned to the unit against Eastern Michigan after undergoing shoulder surgery prior to the Ole Miss game in 2003. McCullough's fumble recovery on the goal line during the Georgia game was his first of his career. He was one of five different Gators to recover a fumble in 2004.

■ Senior Travis Harris rejoined the linebacker unit in the spring of 2004. Harris played the 2003 season as a defensive end after spending the 2002 season as a backup linebacker and playing on special teams. Harris missed the 2001 season with a shoulder injury. This season, Harris had 23 tackles, 2.5 of which were for a loss. He has also forced a fumble and blocked a field goal. In the Middle Tennessee game, Harris made the first interception of his career.

■ Against Mississippi State, Channing Crowder recorded a career-high 18 tackles and also forced a fumble. Crowder's 18 tackles tied three others for the most in a single game by a player in the SEC in 2004 (Kelechi Ohanjara, Vanderbilt; Titus Brown, MSU; Omar Gaither, Tenn.).

DEFENSIVE LINE

■ Defensive end Jeremy Mincey finished second on the team with seven pass break ups this season. Mincey led the Gators in quarterback hurries with seven. His 9.0 tackles for loss were the third highest total on the team. Against South Carolina, Mincey made the first interception of his career. Mincey's 4.2 tackles per game this season finished as the seventh best total by a defensive lineman in the SEC.

■ Defensive tackle Ray McDonald led the UF in tackles for loss with 10.0. Three of those came against Florida State.

■ UF returned three of its top five tacklers up front after losing all five a season ago. In addition, UF returned seven of its top 10 tacklers on the line after losing seven of its top nine going into 2003.

■ For the second consecutive season, UF had to replace both of its starting defensive ends (Darrell Lee and Bobby McCray). Jeremy Mincey and Joe Cohen started every game at defensive end in 2004.

SECONDARY

■ Florida has 17 interceptions this year after returning defensive backs entered the season with four career interceptions to their credit. UF has had an interception in eight of 12 games. UF's 17 interceptions this season tied with South Carolina for the highest amount by any SEC team. Jarvis Herring led the team with four interceptions, which was the third highest total by any SEC player in 2004. Terrence Holmes finished the year with three, which tied Vanderbilt's Bill Alford for ninth in the conference.

■ The Gators are 97-22-1 in games played in the state of Florida (81-11 in Gainesville, 12-2 in Jacksonville, 2-1 in Orlando, 1-0 in Miami, 1-6-1 in Tallahassee, 0-2 in Tampa).

■ 95-5 vs. unranked teams at game time.

2004 SEASON REVIEW...

■ Last season, Florida finished with 20 interceptions. When added to the 17 during 2004, the two-year total of 37 was the highest since the Gators had 22 in 1982 and 19 in 1983.

■ Dee Webb's 10 pass breakups this season led the Gators and were tied with Auburn's Carlos Rogers for the fourth highest total by any player in the SEC. Webb also finished fifth in the conference in passes defended with 10 pass breakups and three interceptions.

■ Kyle Jackson had two interceptions in the South Carolina game, marking the first UF true freshman since Daryl Dixon (vs. LSU, 1999) to have two in a single game. The total was the highest amount by any Gator in a single game in 2004.

■ Heading into 2004, Florida returned only three players to the defense who had been a starter the previous season and all were in the secondary. This year, the secondary was the only part of the unit that did not return a starter.

SPECIAL TEAMS

■ UF's Eric Wilbur ranked third in the SEC and 33rd in the country as he averaged 42.3 yards per punt this season. Wilbur's average was the highest by a sophomore in Florida history and his career average ranks second (43.6). As a team, UF averaged 42.0 yards per punt this season, which was the seventh best total in school history.

■ Florida gave up only 16.6 yards per kickoff return this season, which ranked second in the SEC and sixth nationally. It was also the eighth lowest total allowed in school history and second lowest since 1987.

■ Vernell Brown was sixth in the SEC and 69th in the nation in punt returns as he averaged 7.7 yards every time he handled the ball.

■ Tremaine McCollum's blocked punt in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl against Miami was the fourth blocked kick by a Gator this season. In 2003, UF finished the season with three blocked kicks and in 2002, UF had four total blocks (field goals and punts):

■ With 49 extra points this season, Matt Leach finished the year tied for fifth in school history with Jeff Chandler (2000, 53 att.) and passed his single season high (41, 2002).

■ Eric Wilbur capped the season by having a punt of 50 yards or longer in six of the last eight games he punted in and seven games overall in 2004. On the year, he kicked 11 punts 50-yards or further, three of which came in the Florida State game including a season-long 57-yard kick. In addition, Wilbur landed 11 punts inside the opponents 20-yard line this season.

■ Matt Leach finished his career making 104 consecutive extra points which ranked second on Florida's all-time chart in the department. The school record is held by Bart Edmiston (114, 1992-96). Leach also is on Florida's all-time chart for career PATs with 120, which is the fourth highest total in school history.

■ Matt Piotrowicz handled the kickoff duties for the fourth consecutive year. He was tied for third on the squad with eight special teams tackles in 2003 and this season he led the team with eight. Piotrowicz had 29 touchbacks (on 74 kicks) for the year.

■ Against Georgia, Matt Leach nailed a career-long field goal of 52 yards, which was the eighth longest field goal in school history.

■ Chad Jackson's 47-yard kickoff return against Eastern Michigan was the longest by a Gator since Kelvin Knight's 59-yard kickoff return at Arkansas on Oct. 18, 2003. The return was the longest of Jackson's career. His previous long was a 28-yard return in the 2004 Outback Bowl against Iowa.

■ Vernell Brown recorded a career long 43-yard punt return in fourth quarter of the Kentucky game. Brown's return against Kentucky was the longest since Lito Sheppard's 57-yard return against South Carolina in 2000.

■ In 2004, UF outscored opponents 248-144 in the red zone. UF scored 16 times through the air and 16 times on the ground. The Gators scored 21-or-more points in the red zone in six out of 12 games this season.

■ Florida allowed only Tennessee, LSU and Vanderbilt to enter the red zone four-or-more times in a game in 2004. The Gators did so four-or-more times in nine of 12 games.

■ Over the last three years, the Gators scored 54-of-63 times inside the red zone against non-conference opponents (85.7 percent).

■ UF did not allow Eastern Michigan, Kentucky, Middle Tennessee State or Florida State to score a touchdown from inside the red zone. The UF offense scored red zone touchdowns in 11 of 12 games on the year.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2005...

THE SCHEDULE

■ UF opens the season on Sept. 3, 2005, against Wyoming marking the first time UF has played an opponent from the Mountain West Conference since facing New Mexico in 1989. UF is 4-0 against teams from the Mountain West Conference all-time. The Gators start the season off with three straight home games and four of the first six games in Gainesville.

THE TEAM

■ Florida is projected to return 64 scholarship players to the 2005 squad.

■ Entering the 2005 season, UF's returning leaders in each of the following departments are projected to return: passing, receiving yards, punt returns, interceptions, kick returns, total offense, punting, tackles, tackles for loss and sacks. UF should also return five of its top six leaders in tackles.

■ The Gators should return seven starters on offense and lose four, while the defense will do the same. However, after losing two-three year starters and six two-year starters going into 2004, UF should only lose five two-year starters heading into 2005 (LB Channing Crowder, LB Travis Harris, WR O.J. Small, OL Jonathan Colon and OL Mo Mitchell) and no three-year starters.

■ Overall, the Gators should return 25 players who made at least one start during the 2004 season (UF returned 19 in 2002 and 2003). They should also lose only eight players who started at least one game after losing 17 going into the 2004 season.

■ Going into 2004, the Gators brought back nine players who started in the fall semester of 2000. In 2003, UF returned only five players who began their careers in the fall semester of 1999. In 2005, the Gators are projected to return seven players who began playing for UF in the fall semester of 2001 (Dallas Baker, Vernell Brown, Lance Butler, Deshawn Carter, Mike Degory, Jarvis Herring, Todd McCullough)

THE OFFENSE

■ Returning to the offense should be WR Jemalle Cornelius, LG Lance Butler, C Mike Degory, RT Randy Hand, TE Markell Thompson, WR Andre Caldwell, QB Chris Leak. Departing are RB Ciatrick Fason, WR O.J. Small, LT Jonathan Colon and RG Mo Mitchell.

■ Florida's offense entered the 2004 season with its top quarterback, four of its top five rushers and its fourth leading receiver. Again in 2005, UF should enter the season with its top quarterback (Chris Leak). UF is projected to return eight of the nine players that carried the ball at least once and 13 of the 15 players that had at least

one catch in 2004.

■ The 2005 Gator roster is projected to include eight different players who accounted for 37 of UF's 45 receptions of 20-plus yards in the 2004 regular season.

THE DEFENSE

■ Returning to the defense should be DE Joe Cohen, DT Marcus Thomas, DT Ray McDonald, DE Jeremy Mincey, LB Earl Everett, CB Dee Webb, FS Jarvis Herring. Florida will lose LB Channing Crowder, LB Travis Harris, CB Reynaldo Hill and SS Cory Bailey.

■ Entering 2003, the linebacker unit had to replace 316 tackles due to departing seniors from the previous year. Going into the 2004 season the group only needed to replace 124 tackles. UF should enter the 2005 campaign needing to replace 93.

■ UF should return all of its top seven tacklers among the defensive line.

■ Last year, the secondary entered the season looking to replace each of the four starters from the secondary. In 2005, UF should need to replace only two. UF entered 2003 with just four interceptions among those returning to the secondary. In 2004, junior free safety Jarvis Herring led the unit with four.

SPECIAL TEAMS

■ As far as special teams go, UF should return its leading punter (Eric Wilbur), but will need to replace its top place kicker (Matt Leach), kickoff specialist (Matt Piotrowicz) and long snapper (Casey Griffith) from the 2004 season.

■ UF should return every player that returned a kick or a punt in 2004.

All totals are based on UF's final 2004 season statistics and projected returning players. Projected returning players included all student-athletes except seniors from 2004 along with Channing Crowder and Ciatrick Fason.

THE STADIUM...

ATTENDANCE NOTES

■ In 2004, Florida ranked seventh nationally in average attendance at 88,409.

■ The attendance for the game against Florida State on Nov. 29, 2003 of 90,407 established a new school record and was the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The previous school record stood at 90,332 and was set against Tennessee on Sept. 20, 2003.

■ The attendance for the season opener in 2003 against San Jose State (90,011) was the largest opening day crowd in Florida history. The previous record was 85,575 against UAB in last year's opener. The Gators opened the 2004 season against Eastern Michigan in front of a crowd of 90,009.

■ The attendance Florida's game at the 2004 Tennessee (109,061) was the largest to ever see a Gator team play.

■ The attendance for the 2004 Florida-Georgia game was an AllTel Stadium record (84,753). The previous record 84,433 was set at the Florida-Georgia game in 2002.

■ In 2004, the Gators sold all available season tickets (78,300). That figure continues to rank as the second highest in the state of Florida history for any team - collegiate or professional.

■ The Gators have ranked among the nation's top 15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 23 years (1982-2004) and ranked among the nation's top eight schools in each of the last 14 years (1991-2004). UF's average of 90,176 fans per home game in 2003 ranked as the best single-season mark in school history. The marked bettered that of 1999 in which UF averaged 85,493 fans per home game.

■ Florida has a current streak of 96 consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. Here is where UF ranks nationally for current consecutive sellouts:

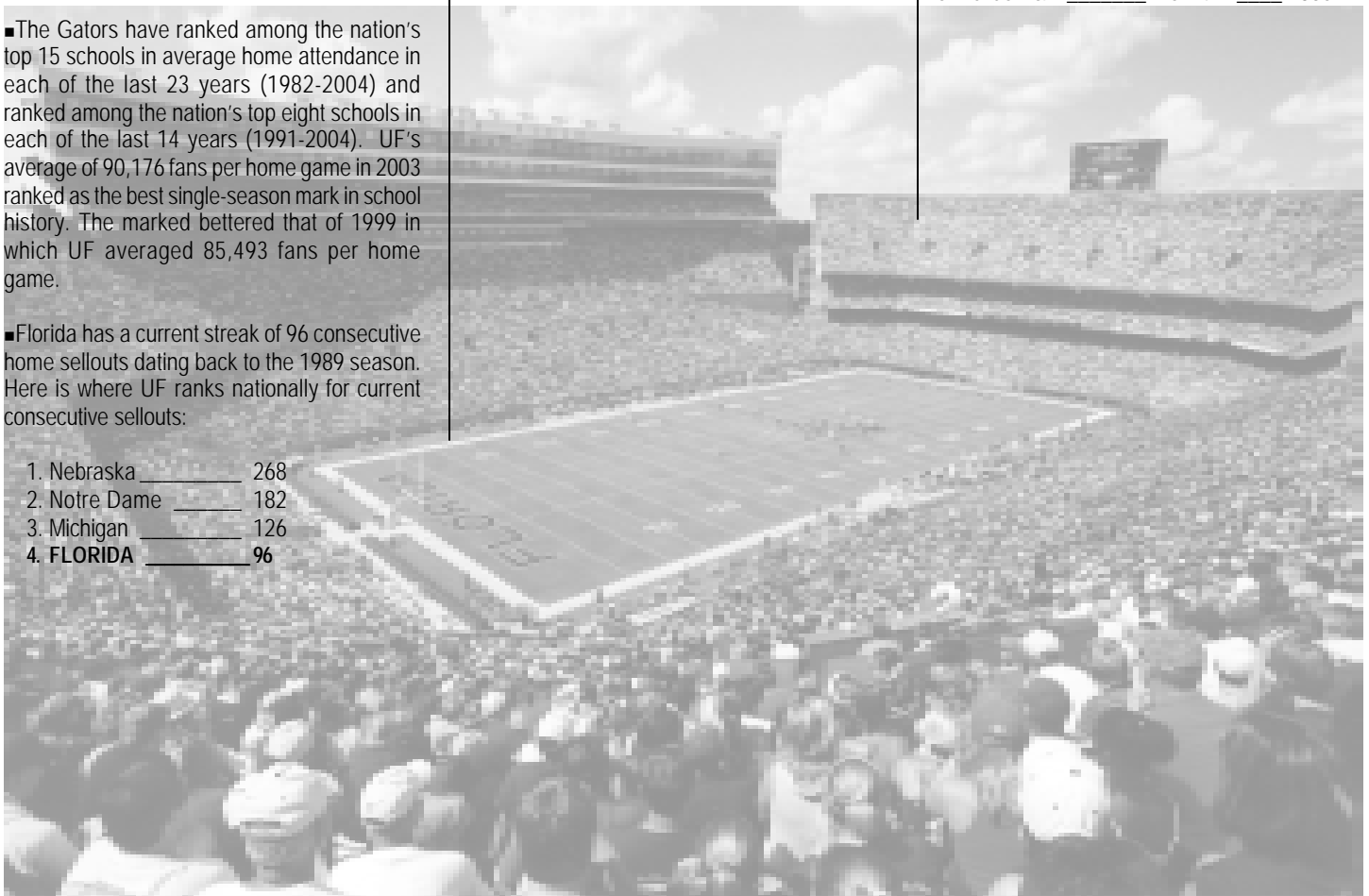

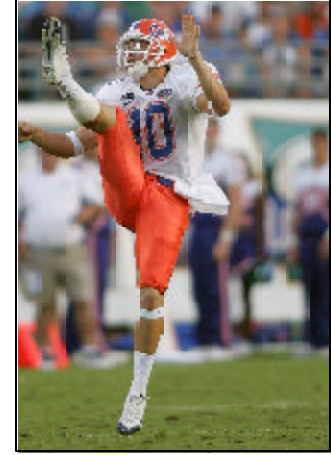

FLORIDA AND THE NFL...

■ The 2004 National Football League season began on Thursday, Sept. 9. All notes below reflect 2004 opening day totals and the 2004 NFL Draft.

GATORS AND THE NFL DRAFT

■ Former Gator quarterback Rex Grossman's first round selection by the Chicago Bears in 2003 marked the seventh straight year and eighth time in the last ten years that a Florida player has been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. Florida's 26 first-round draft choices since 1983 is the second best total in the nation. Since the first NFL Draft in 1936, a Florida player has been selected in the first round 35 times covering 26 separate seasons.

■ One of only two schools to have had at least one first-round draft selection in 17 of the last 22 drafts.

■ UF has had at least 40 players chosen in the NFL Draft for the decades of 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980 and 1990. UF already has 30 selections from the years 2000-04.

■ The Gators had at least one NFL first round draft choice for nine straight seasons (1983-91). This marked the second longest streak by any college in the history of the draft.

FLORIDA NFL NOTES (2004 SEASON)

■ Florida had 36 players on 2004 NFL opening day rosters, which tied for the fifth-highest total of any school in the country.

■ Overall, Florida had 42 former players appear on 2004 NFL rosters throughout the season.

■ Florida's seven wide receivers on 2004 NFL rosters ranked as the top total in the nation for any school.

■ Florida had four QBs on NFL rosters in 2004, a total that was the second best in the nation (Miami and Washington was first with five).

■ Florida's three tight ends are the second highest total of any school in the nation. Michigan, Penn State and Washington each have four.

■ The Southeastern Conference had 260 of its former players on opening day playing rosters in the National Football League, which leads all college football conferences. The Big Ten was second with 215 followed by the ACC with 212, the Pac-10 with 196, Big 12 with 80 and the Big East with 78 former players on NFL rosters.

Former Gator Emmitt Smith became the NFL's all-time leading rusher on Sunday, Oct. 27, 2002 with an 11-yard run against the Seattle Seahawks in Dallas. Smith surpassed the long-time record held by Walter Payton, who rushed for 16,726 yards in his 13-year.



On April 12, 2003 Florida fans got the opportunity to recognize one of their own as Emmitt Smith was honored at halftime of the 2003 Orange and Blue Spring game.

Smith was a three-time All-American at the University of Florida from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928 yards. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. On Wednesday, March 26, 2003 Smith agreed to terms with the Arizona Cardinals. Smith finished the 2003 season with 17,418 career yards on 4,142 attempts. He is also the all-time NFL career rushing leader with 155.
